

The next few weeks will see an important showdown in the Eisenhower administration. The question being decided is whether to continue its policy of seeking a balance budget. The afternative is to abandon that program and admit that an unbalanced budget will be necessary for botisering national defense against a possible Russian surprise attack with hydrogen bombs.

The chief spokeman for the balanced budget, for buying national defense on a cash basis, seems to be Secretary of Treasury George M. Humphrey. His philosophy was perhaps best expressed for a statement made enriler this year before a senate appropriations subcommittee:

"What we are trying to do," he said, "is

This is Washington's latest crisis. It may have been caused unconsciously by one of President-Eisenhower's—own—statements at his Sept. 30 press conference.






