

Russia Gives U. S. No Choice in Atom Race, U. S. Declares

WASHINGTON, N. J., Oct. 6 (AP)—President Eisenhower said today the United States has no choice but to build a huge atomic and hydrogen stockpile to discourage any Russian idea of starting World War III.

In direct contrast with Chairman W. Sterling Cole of the congressional atomic energy committee, who said "Russia has 'H-bombs' and will use them," the president said that neither Russia nor the United States has the hydrogen bomb yet.

U. S. Considering Non-Aggression Pact With Russia

WASHINGTON, Oct. 6 (AP)—Secretary of State John Foster Dulles said today the United States is considering a possible non-aggression pact with Russia as one of a variety of ways to ease world tensions.

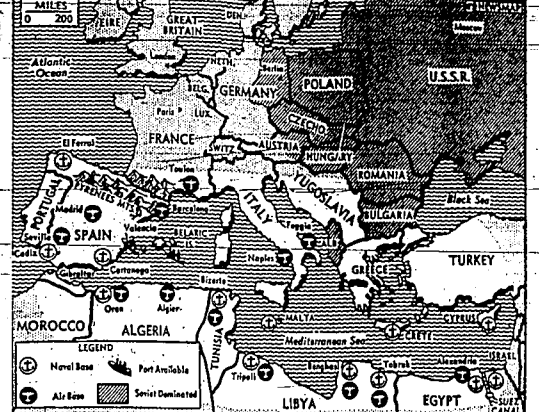

Retailers Do Not Have to Give All Tax Data Asked

Retailers will not be required to supply all of the information called for on form 720, the new internal revenue form for reporting federal excise taxes according to Cecil A. Pfost, Twin Falls, internal revenue collection officer.
 The form which is due Oct. 31, for the July-August-September quarter, calls for gross taxable sales, exemptions and adjustments, net taxable sales and the amount of tax. The previous form requires only the amount of tax. Many retailers would have found it impossible to supply all of the information required by the new form and it would have been extremely costly for others to comply.
 Retailers who cannot supply all the information which the form calls for may show the amount of the tax they are remitting—as they have been accustomed to do with the old form.
 However, when the first or second form is filed that is for the first or second quarter, a statement must be attached showing why the required information cannot be provided together with a brief description of the system of determining the correct amount of the tax due.

4 States Unite To Fight Suit On Tidelands

LOS ANGELES, Calif., Oct. 6 (AP)—California, Texas, Louisiana and Florida will join to oppose Alabama in its attack on the constitutionality of the submerged lands act restricting the oil-rich tidelands to the coastal states, the California attorney-general's office said today.

Chief Deputy Atty.-Gen. William V. O'Connor said he and Atty.-Gen. Edmund Brown will fly to Washington for a conference Monday with John Ben Shepherd, Texas; Fred LeBlanc, Louisiana; and Richard W. Smith, Florida, to map plans for the battle. Each is attorney-general in his state.

The Alabama suit in the U. S. supreme court contends the submerged oil royalties should be distributed for the benefit of the people in all the states.

The suit also opposes recognition of a nine-mile coastal boundary for Texas, Louisiana and Florida as compared with a three-mile limit for other states. Contending such recognition violates the constitution.

Arguments on the Alabama suit were expected to be heard soon.
