

"WASHINGTON CALLING" BY MARQUIS CHILDS

WASHINGTON—President Eisenhower is 63 years old. His birthday anniversary coincided with widespread reports about his health and the start of a speaking tour taking him into a half dozen states and briefly into Mexico.

The reports on the President's health may be no more than a reflection of the jittery atmosphere and the rumors that thrive in an uncertain era.

Anyone traveling through the country in Washington in a year ago, quickly that the rumors about the President are nationwide.

Whether the President has a heart condition, whether he has hypertension, when such queries are put to him, Dr. Hager, President's personal physician, replies that President Eisenhower is in good health and that his brief but busy tour of the country is a source of pleasure to all concerned.

Through this arrangement it is hoped that legitimate complaints will result in the correction of any condition which might subject the profession to criticism.

Manifestly, this is a move in the right direction and with proper cooperation, it should prove highly beneficial.

To demonstrate a true spirit of cooperation, the public must recognize that it also has a responsibility.

It might be well at this time to suggest that this latest move be extended to work out better public relations for our hospitals.

Although Twin Falls county now has one of the finest hospitals in the entire west, the institution has been handicapped from the start by criticisms which to a large extent are unfounded.

When the board of directors came out with the announcement recently that \$50,000 had been borrowed on a long anticipation note to finance the hospital until the first of the year, many no doubt came to the conclusion that all was not well.

Principal reason for this advance loan, of course, is the fact that the hospital has not had sufficient occupancy.

After Dr. Johnson of San Diego, Calif., completed his audit of the hospital in August, he made note of all the criticisms he had received from a cross-section of the public.

Listing the various reasons for criticism, he made the following observation:

"For these reasons, I have been told, too many people are going to hospital clinics. This contributes to the low occupancy of this hospital. It also sends out of the area money that might be retained here if the public had a better attitude toward the profession and the hospital."

It is not intended as any criticism of the board or the administrator of the hospital, because we feel they all have been doing an excellent job under the circumstances.

Some local doctors, for their own personal reasons, are recommending that their patients go to other hospitals.

Under certain infrequent circumstances, there is understandable, but when it is followed as a regular practice, it demonstrates anything but good faith and cooperation.

As Dr. Johnson pointed out: "If there is friction and jealousy between groups of doctors or within that eternal triangle, the governing board, the administrator and the medical staff, it is quickly broadcast and you soon run out of people to conceal it from."

The public looks with grave concern on such dissension. It is extremely harmful to the public relations of the hospital and the profession."

Dr. Johnson has further emphasized, we have an outstanding hospital, outstanding surgeons and physicians, an exceptionally capable administrator, and a board of directors no little amount of praise.

It remains, as we see it, for all concerned to recognize that differences in public relations may make full use of all these advantages, without suspicion or qualms of any kind.

The step the South Central Medical society has taken is definitely another move in that direction.

The remaining steps to be taken to achieve our goal is to accept in a spirit of whole-hearted cooperation—the doctors, the board, the administrator, and the public.





Speaker Notes Prayer Power Is "Unlimited"

The healing power of prayer is unlimited, John J. Belover of Long Beach, Calif., said at a lecture on Christian Science here Thursday.

You can heal sickness by prayer as readily as you can fear, discomfort, or distress, he said.

Through "Christian Science" people are proving this "miraculous" method of healing the sick and sinning in their own lives every day.

On Wednesday he was a member of the Christian Science church of Long Beach, where he spoke under the auspices of First Church of Christ, Scientist in Bickel school auditorium. Speaking on "Christian Science—The Healing Power of God, Life, Truth and Love," he was introduced by Lester McKean, president.

"I do not limit the power of prayer to the elimination of untoward traits of character," Mr. Belover said. "He cast out every type of evil or disorder."

He added: "To the extent that the individual is spiritually healed, his physical and mental health, harmony and peace practiced."

God's power to heal is no different today from what it was in the time of Moses, or Jesus, or Paul, adding that reliance on God exclusively for healing should not seem unreasonable.

"The same Truth, Life and Love which constitutes God's being is just as much, at hand today as it was centuries ago," he said.

"Jesus promised that greater works than he did would be done by those who followed the example of his understanding of God. There is nothing to hinder us in taking full advantage of his power to heal."

To illustrate, he gave a striking account of a Christian Science healing brought about entirely by prayer.

"A Christian Scientist," he said, "was called in—the middle of the night and told that a number of the family was dying, and he was requested to come at once."

"As he drove to the home, he pondered the spiritual facts of real being, which makes it clear that man is not dead because he is dying."

"Upon arrival, he learned that an insupportable marital problem had caused the sickening of the family, and that death seemed close at hand."

"As he sat alone by her side she declared suddenly that she thought there is only one cause, God, Life and Love, and that he is the author and eternal maintainer of man."

He prayed he knew that unhappiness, sorrow, and rebellion have no power or authority to act or create, because they do not originate in Principle.


"He knew that Love is not life, and that neither love nor life can be taken away from God's perfect, eternal life. Man, although there was no visible reason during the first half-hour, he suddenly held to the truth, knowing that she could have no other than God's command for perfection."

"He held to the fact that man is the manifestation of the divine, therefore, ever conscious. He asked her to repeat the simple statement, 'God is Love.'"

"In a little while her lips seemed to be trying to form the words. Before long they were audibly spoken, and she opened her eyes, and had learned, to some extent, that neither life, love nor happiness is in matter or personality, but that her entire being was in God, good. The desire





Giant Falcon Dam Labeled Nearly Done

FALCON HEIGHTS, Tex., Oct. 13.—Falcon dam, the largest international dam in the world, will be 99 per cent complete Monday, when President Eisenhower and Adolfo Ruiz Cortines come here to dedicate it.

That is the report of R. B. Colsons, engineer in charge. Colsons said the only work remaining to be done on the \$6-million-dam is the installation of four spillway gates. Two of the dam's six gates are in operation, he said.

Work on the dam began more than two years ago. Located 60 miles above Midland, Tex., and 15 miles below Laredo, Tex., Falcon is the first and farthest down river of the major international storage dams to be built on the Rio Grande under the United States-Mexico water treaty of 1944.

The dam is of compacted earth construction. It is 26,294 feet long and about 190 feet high. About two miles of the dam are in the United States and three miles in Mexico.

The reservoir, created by the dam will have a capacity of 4,000,000 acre feet and a surface area of 116,000 acres. That means it will hold a third more water than Shasta dam in California, or about half as much as Grand Coulee dam in Washington.

AS YOUR MINISTER SEES IT

"Keep thy heart with all diligence: for out of it are the issues of life."—Prov. 4:23. The words of King Solomon are a beautiful, sensible and helpful to all who receive them. The importance of keeping watch over our hearts is not always realized. Some would just let life take its course and never give thought as to what makes their life as it is.



"Watch Your Heart"

James the Apostle tells us that we find their beginning in the hearts of men who give themselves to do evil. Crime begins in the hearts of men and women who meditate upon their evil deeds long before they are openly manifest. The heart is the birth place of good and evil. Like a garden it must have some attention if it is to produce a good life.

Only a foolish person would sow seeds of weeds in a garden and expect a nice crop of fruit. Any person who fills his heart and mind with low cheap thought and reads in planting seeds of evil that will surely yield sorrow and shame.

Jesus gave us a rule by which we can determine correctly what is in our hearts and the hearts of others. He said: "... Out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh." In other words, our conversation soon tells what is in the heart. Just as a tree is known by its fruit, so are our lives manifest by our deeds. As a nation we feel a certain security because we know that there are men watching our borders while we sleep. We would not want to live in a city where we had no police protection nor other means of keeping ourselves from becoming a prey to evil men. While we must have all these, we have an enemy within that will bear watching; that is the evil of our own heart. We may think our hearts are water-urns, but if we fail to keep our own hearts, it will become a snare unto us.

In the days of Noah we are told the imagination of the hearts of men were evil continually. That kind-of-moral and spiritual condition provoked the righteous judgment of God. When you turn your imagination loose you do not generally imagine good, but evil. Men do not naturally do good things when they follow the evil imagination of their hearts. People who do good and live right do so because they choose to do right. They learn to silence the suggestion of an evil heart.

We hear conversation often spoken of as a "change of heart." That is true, for God does change the hearts of men. Jeremiah 17:9 speaks of the human heart as being deceitful above all things and desperately wicked, yet God has promised that He would take away the stony heart and give us a new spirit.
