### Report on State Sales of Liquor Reveals Oddity

BOISE, Oct. 2 (AP)—Idahoans are becoming more like Russians in their drinking habits—drinking more vodka, A. N. Eyer, superintendent of the state liquor department, said today.

More vodka was sold in Idaho during August than Scotch whiskey and bottled-in-bond bourbon whiskey combined, Eyer said in releasing a report on liquor sales.

Idahoans purchased 233,115 bottles of liquor and wine totaling \$203,247. The dollar volume of liquor business showed a one and one-half per cent increase over August of 1952, he said.

Eyer predicted the sale of whiskey and rum would increase during the fall and winter months, when more hot drinks are consumed. On the contrary the sale of gin—popular in many summer drinks—will decline.

### Eden Returns To His Job as Foreign Aide

LONDON, Oct. 2 (AP)—Prime Minister Winston Churchill announced formally today that Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden will resume his duties next Monday.

Churchill thus squashed growing rumors that the ailing Eden was being replaced.

As from Oct. 5, Mr. Anthony Eden will resume his duties as secretary of state for foreign affairs, said a statement issued by No. 10 Downing street.

Cabinet Meets

Government sources said Churchill and his cabinet met today to decide Eden's exact duties. "They also took steps to reduce the strain of office as possible."

Eden resumed the cabinet meeting, his first since he became ill six months ago.

Receives Papers

Since he underwent surgery in Boston last July, Eden has been receiving state papers and has had talks with Churchill and Lord Halifax, acting foreign minister during Eden's absence.

The most important topic discussed was understood to be Russia's reply to the western proposal for a four-power conference on Germany and Austria at Lugano, Switzerland.

### Probers Hear AMA Blast on 'Phony' Cures

WASHINGTON, Oct. 2 (AP)—The American Medical Association charged today that certain "phony" and "miraculous" cures for cancer are being peddled by "quackery" interests.

Dr. Paul Werner, secretary of the AMA's committee on research, made the statement in testimony prepared for his house committee committee. He strongly defended the association's war on "quackery in medicine."

"Even now several nostrums (quack medicines) are being promoted to the public," he said, "either on representation that cures are obtainable or that the proponents are experimenting clinically with something new and valuable in the management of cancer patients."

Werner mentioned no names. But in the background is the AMA's controversial action in condemning the drug Krebiozen which the late Sen. Charles W. Tobey, R., N. H., and a number of medical experts called effective in the treatment of cancer.

The committee is holding hearings on major diseases and what is being done to overcome them in relation to cancer today after an all-day session on heart troubles yesterday.

Chairman Charles A. Whittaker, R., N. J., told a reporter Dr. Robert E. Lincoln, Medford, Mass., will be called to testify today on his cancer cure claim.

Lincoln was ousted by the Massachusetts Medical Society for promoting his "bariatric therapy" although Lincoln said yesterday it had saved his life.

### Adlai Reports Soviet Treaty Interests 'Ike'

WASHINGTON, Oct. 3.—Adlai Stevenson reported today that President Eisenhower is interested in the idea of a non-aggression pact with Russia as a means of relieving tension in Europe.

The 1952 Democratic presidential candidate had lunch at the White House and sold his views on the pact to the president.

Stevenson was giving close study to the possibilities of an anti-war non-aggression pact. Along with other methods of abating the cold war.

Stevenson proposed a non-aggression pact in his recent Chicago speech and brought the subject up again when he called on the President today to report on the world tour he took earlier this year. Secretary of State Dulles also was present at the White House conference.

"If Russia were unwilling to accept the proposal, Stevenson said, it would be rather surprising that her peaceful professions aren't as sincere as they might seem."

### South Idaho's Spud Harvest Is Under Way

The grower of tractors and the thump of potatoes dropping into containers sounded throughout southern and eastern Idaho Thursday as harvesting of the state's top crop—the famed Idaho Russet—got under way in earnest.

From now until freezing weather chills the farmers, busy hands will be plucking potatoes from down to up.

The annual potato harvest vacation for school children began in the American Falls area Thursday morning as harvesters in the fields. The harvest will continue until Oct. 2.

While the acreage is greater than last year, the harvest is expected to be smaller. Jim Gregory, University of Idaho potato specialist, said about 100,000 acres will be harvested, an increase of 10,000 acres over 1952. But he said the volume probably will be below the 200,000 carloads of last year because of poor quality.

The long, wet spring and sudden hot, dry summer apparently caused an unusual amount of odd-shaped tubers.

Of the total, about 100,000 acres will be harvested in the Snake River valley, almost 10,000 acres above last year.

### USDA Okays Soil Projects For 24 States

WASHINGTON, Oct. 3.—The agricultural department has announced approval of 24 states under the first five million dollar conservation program congress authorized last spring.

It added that 19 other projects have been proposed and await only declaration of local sponsorship and department approval.

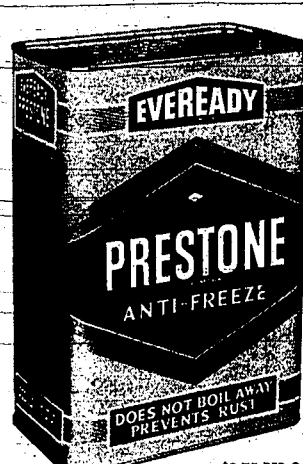

### Peru Farming Expert Views Pump Project

**RUFERT, Oct. 3**—A Peruvian farm engineering specialist, visiting in the United States, says that long enough this week to inspect the north side pumping project.

### Lewis Sounds High Praise of U. S. Freedom

HAZLETON, Pa., Oct. 2 (AP)—The American system of free enterprise enabled this country to produce sufficient coal for her domestic use and fill the shortages of allied nations, John L. Lewis, president of the United Mine Workers, said last night.

Lewis, speaking at a banquet at Hazleton, Pa., marking the 50th anniversary of the founding of the anthracite coal industry, also commended his usual fiery attacks of anti-labor groups and made strong pleas for the preservation of free enterprise.

"You can call the roll of the countries and see communism, social and fascist or some other kind of law rolling toward a totalitarian government," he said. "Admittedly, these nations, the American, free and free enterprise exemplifies joint relationship, collective bargaining and high standard of living, un-equaled elsewhere."

"Our task is to keep what we've got and retain what we have achieved," Lewis said.

He pointed to the decline in coal production in other countries throughout the world and said England, with her nationalization of the coal industry, has not stepped up coal production anywhere comparable to production in this country.

Lewis described the 40-year history of the anthracite coal industry as proof of what men can do when they work together and meet across the table to air problems. During its operation, it solved 7,000 disputes which could have produced strikes or work stoppages, he said.

### People Honor Berlin Mayor After Passing

BERLIN, Oct. 2 (AP)—Thousands of East and West Germans filed past the bier of West Berlin Mayor Ernst Reuter today to pay homage to the man they regarded as the symbol of German resistance against communism.

Reuter's body was brought to city hall last night from his modest home in suburban Schöneberg, where 10 miles jammed with a grieving crowd estimated at more than 600,000.

During the night, thousands of candles flickered in the windows of fashionable villas—and thousands of houses as a sign of mourning for the mayor who died unexpectedly after a heart attack Tuesday night. He was 64.

Soviet-made residents came from as far away as the Polish and Czech areas in West Berlin to attend the funeral and to pick up free American food packages before the relief program ends tomorrow.

### Respected Men Charged With Cleaning Out Bank's \$114,500

NEW MARKET, Va., Oct. 2 (AP)—A self-styled sheriff and a former mayor of this Shenandoah valley town faced charges today they cleaned out the vault of a bank where they were officers and fled across the Canadian border with \$114,500.

One of the men, returned later. The money has not been recovered.

News of FBI charges against the hitherto respected pair swept through town with teletype speed and caused folk to scratch their heads in amazement.

Former mayor Theodore Roosevelt Beahm, 62, was "just about one of the nicest guys you ever saw," a local police officer said. Beahm had been with the town's only bank about 20 years and had risen to the post of vice president and cashier. Don R. Simpson, 55, a bank director, was a comparative newcomer, but he seemed real pleasant, police said. Officers said Simpson came here two and one-half years ago, bought a fashionable estate and told folks he was a former sheriff in Somerset county, Va.

Both Beahm and Simpson were charged with bank embezzlement, conspiracy to abduct the two men, flee to Canada as Simpson's nephew, Charles R. Simpson, 30, described by town officials as a "nice, laid" man.

The FBI said he chauffeured the other two to Canada.

The FBI said Beahm flew back Saturday and complained he'd been forced at gunpoint to open the vault Saturday and give the money to an unknown man and the elder

### Official "Invades" Apartment To Procure Woman's Remains

CHICAGO, Oct. 2 (AP)—Dr. Herman N. Budson, 41-year-old president of the board of health, drew his 38-caliber pistol today and invaded an apartment barricaded by a man who refused to surrender the body of his aged aunt.

Police said David Corbin refused to surrender the body of Carter Jackson, 88-year-old music teacher, and threatened to shoot officers with a bazooka.

Miss Jackson died at 8 a. m. Tuesday and Corbin was permitted to keep her body in the apartment for 72 hours because, he said, his aunt had expressed the fear that she would be buried alive.

But when the 72 hours expired this morning Corbin refused to unlock the door for two of Budson's deputies.

Budson, en route to his office, was notified via a mobile radio unit and directed his chauffeur to the barricaded apartment. He arrived to find the building surrounded by his two deputies and eight policemen.

Police said Corbin claimed he and his late uncle had invented the mechanical process of the bazooka, and threatened to use one on them if they did not desist.
