UNITED NATIONS, (Tuesday), Oct. 13 (AP)—The United Nations command accused the communists today of building up their air force in North Korea in a serious violation of the armistice.

John A. Hull, new U.N. commander, announced that the stand taken by his predecessor, Gen. Mark W. Clark, against forced repatriation of anti-red prisoners of "unwillingness" of anti-red prisoners by red indoctrination staffs, Oct. 24, as specified in the armistice.

17 Million Dollars Lost Annually In Idaho Through Road Mishaps

Traffic accidents have cost Idaho citizens an average of \$17 million dollars per year for the past 18 years according to a statement released by the safety division of the state highway department.

The figure was arrived at by using an experience formula of the National Safety Council. The council has found over a period of years that for every traffic fatality there are also 33 vehicular injury accidents and 215 property damage accidents.

Big 3 Agree To New Bid On Meeting

PARIS, Oct. 13 (AP)—The United States, Britain and France have agreed to issue a new invitation to Russia to attend a big four foreign ministers meeting in Geneva.

The meeting is scheduled for the first week of November. The invitation is a new one—the latest in a long series—which will be transmitted to Moscow later this week, the source said.

What is true in news speed is partly true in editorial. Profoundly considering the amount of news that is available, it is no other business in which the ratio of precision and quality to speed and quantity of production is so great.

Yet the American press today is, in my opinion, reaching a dangerous point in the quantity of slanted news reports embraced by front pages, as well as in the slanted news reports in the body of the paper. It is not necessarily mean intentionally slanted news stories.
