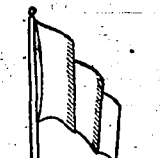

Sharp Questioning Idaho Power Vice President Ralph E. Gale was questioned Thursday by Mrs. Evelyn Cooper, attorney for pro-power groups opposing the company plans in favor of the federal proposal.

He defended Idaho Power's transmission lines in southern Idaho, claiming "our lines are adequate to perform any service that the government wishes to be performed at cost desirable from their point of view."

He said the proposed Oostera-Minidoka line would be a "useless waste of money" and the completed McNary-LaGrange line in Oregon "is being idle" because there is insufficient power.

Mr. Cooper then turned to Idaho Power's plan to build a government power plant at American Falls and to federal efforts to get appropriations for a transmission line to the project.

He said the government paid Idaho Power a million dollars for water rights at American Falls so the government could produce power for irrigation. He said the government had appropriated requests for the project.

Gale said the money paid nearly 30 years ago was not essentially for water rights and "the value of lands, power plants and the site was greater than a million dollars."

He said the water rights were for irrigation, not power, and irrigation beneficiaries from the rights given up by Idaho Power would be paid by the government, he said.

Mr. Cooper asked whether Idaho Power's proposed transmission lines would be adequate to carry additional loads and whether provision has been made to supply electricity to phosphate plants in eastern Idaho. Gale's reply was "yes."

Gale said phosphate plants using sulphuric acid or the "wet process" method would require a "considerable amount" but he said any firm would be able to handle the load.

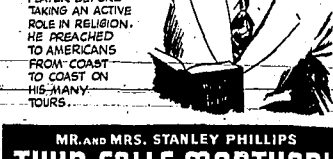

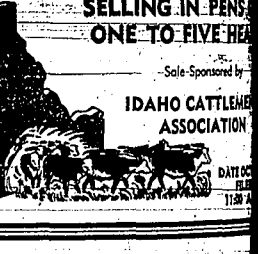

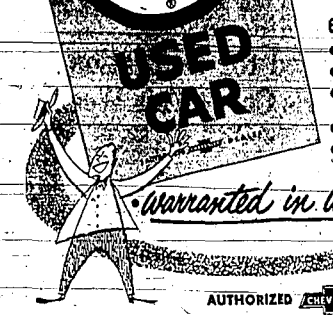

### GOP Leader Proposes Revise Of U. S. Excise Tax Structure

WASHINGTON, Oct. 13 (AP)—House Majority Leader Charles A. Halleck has proposed to President Eisenhower a reshuffling of federal excise taxes that would produce a net gain in revenue from that source in the next fiscal year.

Excise taxes are those levied on specific goods and services such as gasoline, cigarettes, automobiles and movie admissions. Halleck's plan calls for raising the burden on some industries while adding others to the list for the first time.

Halleck, an Indiana Republican, said Mr. Eisenhower's task before the President set off on a five-state speaking tour which has developed considerable political urgency because of tax, budget and farm problems.

In addition to offering his proposal for broadening the excise tax base, Halleck assured the President that congress will vote next session to maintain the 55 per cent regular corporation tax rate fixed two years ago to help finance the Korean war.

The corporate rate is scheduled to drop back to its pre-Korean level of 47 per cent next April 2 unless congress acts. Mr. Eisenhower already has asked that the present rate be maintained. There has been considerable talk in congress of a compromise, fixing the rate at 50 per cent. But the administration is expected to fight for the full 55 per cent.

The house leader said there should be some tax relief for industries over-burdened by existing excise rates. Specifically, he mentioned the movie industry.

Congress enacted a bill last session to repeal the 20 per cent tax on movie admissions, but Mr. Eisenhower vetoed it, explaining that he disapproved of piecemeal revision of the excise structure.

Except for such industries as moving pictures where many persons believe the existing rates are unjust, Halleck would maintain present excise taxation and add selectively to the list. He was against

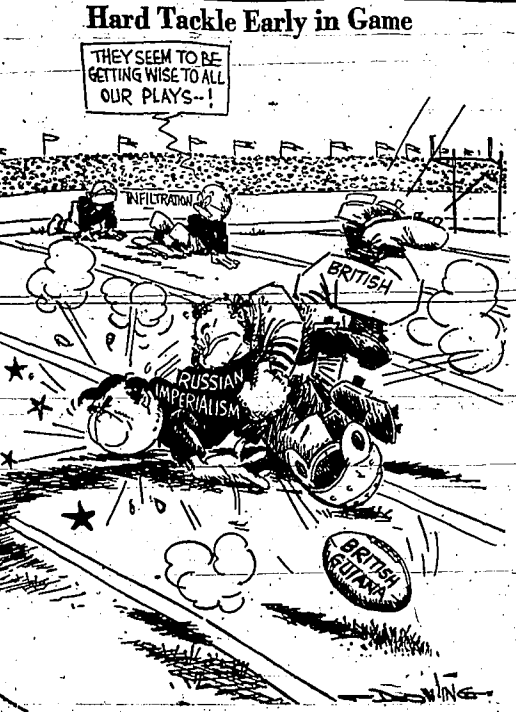

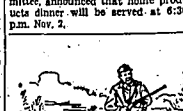
