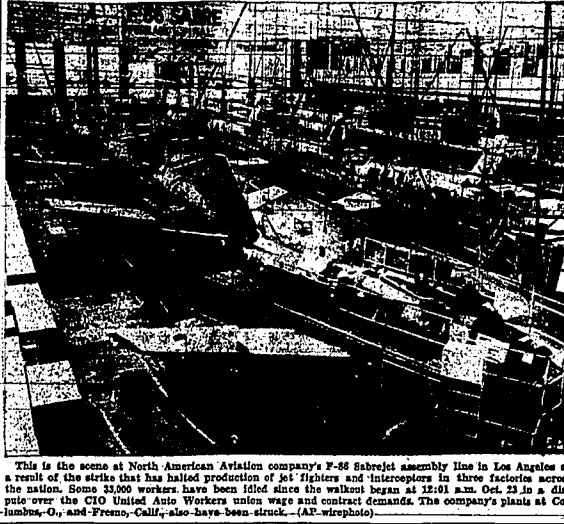

WASHINGTON, Oct. 26 (AP)—FBI officials today released the number of the \$25,000 ransom paid in the kidnapping of Bobby Cross.

Prisoners Promised High Jobs After U.S. Revolt; POW Avers

TOKYO, Oct. 26 (AP)—American prisoners of war in the Far East are being promised high positions in the communist government of the United States after a revolution planned for about 1956.

Edward S. Dickenson said today.

The 27-year-old Virginian was freed after a year and a half of captivity in North Korea. He told a news conference he had dedicated himself to gaining revenge on the communists by "exposing their lies to the world."

He insisted he never had believed the communists and had intended to be a "revolutionary" only to get more information to expose their false propaganda.

"I do not intend to expose their lies to the world," he said. "I intend to expose their lies to the world."

TOUGH WITHOUT ROADBLOCKS A note sent taken among senate Republican committee chairmen indicates that Senator Capehart's plan to add these chairmen to membership in the GOP policy committee is now deemed not a success. The policy group is now composed of key party leaders and other senators representative of a variety of viewpoints, without regard to seniority. The effect of Capehart's proposal would be to weight the committee heavily with men who have attained position largely by virtue of the length of their senate service. In practice, this would have meant giving extraordinary voice to Republicans from one section, the midwest, where the party has had the greatest continuity of success in battle with the Democrats. It is so happy that this group also has been most outspoken in opposition to President Eisenhower's policies. Had the plan been enough support to get adopted, it would not have augured well for the smoothness of relations next year between the President and congress. 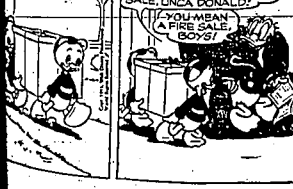

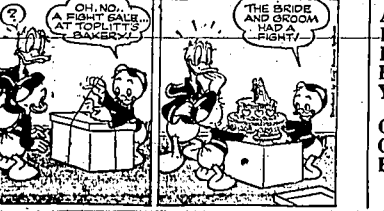

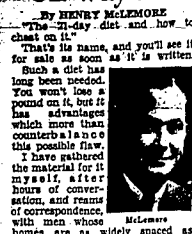

New Plan on Arab, Israel Peace Sifted

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., Oct. 20 (AP)—Copies of an 800 million dollar Palestine peace program were distributed to members of the United Nations today on the eve of an important security council session to seek a solution to mounting tensions between Israel and her Arab neighbors.

The program for refugee resettlement and economic development of the Holy Land was proposed by a group of prominent Americans who hoped it would provide an instrument for Israel and the Arab nations to reach a peace settlement.

The refugees problem will be one of the main topics to be discussed before the security council by Maj. Gen. Hagan Benak, chief of the U. N. truce observation commission, when he reports tomorrow on the Palestine situation.

Sponsors of the new Palestine peace program emphasized it could be carried out only if the present shaky armistice in the Holy Land was replaced by a permanent peace settlement. The plan would have the United Nations...

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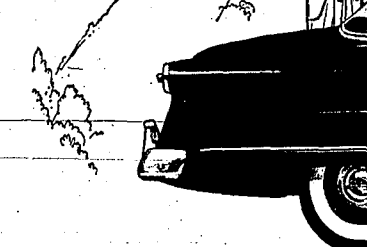
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
