BOON, Germany, Oct. 9.—West Germany's parliament approved re-announced European federation and close cooperation with the United States today by re-electing Konrad Adenauer as chancellor.

The "bundesrat" (lower house) chose Adenauer to guide the nation's destiny for four more years by a 304-148 vote. Fourteen deputies abstained and 21 were absent.

Adenauer's Christian Democratic union won a record-breaking 48 per cent of the popular vote in West Germany's Sept. 7 elections, making Adenauer the strong man of west Europe.

In 1948 when Adenauer first was elected federal chancellor he won by only a single vote—his own.

The bundestag convened at noon (4 a. m. MST) and Speaker Hermann Ehlers announced that President Theodor Heuss had nominated Adenauer.

Deputies then voted on the nomination without debate.
