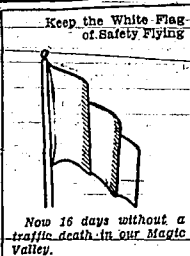

City's Inspection Regulations Are Key To Fire Protection, Health Standards

Many residents undoubtedly see the various inspection regulations of the municipal government as an overhead bundle of red tape. But in terms of the health, safety and just plain oliv-pride of the community, the inspection functions of the city government can be easily justified, in the opinion of Stuart Swan, Twin Falls building inspector.

To face the city's inspection program can be justified in terms of the city's fire insurance rating alone, said Swan. Property owners in Twin Falls are currently paying fire insurance under a No. 5 rating, which is on par with the ratings of Idaho's other major cities.

But what has been the inspection department's contribution to this rating which is pretty well up in the arbitrary scale fixed by the National Board of Fire Underwriters is a matter which Mr. Swan, according to the fire protection they give their citizens.

Three Million Autos Due for Scrap Heap, Experts Believe

DETROIT, Aug. 29 (AP)—The scrap heap will claim another three million, or more worn out passenger automobiles this year, if authoritative estimates are approximately correct.

On first sight the figures probably don't mean much to the average motorist. However, they are important to him and to the automobile industry in which every motorist has a direct or indirect interest.

The cars scrapped represent the industry's replacement market. And because of the accumulation of used cars in dealers' hands, 1953 should see more than ordinary efforts to send an increasing number of older cars to scrap.

Figures compiled by R. L. Folk and company, Detroit, statisticians for the auto industry, show that since the end of World War II through 1952, more than 1 1/2 million cars were junked. Of these nearly eight million went out of service in 1953.

How long the high level of scrapage can continue is somewhat uncertain. The number of cars built before Pearl Harbor and still in use is dwindling steadily. It is said in

Sentencing Is Set For Jail Escapee

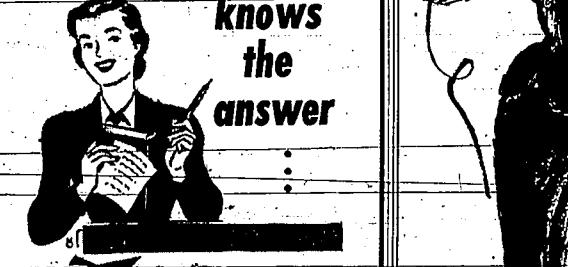
Hank Ponders Effect on Team If Browns Shift to New Town

Canadian Province Looks to U. S. for Markets for Wealths of Gas and Oil

Editor's note: This is the first of three articles on the expanding gas and oil industry in Alberta, Canada. The first article is on the expansion of the petroleum industry into the U. S. and because of the federal law under way on plans to bring natural gas into the Northwest from this, or another, source.

By PAT MUNROE

CALGARY, Alberta, Canada, Aug. 28—This old boom town's streets never will be paved with gold. Grateful citizens will insist on continuing to use an oil-burner in their heating mixture, even when gold could be afforded.

The Alberta provincial government is itself floating in a sea of greenbacks. With no sales or income tax, it recently reported a net surplus of 17 million dollars.

The astounding fact is that last year the government took in 52 million dollars from oil and gas sources, just about half of its current budget of 110 million dollars. Within three years many expect oil and gas income alone to exceed the annual outlay, although the province's 1,000,000 citizens are sure to start yelling then for better schools and roads.

Reason for the province's big income from this source is that it has retained title to the mineral rights on about ninety per cent of its area, which is about the size of Texas.

Evidence of wealth abound. There's a new office building going up in at least every other block downtown. The town's population has doubled from its pre-war figure of 70,000, when it was known for its cattle and wheat. Oil was first discovered hereabout in 1946. Calgary claims to have the highest number of cars per capita in North America, having recently

passed Los Angeles. The streets are jammed and U. S. cars cost about one-fourth more than at home.

A typical, new-rich story concerns a tycoon who was attending a \$100-a-plate dinner honoring the local pro football team. The drawing was proceeding on a modest floor prize—a new Cadillac. He moaned: "I hope I don't win it. Just what would I do, with another Cadillac when I already have two and a Rolls-Royce?"

For all this present wealth, Calgary may be just on the verge of plenty here—in two years, folks around here say Alberta's oil output will hit 400,000 barrels daily (about double the current rate) and huge reserves of natural gas may be finding their first market in the U. S.

A market for the oil hereabout appears assured. A steel snake is just completing a 7 1/2-mile crawl from Edmonton, Alberta, through scenic Jasper in this Banff national park to Vancouver, B. C., on the coast. Up to 300,000 barrels daily can be shipped this way to refineries in Vancouver and across the border above Seattle.

At present crude oil is shipped by sea from California to a refinery in B. C. Canadians say their crude will drive out California's and lower prices of petroleum products in the Pacific northwest and Alaska.

An additional 111,500 barrels

daily goes into a pipeline from Edmonton running to Superior, Wis., and on to Sarnia, Ontario.

The U. S. federal power commission is currently making up its mind about permitting imports of natural gas from Canada, which appears to have plenty of it and is anxious for a U. S. market. One line would come down and serve the Pacific northwest and California and a second would run to eastern Canada, dropping off gas in the U. S. Midwest. Thus both gas lines would, in effect, parallel the existing oil lines.

About a million dollars daily is being spent to locate oil and gas in western Canada. In 1946 there were fewer than 20 rigs around. Now the number approaches 400. More than ninety per cent of the finds are in Alberta, although Saskatchewan—across from the Williston basin in the Dakotas—is showing a lot of promise and gas has been located in northern B. C.

Virtually all of the rigging is being financed by U. S. companies, from the giant Teco to hopeful small ones. Oil experts for the drilling crews are exclusively American.

Estimates of Americans in the oil game in Calgary run as high as 10,000. The registry of guests for meals at the swanky Petroleum club here runs about half Yankee.

Both Americans and Canadians

should be floating—blissfully on their clouds lined with gold from oil. There's no open bitterness but a lot of small grievances, the subject of tomorrow's story.
