TRUMAN'S LIMITATIONS

When Harry S. Truman was President, even his warmest admirers acknowledged that he was a man with a good many limitations. One of these only began to become painfully apparent in the campaign of 1952. And, judging by Mr. Truman's Labor day speech in Detroit, it is still handicajping him.

What is the limitation? It is his insistence upon fighting the political wars with a single set of weapons, weapons which indeed have been outmoded since 1948, when he last put them to successful use in his surprise election victory.

To Mr. Truman, it is still the new deal vs.

Mr. Hoover, the "special-interests" vs. that "people." Times change, problems change, but the former President sees it all the same. Having thus drawn the battle lines, he tears into his Republican opposition in the "heli-or-leather" spirit that in 1948 became his irrade-mark.

It wasn't any different on Labor day. In the domestic field, one could get the impression his mank ikick was that President Eisenhower wasn't following new deal-fair deal policies. There seemed to be no thought that perhaps Mr. Eisenhower had been elected to try some different policies of his own.

It sounds odd to hear a party's elder voice raised in support of the view that both parties must follow the same line. That's the subject is measured by distance from that single line.

In his free-swinging attack, Mr. Truman managed as usual to obscure some of the fundamentals of his own record. A coalition of Republicans and Democrats, in a Democratio congress, did it. Mr. Truman never gotwhat he asked for. Yet he now lays all failure in this regard at the GOP door.

Evidently he is slow to learn, for he is still wielding his trusty political filmtlock in a war that calls for atomic shells.

If we Americans are going to understand world affairs sufficiently to be able to devise same policies, then we will need an increasing talent for delving beyond surface complexities to the real core of our problems. We cannot allow our insight to be blurred by distractions.

For instance, the recent U. N. debate on the Korean meeting seemed to be mostly about India and whether it should take part. But it really was not. India was just as symbol. India stood for the ides champloned britain and others that any Korean conference necessarily must be a roundtable affair at which a vide range of Asiatic problems will be discussed. They had particularly in mind—matters-like admission of red-Grina-to-the U. N., and the future of Nationalist—held Formosa.

We, on the other hand, see a conference as We, on the other nand, see a conterence as essentially a peace gathering at which only the beligerent nations should be present. We fear that more remote issues like red China and the U. N. will only be used to contuse. We believe Chinese communists must show by their attitude toward a Korean settlement that they deserve to be taken seriously on henceder unsations. der questions.

that they deserve to be taken seriously on broader questions.

— Underlying-this-basic difference between the United States and its aliles is a differing-outlook toward the strategic position of Korea and China. This country always has shown a prime concern over any significant developments affecting those areas, not to mention Japan and the Philippines.

— They lie on the western rim of the Pacific and we on the eastern, and though 6,000 miles of water intervene, no lands of protecting nations do. We do not view lightly the growth of unfriendly power on the western rim. To British this is of secondary importance. Its interest in China is largely consmercial. Its call for "realistic" recognition of the reds expresses British nopes that conditions will arise permitting widening trade in that area. The British do not worry much over the threat a communst Korea poses to Japan, now for all practical purposes an American outpost. The Korean danger is not superpled.

for all practical purposes an American outpost. The Korean danger is not suspended over Britain's heart, but ours.

These are the things that ile at the core, though they are seldom readily visible. Yesterday the talk was of India, tomorrow it may veer off in another direction. But it goes back to these fundamental differences in national interest.

There need be nothing fatal about these divergences in outlook. That is, so long as each nation recognizes he real source of the other's behavior and policy. Conflicts of national interest are inevitable, even among friends.
