





President Eisenhower felt it necessary re-cently to allay the fears of his fellow Repub-licans that they might have to carry the milistone of a national sales tax with them when they go to the polls for re-election next

when they go to the point of which year.

There will be no retail sales tax, he says, although he did not close the door on the prospect of a general manufacturer? tax—a levy which almost surely is passed on to consumers in the form of higher prices. It has one great political advantage; it is hidden from the ultimate buyer's view.

In all likelihood, even if the administration had chosen to sponsor a general sales tax, it would never have made the grade in congress. To the average politician, it is the reddest red flag that can be waved at the voters. In an election year, he sees it as sheer disaster.


