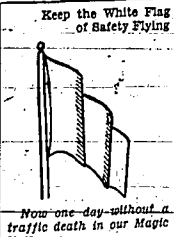

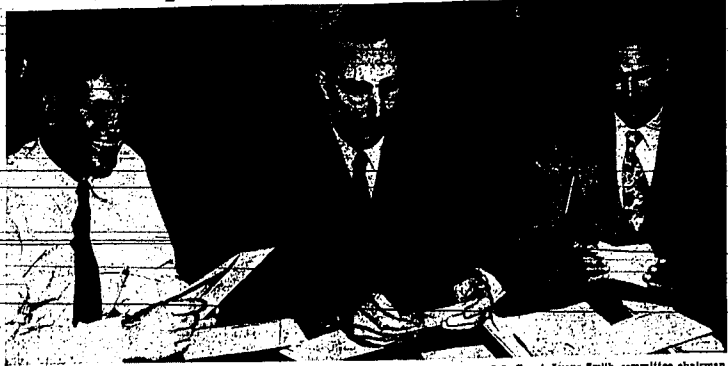

Yanks Pull Down Cool \$8,280 Each in Series

NEW YORK, Oct. 8 (AP)—Each member of the New York Yankees who received a full world series share will bank a record check for \$8,280.68, it was announced Wednesday by baseball commissioner Ford Frick. Those voted full shares by the losing Brooklyn Dodgers will receive \$6,178.42. The Yankee windfall, shared by 22 players, manager Casey Stengel, four coaches, the club trainer and road secretary, easily eclipses the previous record payoff of \$6,772.05 pocketed by the Cleveland Indians of 1948.

Each of the second place clubs in the two leagues, Cleveland in the American and Milwaukee in the National, will receive \$5,850.62 from the whopping world series receipts to divide among its players.

The Chicago White Sox, third in the American league, receive \$4,567.80 for player distribution, the Boston Red Sox, fourth in the American, \$4,283.54. As the Philadelphia Phillies and St. Louis Cardinals led for third place in the National league, they will split third and fourth place money.

The player pool from the first four games totaled \$68,241.01. To this was added \$85,000 for pre-game television interviews. Although the pre-game shows included only members of the participating teams, the money was divided among the first four clubs in both leagues. This brought the grand total to \$162,241.01.

Television and radio rights for the games, almost \$15 million in total, do not figure in the player pool. They are added to the playoff-payout fund.

In addition to awarding 20 full shares, the Yankees cut in 16 others, for various reasons.

The Dodgers whacked up their melon into 20 shares and six part shares.

Indisider Gerry Coleman, who joined the Yankees on Aug. 25 after leaving Korea and the marines, was awarded a one-third share of \$2,762.41.

Catcher Ralph Houk, who was dropped from the players' roster in July to become a bullpen catcher and coach, received a full share. Hooker Steve Kraly and Gus Triandis, who came up on Oct. 31, also received half shares of \$1,401.24 along with Ewell Blackwell, who left the club in July because of a sore shoulder.

The Dodgers gave Ralph Branca, who was traded to Detroit, \$1,544.61, a fourth share. The same went to Tex Feltus, who didn't get out of the army until late September.

Don Newcombe, the big Dodger hurler who spent the entire season in the army, was remembered with \$500.

The major league record for most assists by an outfielder in one season is 44 made by Chuck Klein of the Phillies in 1920.

Spahn and Lopat Top Averages

NEW YORK, Oct. 8 (AP)—Willoway Warren Spahn, of the Milwaukee Braves, and stookey Ed Lopat of the New York Yankees, a pair of veteran left handers, topped the major leagues in earned run effectiveness for 1953.

Spahn allowed 67 earned runs in 206 innings at a 2.10 average. Lopat led the American league with 2.23 average per 4 2/3 earned runs in 176 innings.

Spahn, who also won the earned run title in 1947 with a 2.53 mark, is the lowest ERA in the National league since 1948. That year Howie Pollet of the Cards owned an identical record, reversing the trend.

The 31-year-old fastballer, in his eighth full season with the Braves, won 22 and lost seven in 206 2/3 complete games, five of them shutouts. He also struck out 194 times and had a .900 winning percentage.

Lopat became the first American league pitcher to lead the loop in both earned run average and win-loss percentage since the Yankee Spud Chandler turned the trick in 1948. In his 10th season in the minor circuit, Lopat recorded a 16-4 record for a .800 percentage.

The 35-year-old scrapper who climaxed his pro career with a triumph over the Dodgers in the world series, had a 2.84 average last season, but he pitched only 149 2/3 innings. In order to be eligible for the earned run crown, however, a pitcher must hurl at least 174 2/3.

Allis Reynolds of the Yanks and Hoyt Wilhelm of the Giants, last year's earned run leaders, were ineligible this season. Each had only 148 innings pitched.

Runner-up to Spahn in the National league rankings is rugged Robin Roberts of the Phils. Roberts yielded 108 earned runs in 347 2/3 innings for a 2.16. Bob Buhl of the Braves finished third with 3.00.

Billy Pierce of the White Sox placed second in the American league with a 2.72 average. Behind him was teammate Virgil Trucks, 2.83.

Lineman of Week

NEW YORK, Oct. 8 (AP)—Franklin Brooks, a sophomore guard at Georgia Tech, was named Wednesday as lineman of the week in the first Associated Press poll of the 1953 college football season.

Brooks made the amazing total of 16 tackles as the Yellow Jackets nipped Southern Methodist 6-4, and extended their unbeaten start to 20 games.

Sande Again Out Of Belmont Money

NEW YORK, Oct. 8 (AP)—Earl Sande, former Idahoan and leading jockey of the golden twenties, had his busiest day Wednesday since starting a comeback last Monday but failed to land either of his two mounts in the money at Belmont park Wednesday.

The 28-year-old Sande finished 10th in a field of 28 2-year-olds with Saffo in the first race and wound up with Zig Awag, a 5-year-old filly, in the afternoon seventh.

Cubs Sign Tavarre

CHICAGO, Oct. 8 (AP)—Phil Tavarre, who took over as stop-gap pilot two years ago, Wednesday was handed his third one-year managerial contract by the venerable White Sox.

The 1954 season, however, will find Tavarre, a hard-bitten Cub first baseman for 15 years, strictly a bench manager.

Since he was named manager to succeed the first Frankie Frisch July 21, 1951, Tavarre had remained on the active player list.

However, Tavarre, 37, appeared only as a pinch-hitter this year, having six hits in 21 trips for .286, compared with his life-time average of .292 for 1,843 games.

Tavarre's rehiring was announced by Ed Matthews, director of Cub player personnel. Frisch since the death of the late Frankie Frisch's 1954 salary was not disclosed, but Matthews said it was "unfortunate to get concerned."

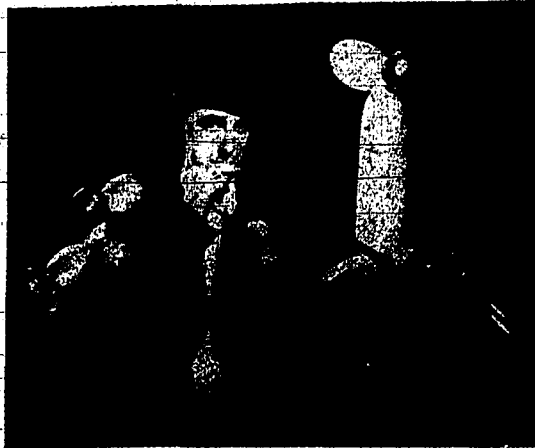

Civil Service Calls Halt on U. S. Ousters

WASHINGTON, Oct. 8 (AP)—The civil service commission has told all government agencies to halt firing career employees in the drive to cut the federal payroll.

Commission Chairman Philip Young laid down the law in a letter written by direction of the President and obviously aimed at quieting criticism that layoffs have been announced.

Since there is a "rush" of more than 100,000 temporary and indefinite jobs, Young wrote that "career employees generally" are to be assured of continuing employment as long as their services are satisfactory.

Organizations representing dismissed federal workers have rapped the administration for letting out careerists in many cases while keeping employees with only indefinite status. The personnel policies of the foreign operations administration have come in for particularly heavy attack.

Although the total number of career workers dismissed this year was not given, the commission said nearly 8,000 had applied to it for help in getting new jobs.

"Skin Banks" Are Urged for Atomic Attack

CHICAGO, Oct. 8 (AP)—A civil defense and air force adviser has called for the creation of nationwide "skin banks" for use in the thousands of critical burn cases an atomic attack would bring.

The skin-bank idea is rather than living donors, can be used as a sort of "biological" dressing that relieves intense pain, protects burn areas and prevents disfigurement, as well as actually increasing survival chances.

It would be "invaluable" because of the major fires sure to follow an atomic blast in any American city, according to Dr. James B. Brown, Washington University, St. Louis.

He admitted that Americans would have to be "enlightened" to the humans necessity of donating skin from their backs when they die. It could be written into wills, or close relatives can approve the removal before burial.

Because of the new technique, Brown said, "we don't have to give up on a single patient with severe burns."

The civil defense and air force adviser described the new technique here yesterday at the clinical congress of the American College of Surgeons.

U. S. Expense, Income Down, Report Shows

WASHINGTON, Oct. 8 (AP)—The government spent more and took in slightly less in the first quarter of this fiscal year than it did a year before.

Spending in the first three months of fiscal 1956, which began July 1, totaled 399 million dollars more than in the first quarter of last fiscal year.

Forecast Contrasts
This increase in expenditures contrasted with predictions the administration made in August that spending this fiscal year would be less than a billion dollars less than last year. However, the budget revisions forecasting reduced spending probably applied mainly to the remaining three quarters of the fiscal year, which ends June 30.

A large increase in outlays for farm price supports and a stable increase in military spending helped push the expenditure total in the first quarter of this year to \$18,229,000,000.

Treasury Statement
The treasury's statement of government finances for Sept. 30 showed that for the first three months of fiscal 1956, the government went in the hole \$4,211,000,000 or 472 millions more than the red ink operations at the same time last year. Net receipts in the first quarter of fiscal 1956 were \$19,670,000,000, the different from the \$19,250,000,000 receipts during the first three months of fiscal 1955.
