"Thousands of average sized farmers and ranchers are faced with selling out, going bankrupt or both unless adequate corrective measures are taken."

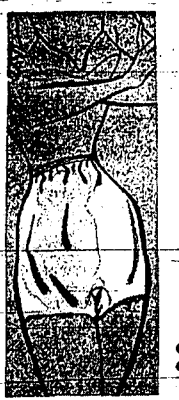

### Southern Demos Serve Notice They'll Seek Reductions in Foreign Aid Costs

WASHINGTON, Oct. 27 (AP)—Southern Democratic senators served notice today that foreign aid spending will be their number one economic target next year.

Eight out of 10 Dixie senators voted for sharp cuts in the mutual security program most of them have supported in the past. The other two agreed that overseas spending must be cut if the budget is to be balanced, but said they were sure it could be done without harming national security.

The southerners form a fairly close-knit group that often wield the balance of power in the senate. They were polled as a follow-up to an interview last week with Sen. Walter P. George, Ga., senior Democrat on the senate foreign relations and finance committee. George said he favors "drastic reductions" in both foreign aid and defense spending next year to achieve a balanced budget.

President Eisenhower has not disclosed his plans for economic and military aid to allies next year. But the southerners are sure they will clear that the administration has little chance of getting congress to repeat this year's six billion dollar aid program.

While sentiment was powerful for cutting foreign aid outlays the southerners were more cautious than George about committing themselves to vote for substantial reductions in the military budget.

Sen. Harry F. Byrd, D., Va., said foreign aid expenditures should be cut in half next year. But of the defense budget, he said only that it should undergo "any further reductions that can be made without endangering our national security."

Sen. John J. Spessard, D., Ala., foreign relations committee member and Democratic vice presidential nominee in 1952, was one of the two senators who took a "wait-and-see" position. The other was Sen. Sparkman, D., Okla.

Other viewpoints included:

- Sen. A. Willis Robertson, Va.—"I shall vote to give priority to national security and not vote to cut defense below the figure which the President and his military advisers say would imperil national safety."
- Sen. Clyde R. Hoey, N. C.—"I am definitely in favor of balancing the budget next year even though it requires drastic cuts in defense and foreign aid expenditures, provided such cuts will not materially restrict our national defense effort."

### Songwriters and Operators Clash

WASHINGTON, Oct. 27 (AP)—Attorneys for the nation's songwriters and juke box operators clashed yesterday before a senate judiciary subcommittee over composers' demands for royalties on phonograph records.

John Schulman, counsel for the Songwriters Protective Association, argued that "when a man writes a song, it's his property" and he should share the biggest slice of the public punas into record-playing machines to hear his music.

It appeared in support of a bill by Sen. Pat McCarran, D., Nev., that would repeal a law now requiring owners of coin-operated machines from paying royalties.

Twenty-eight representatives of operators and juke box manufacturers appeared with statements opposing the bill, arguing that it would raise the cost of the machines and reduce the number of machines in operation.

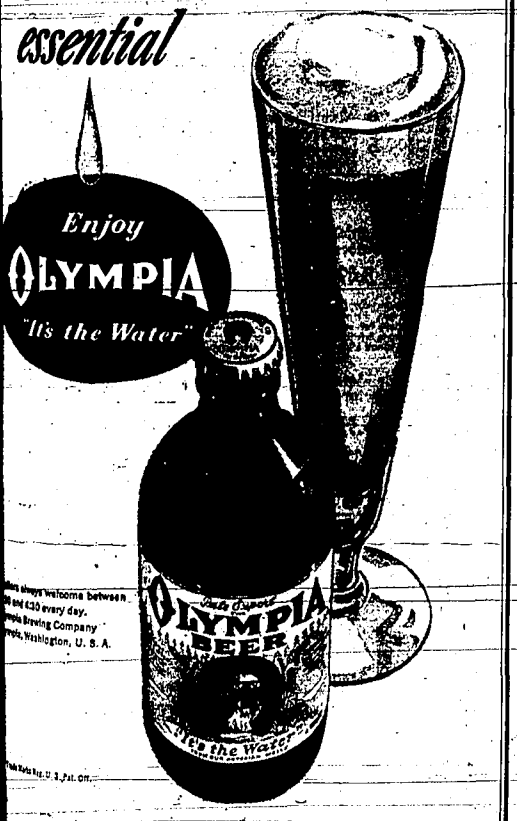

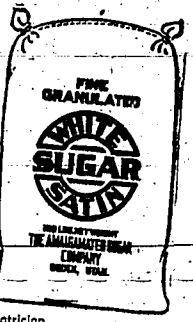

### Care of Your Children

By ANGELO PATRI

When persons are given temporary charge of children, they should have full authority to deal with them. Youngsters realize immediately when a person is timid that the substitute for a parent is not sure of her position. The children take advantage of this lack of authority and the situation becomes hopeless. The person is unable to enforce obedience and the youngsters are likely to get out of hand and make themselves offensive to neighbors and other relatives.

Those mothers who leave their children to be looked after by housewives, nurses or relatives, as the case may be, must be especially careful, not only about the person they have employed or called in, but also to let them understand they have the necessary authority over the youngsters.

People who know little about children may unintentionally do things that charge them by planting wrong ideas in the young minds. The boy man, the policeman, the ghost in the closet have been used to frighten youngsters from becoming obstreperous. The result has been that the children become unduly nervous and shy.

Persons who resort to such tactics should never be given authority. In fact, it is better not to have them look after the little ones, even for a very short time. Such ideas as trying to frighten youngsters into obedience would backfire on obstreperous women. But once a mother knows that the person who is to replace her is strongly capable of dealing

with children, then the person should have full authority speaks for itself in dealing with children.

"Mother, Nanny was mean to me today," a child told her mother. "She sat me in a chair and made me stay there. She wouldn't let me out to play with Monty."

"What did you do that brought that on?" the mother asked.

"After a few 'I didn't do anything,' the truth came out. 'I wouldn't drink my milk.' 'Spilled it on the floor. I didn't want to let my nap—didn't feel like it. I just kicked Nanny.'"

"Looks to me," said the mother sternly, "that Nanny did quite right. You've been very naughty. Tonight I was going to give you a toy I bought for you. But I'm not going to let you have it until you can show that you can behave properly. I would have been more severe with you than Nanny was—I would have spanked you, besides making you sit in the corner."

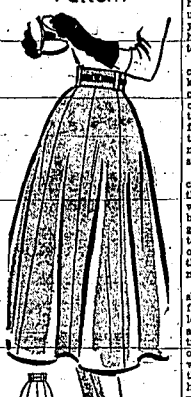
Such a maternal attitude will go a long way to improving a child's conduct when a mother is absent.

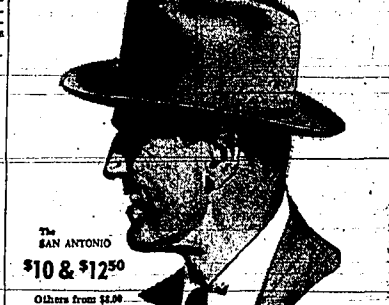

### Aide to Navy Chief Warns Against Cuts

DETROIT, Oct. 27 (AP)—Assistant Navy Secretary Raymond Z. Fogler said today the navy must never be given a "second class role" in U. S. defense planning because of a "misplaced confidence" in super weapons.

"In spite of the continuing development of newer and more powerful means of wholesale destruction," he warned, "it will always be necessary for us to control the seas on the surface."

"This can only be done when we have a strong navy," powerful navy as powerful as we can make it consistent with the dictates of our national economy."

**Rays Policy Changes**

Fogler spoke out strongly against any break in the tradition of maintaining a balance among the three armed services in a speech before the Detroit council of the Navy League.

A strong move is under way in some military quarters to limit the production of conventional weapons to concentrate on the development and output of an atomic arsenal. This view holds that the atom and hydrogen bombs make the balanced forces theory obsolete.

**Recalls War II Role**

Fogler recalled the vital role played by the navy in World War II. He warned that Russia has a navy that is "one of the strongest in the world today," even though it is largely submarine. He pointed out misfortunes which befell the United States when its sea power was inadequate.

"This must not happen again," he said.

During this period of cold war, he said, the navy is a "powerful instrument of our national power and . . . vital and necessary to the maintenance of our position of world leadership."

The board pointed out that the authorization was for this year only and it would be necessary to adopt a policy later on for both telecasts and broadcasts because of lowered revenue from attendance at athletic contests.

### 10-Month-Old Warning on Threat Still Fails to Jar U.S.

By LYLE C. WILSON

WASHINGTON, Oct. 27 — It is 10 months now since the federal civil defense administration issued a fearsome report on what Soviet Russia could do to the United States.

It could have scared the daylights out of everybody, but it didn't. Everybody didn't believe it. And that is one of the big problems of civil defense today.

Here's a sample paragraph from the United Press story of the PCDA report of last Feb. 1:

"At this very moment Russia could send a fleet of 400 atom bombers over America, get enough of them through to atom-bomb 99 major U. S. cities and leave up to 11 million dead and injured, the civil defense administration said today."

Now, 10 months after that blast of warning, PCDA reports studies indicate two of every three adults remain unimpressed. They seem to feel the air force or somebody could stop the Russians or they simply refuse to face unpleasant facts.

Civil Defense Administrator Val Peterson said in a week-end radio broadcast that, as things now stand, the best thing for city dwellers to do in event of atomic attack is to get eight or nine miles out of town. But he admitted that traffic jams

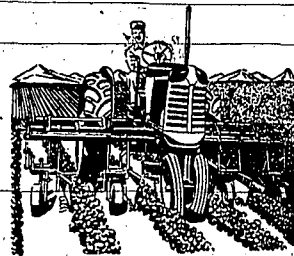

### Boosted for Chrysler By Purchase

Oct. 27—Chrysler Corp., one of the automotive industry's "big three," will become bigger with the \$3 million purchase of Briggs Manufacturing Co., the company's principal machinery and equipment supplier, which will be a wholly owned subsidiary and will be merged with Chrysler's major corporation and will be the largest car and truck plant in the world.

The purchase includes 10 plants in several areas and one each at Detroit, O., and Evansville, Ind.

Some of the properties will be sold when the necessary approval of all parties has been obtained that of the stockholders of Briggs Manufacturing

company, which it is estimated will take not more than 90 days," said Chrysler President L. L. Colbert.

The purchase will make Chrysler the largest employer in the Motor City area. With the addition of some 40,000 Briggs workers, Chrysler will have a payroll of more than 146,000 hourly and salaried employees.

Supplies Packard

Briggs has been the principal supplier of bodies for Plymouth, a Chrysler division, and Packard, an independent producer, for many years. According to Packard President James Nance, his company will continue to get bodies from Briggs plant—despite their acquisition by Chrysler.

Briggs, also a defense producer of aircraft parts, recorded its best production year in 1951. The company reported sales of \$302,223,409 last year and earnings of \$5,700,350.

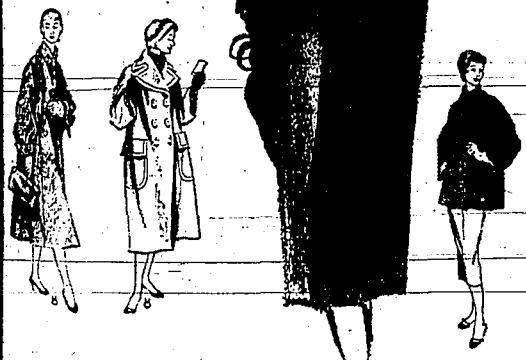

### Educators Aver Driver Training Offers Long-Range Hope in Cutting Death Toll

The nation's public school superintendents are nearly unanimous in their belief that teaching youths how to drive in high school offers the best long-range hope of reducing highway accidents.

Ninety per cent of the superintendents whose driver education programs do not include behind-the-wheel training term this phase an essential part of the course.

The greatest single reason behind-the-wheel instruction is not given, according to the superintendents who do not have this training.

These facts highlight a summary of reports received from more than 2,000 school superintendents, covering 3,500 public high schools, in a nationwide survey conducted recently by the public education department of the Aetna Casualty and Surety Company, Hartford, Conn.

Ninety-nine per cent of the superintendents believe that driver education should be taught in the nation's high schools, yet in only a fifth of the school systems covered by the survey was driver training a compulsory course.

Three out of every four students have a sincere desire to learn to drive skillfully and safely, the educators reported.

Next to costs, lack of curriculum

time and a shortage of qualified teachers were the most commonly stated reasons for not including behind-the-wheel training in driver education courses. But 98 per cent of the superintendents who had no behind-the-wheel instruction said they would include it if the cost problem was eliminated.

The survey showed widespread interest among educators in a revolutionary new multi-place classroom training device, the Aetna "Driver-trainer," that enables one teacher to supervise behind-the-wheel instruction for as many as 30 pupils at a time.

The first experimental model of

the "Driver-trainer," the development of which was financed by the Aetna as a public service, is now on loan to the New York City school system where studies show it may cut "behind-the-wheel" instruction costs to a half of that in conventional cars.

Costs and lack of curriculum time prevent expansion of the program beyond the five per cent of the students now being trained, according to Supt. Noah E. Gray, Sixteen, Mo.

The school superintendents generally underscored the importance of developing proper attitudes as well as driving skill. "Accidents stem from improper attitudes and lack

of stability more than from a lack of knowledge of mechanical technique," according to Dr. H. H. Bates, Norwood, O.

"Teaching attitude and road courtesy is paramount," in the opinion of School Supt. Wendell Phillips, Mt. Vernon, Wash., where driver training was scheduled to become a compulsory course this fall.

"Driver education can and should be one of America's great contributions to health, safety and welfare," stated Supt. B. W. Robinson, Eldon, Mo., who contended that, "we can teach the child to do something well and properly, that he is going to do anyway."

"Give young people instruction

in the proper skills and the right attitudes under competent instructors before they learn them from relatives and friends who are unaware of the many faults they themselves have and practice," advised A. F. Young, high school principal at Danville, Ky.
