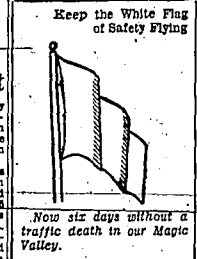

### Warning Sounded By Nixon on Visit

SACON, Indo-China, Nov. 2 (AP)—President Richard M. Nixon turned here today from a visit in Emperor Bao Dai in which he asserted that French withdrawal from Indo-China would mean complete communist domination of that area.

Nixon suspected French union top-training centers following his overnight visit to Bao Dai's mountain residence at Dak Heng where they charged troops at a state dinner.

"If your country is to be independent and free," Nixon told the emperor of Viet Nam, "it is first necessary to defeat the representatives of communist imperialism on our soil. To do that, it is necessary to have allies to work with you to accomplish that defeat."

### Van Fleet Sees No Need of Red 'Shooting War'

TULSA, Okla., Nov. 2 (AP)—Russia has a "formula that is a winner" and doesn't want a shooting war, Van Fleet said today, according to Gen. James A. Van Fleet.

The far eastern forces commander during the Korean fighting, asked what he thought about fears of the part of many Americans that Russia would wipe out major U. S. cities with atomic bombs, answered: "That's just it. We don't want to get frightened and start running. We will never start a shooting war, because they have a formula that is a winner."

"Look at the gains they have made in the past 10 years," Van Fleet said last night. "Look at the territory they have conquered. Whole areas of Asia and eastern Europe have been taken under their wing. They will use the atomic bomb only as a cover. They know that in order to defeat the United States they would have to out-produce us and out-deliver us. And they must know they never will be able to do it."

### Habitual Robber Put on FBI List

WASHINGTON, Nov. 2 (AP)—The FBI placed on its list of 10 most wanted fugitives.

He is Franklin J. Wilson, 53-year-old ex-convict wanted for an armed robbery in Chicago in August, 1951. After he was arrested for the crime, Wilson was released on \$50,000 bond and promptly jumped bail. There was some evidence he fled to California.

The FBI warned all police officers that Wilson is armed and should be considered "extremely dangerous."

Wilson replaces John R. Cooke on the FBI's list. Cooke, wanted for a series of holdups in Massachusetts, was taken into custody in Detroit, Oct. 20.

### Hamburg Vote Adds to Gains For Adenauer

HAMBURG, Germany, Nov. 2 (AP)—Chancellor Konrad Adenauer's tight coalition won absolute control of both houses of parliament in yesterday's Hamburg state elections, and Adenauer said today the victory is a new endorsement of his plans to put 500,000 Germans in the planned European army.

His coalition, campaigning on a straight platform of support for Adenauer's policies, was empowered by the election victory to amend the constitution—if necessary—to return West Germany.

The socialists had controlled Hamburg as a political stronghold since 1949 under the leadership of German-born, one-time American union leader Mayor Max Brauer.

In a ballot battle billed as a confidence showdown on Adenauer's policy on rearmament and tight alliance with the west, the coalition won 52 seats in the Hamburg state legislature to 38 for the socialists.

### Jerusalem Blast Cuts Water Line

JERUSALEM, Palestine, Nov. 2 (AP)—A violent explosion ripped the main water pipeline into the city, cutting off water supply to the Arab-held part of the city.

The explosion occurred at dawn. It blew up sections of the big pipeline leading from the Ain Fara section to the old section of Jerusalem, occupied by Jordan.

United Nations officials started an investigation of the blast.

### Speed Okayed For U. P. Line Tax Write-Off

WASHINGTON, Nov. 2 (Special)—Tax write-off privileges for more than \$200,000 worth of lease contracts for the Oregon Short Line railroad at Twin Falls and other points were announced by the Interstate Commerce Commission today.

A certificate for \$33,175 has been issued for part of the lease at Twin Falls. Full and Sods Springs, and passing trackage between these points. No breakdown was given for separate costs.

Another certificate covers similar improvements costing \$112,351 at Firch and Nampa.

Under the 1950 revenue act, defense industries are permitted rapid amortization of the cost of facilities related to defense needs. Companies can shorten the normal depreciation for such facilities to five years, thus reducing their tax load.

Forty per cent of the Oregon Short Line improvements qualify for fast write-off. Percentage allowance depends on the type of facility, the amount of expansion required for the emergency and the probable shortness of the improvement.

These are the first certificates of necessity granted to an Idaho firm this year outside the mining industry.

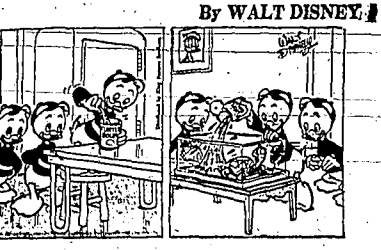
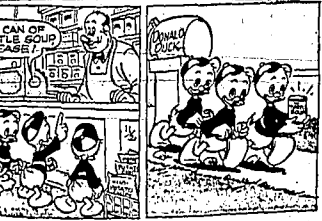

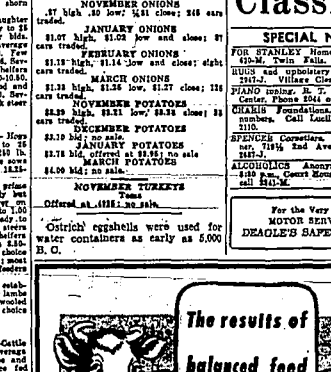
