Revise Made. In U. S. Mine Aid Program

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3 (AP)—The government decided Monday to limit financial aid by the defense minerals exploration-administration, OMDA, to those minerals in short supply for defense needs.

Even that aid will be limited to 75 per cent of the cost of an exploratory project, instead of the previous maximum of 90 per cent, Interior Secretary McKay announced.

This new restriction on government stimulation of exploration for new strategic materials deposits carries out recommendations made by the office of defense mobilization (ODM) on Aug. 31. The new rules are effective on applications received after today.

ODM made its recommendations in approving the interior department's request for additional borrowing authority to finance the minerals exploration program through next June 30, McKay said.

Two groups He announced that future aid will be on the following basis:

Group A—Chromium, copper, and molybdenum, for which the government will contribute 50 per cent of approved project costs.

Group B—Asbestos (chrysotile only), beryl, cobalt, columbite, manganese, mica, muscovite (block and film only), nickel, platinum, tantalum, tungsten and uranium; for which the government will contribute 75 per cent of approved costs.

WASHINGTON—An entirely new kind of fight over foreign exchange has been waged these days before President Eisenhower's commission on foreign economic policy. Due to changing world-and-domestic-conditions, old-policies-economic policy is being re-examined.

While the new commission is still in its infancy, it has already taken a number of steps to get a new policy program for the future. It is the first comprehensive study of this broad-and-better, wage-and-price problem in many years.

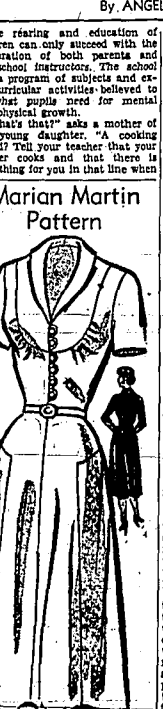

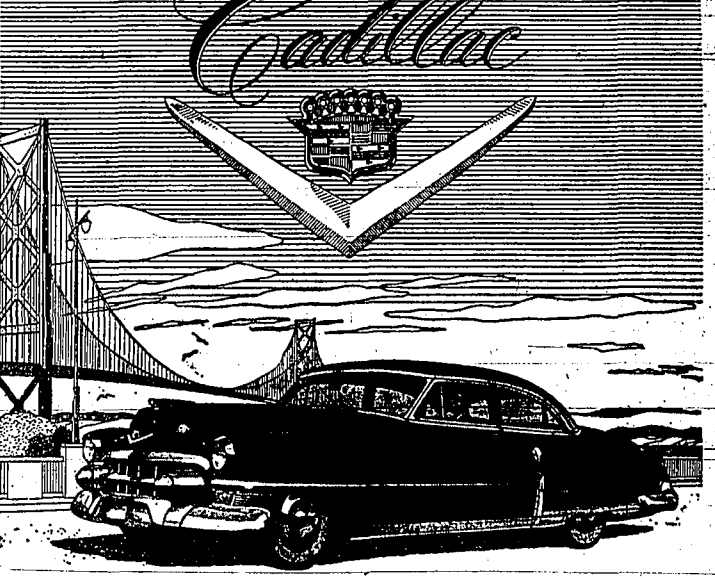

Notre Dame Retains Top Rating for Sixth Week in Row; UCLA Ranked Eighth

NEW YORK, Nov. 3 (AP)—For the sixth week in a row, it's Notre Dame atop the United Press college football ratings today, without a serious threat in sight.

The Irish, who put out a little extra for absent coach Frank Leahy last week-end and drubbed Navy 38-7, received near-unanimous acclaim from the United Press board of coaches in this week's ratings. Notre Dame's 344 points—just six less than a perfect score—was the second best showing ever made in the ratings.

Thirty-one of the 35 coaches voted the Irish the best in the nation, while two others picked them second and two voted them third place. The only team ever to make a better showing was Oklahoma, in compiling 357 points, but not counting while being voted the national champion in 1950.

Maryland retained the runner-up spot with one more "place vote" than 27 points leading the Irish by 74 points, while Baylor, which held third, had the three other first place ballots and 240 points. The three top teams are unbeaten and untied.

Unless Notre Dame falters, it appears a good bet for the 1953 national championship. Of its remaining opponents, Southern California ranks 14th, the next, Southern Methodist is tied for 20th, while Pennsylvania, Iowa and North Carolina are not among the first 20. The Irish, with Leahy expected back after being sidelined by a stomach ailment, play Pennsylvania in Philadelphia Saturday.

The upset defeat of Southern California, which ranked fourth last week, costed Illinois, Michigan State and Oklahoma each to move up one notch to occupy fourth, fifth and sixth places in the ratings. Georgia Tech, UCLA, West Virginia and Michigan rounded out this week's top 10. Leahy's return to the select group after a week's absence, replaced Southern California.

Points attracted 224 points, Michigan State 176, Oklahoma 144, Georgia Tech 141, UCLA 134, West Virginia 127 and Michigan 126. Georgia Tech advanced two notches to seventh place. UCLA retained eighth, and West Virginia, the nation's other major perfect-record team, moved up one notch to ninth.

Points gained 106 from a 10 for 13th at week. After Southern California among the second 10 teams came Ohio State, Stanford, Wisconsin and Mississippi tied for 14th. After that came Texas, Duke, Alabama and Louisiana State with Wisconsin and Southern Methodist tied for 20th place.

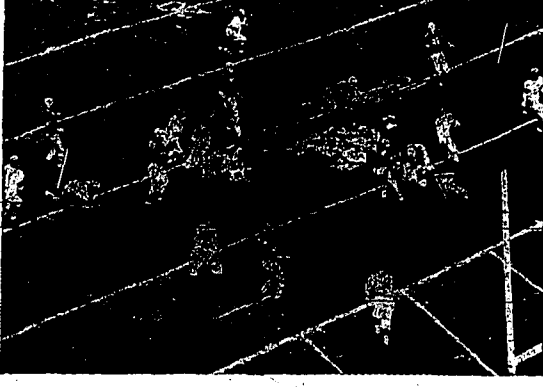

TO EZRA TAFT BENSON, THE PUBLIC AND CATTLEMEN EVERYWHERE

WE, THE undersigned east end cattle feeders of Twin Falls and Jerome counties, wish to go on record as being absolutely opposed to any government interference with our industry --- either as to controls or price supports of any kind.

In our line of business, like all others, we expect to take a loss now and then. But even so, we still prefer to conduct our business affairs as independent individuals, without government price supports and controls.

Common sense should tell us that the price of beef has been too high to encourage widespread consumption of meat in this country. Our problem is not to secure higher prices, supported by the government. Instead, we should strive for greater consumption at prices the consuming public can afford to pay.

To our way of thinking, no legitimate farmer or cattle man needs a government handout. We prefer to abide by the law of supply and demand and upon this principle we will stand.

We are in wholehearted accord with Secretary of Agriculture Benson's program and want to make it clear to the public, the cattlemen's association and the administration, that we did NOT have a hand in any part of the caravan that descended upon Washington recently. We had nothing to do with anyone making that trip.

We regard the cattle industry as too vital and important a part of our national economy to be subsidized by the government. We feel that this great industry is fully capable of working out its own problems, and we hope it will continue to maintain its identity under the banner of free enterprise, instead of being swallowed up by a political bureaucracy.

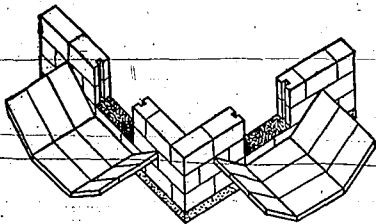

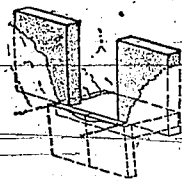
