Popularity of 'Ike' Receives Election Test

KAD CLAIR, Wis., Oct. 13—President Eisenhower's popularity was matched against farmers' grumbling over falling prices in today's Wisconsin ninth congressional district election.

Tieoff on 1954?

The contest between Republican State Sen. Arthur Padgett and Democrat Lester Johnson could provide a tieoff on next year's congressional elections—and on how the Agricultural Secretary's policies are regarded in the farm belt.

Both candidates predicted victory, although they expected a tieoff, probably would be a light 30,000.

Despite the contest's national political slant, the election was predominantly rural western Wisconsin district at their cores.

No No Name Victories

The ninth district never has sent a Democrat to congress. But Democrats pointed out that the farm belt, where **McCarthy** started out as a La Follette progressive and later often bucked the regime of Roosevelt and voted with the Democrats, even though he had become a Republican.

McCarthy tied last May after serving 11 terms. Today's special election was called to fill his vacant seat.

'Ike' Prepares For Party on His Birthdate

WASHINGTON, Oct. 13—President Eisenhower, gradually recovering from a week-end cold, will celebrate his 57th birthday today in a slight mood, birthday-party being given for him tonight by Republicans of Pennsylvania.

Tomorrow will be Mr. Eisenhower's 63rd birthday anniversary. He plans to motor with his wife this afternoon to Hershey, Pa., for an evening with an estimated 30,000 birthday well-wishers. 100 gift boxes, 100-pate dinners, a chorus of 1,800 voices and a golf driving exhibition by Ben Hogan.

The purpose of the party was two-fold: To put dollars in the GOP 1954 congressional campaign; and to help the party to elect the first Republican President in 20 years.

The Eisenhower and members of the presidential staff left here this afternoon and are to return tonight after the party by plane to the White House tomorrow before leaving in the late evening by train for Ohio.

One of the changes, he said, provides an interruptible industrial service rate to all three classes of distributors, large, medium and small. Previous schedules have made the rate available only to intermediate and small consumers.

Another change permits distributors of intermediate size to sell interruptible gas up to 100,000 cubic feet daily, as compared with an earlier limitation of 200,000 cubic feet a day.
