

The surface signs of this impending switch were a pair of confusing statements by Secteary of State Dulles and Secretary of Defense Wilson. Wilson said the development of new weapons might reduce the need for U. S. troops overseas. Dulles said he knew of no plan to withdraw any U. S. forces now serving with NATO in Europe. Evidently both were correct.

As everyone knows, the U. S. joint chiefs of staff have just finished taking a "fresh look" at our defense position and commitments around the world. According to reliable reports, they have decided they cannot make major cuts in defense outlays unless they are authorized to preduce forces overseas and concentrate on production of atomic rather than conventional weapons.

The trend appears definitely to be in this direction, not simply for reasons of economy but for reasons of strategy. In other words, the joint chiefs, on the basis of detailed cost estimates, are convinced they can get far more fire power for less money if they can give top priority to atomic weapons at the expense of conventional types. So it is that they are considering the revolutionary change-over to heavy dependence on atomic weapons of many kinds.
