BURLEY, Nov. 11—A second case of rabies has cropped up in Minidoka county, causing state officials to consider extending the quarantine clamped on part of southeastern Idaho last week in an attempt to curb the disease. Dr. R. V. Lewis, assistant state veterinarian, said tests show a dog died of rabies in Heyburn recently. Heyburn is outside the five-mile quarantine area set up after rabies cases appeared in Burley. Announcement of the second Minidoka county case came one day after confirmation of the first case. Dr. D. T. Hurlburg, deputy state veterinarian, said on Monday a dog in Emerson had died of the disease.

NEW YORK, Nov. 11 (UPI)—Former President Harry S. Truman laid the Harry Dexter White case to Republican "analogists" today and said "I don't know" when asked if he will make an appearance before the house un-American activities committee.

"In case you're wondering about the word 'analogist' it's a southern word meaning a man born out of wedlock," he said.

Mr. Truman said he had talked over the White matter with former Judge Samuel I. Rosenman, a member of the committee.

The former President indicated he might break his formal silence in the upper tomorrow morning. He said he would be a good idea for them to wait for his regular morning appearance outside the hotel tomorrow.

Friday Appearance

The former President was served with a subpoena late yesterday demanding his appearance in the morning before the un-American activities committee in Washington.

When asked if he would appear in the morning he said "I don't know, I don't know whether I'm going or not."

He said he would appear in the morning if he felt it was in the best interests of the country.

Other Visits

Three former members of the White House staff, Charles P. White, James L. Sullivan and David G. Reardon, were also subpoenaed.

White Charge Storm Continues to Spread

WASHINGTON, Nov. 11 (UPI)—President Eisenhower said today he feels the house un-American activities committee should not have subpoenaed Harry S. Truman and he does not believe Truman knowingly harbored a Soviet spy in the U. S. government.

Mr. Eisenhower also said at his news conference he personally believes the un-American activities committee should not have subpoenaed Supreme Court Justice Tom C. Clark for testimony in the Harry Dexter White case.

The President's attitude—plus fears of some Republican strategists that the Truman subpoena might boomerang politically—raised the possibility that the star-studded committee probe of the White case might be called off.

However, Chairman Harold H. Burton of the un-American activities committee said today he plans to go ahead with his calling of Truman for a White case.

Can't Believe

Although Mr. Eisenhower said he could not believe Truman would harbor a Soviet spy, he said he believed and he personally would not have subpoenaed him, Mr. Eisenhower said at the same time.

Expressed Full Confidence

In Attorney General Brownell, Mr. Eisenhower said he expressed full confidence in the attorney general's handling of the White case.

Sharing Of 'Notes'

Despite his country's 1948 offer to share its atomic knowledge with the world, Mr. Eisenhower said he would not share his notes on the White case with anyone.

CHANGING THEIR TUNE

Believe it or not there is a changed attitude toward Senator McCarthy in Washington and elsewhere. Some of his severest critics are pulling in their horns.

Many prominent Americans, including officials, politicians and ordinary but well-posted citizens, who previously overlooked no opportunity to see off an McCarthy, are no longer reviling the senator from Wisconsin.

Even the New York Herald Tribune, which once led the attack on "McCarthyism," has changed its tune. Now it is praising him for the "vigor and restraint" of his new methods.

Most surprising, however, has been the change in the Europeans' attitude toward him. Only a few months ago after visiting Europe, both Adlai E. Stevenson and Eleanor Roosevelt declared that he was chiefly responsible for the lowering of American prestige abroad.

Another severe critic has been Alistair Cooke, Washington correspondent of the British Manchester Guardian of England and narrator for the television program known as "Omnibus." But in recent dispatches, Cooke has emphasized the great value of McCarthy's work. He has said:

In short, Senator McCarthy is now working well within the sanction of legislative investigations. He is on the track of serious subversion, undiscovered by other branches of the government.

"This is a new turn which liberals are loathe to acknowledge; but, in the strange and important history of Senator McCarthy, the facts now challenge those principles by which professional liberals may enjoy the moral luxury of deploring him."

It remains for the American people to decide in the future whether it was necessary for McCarthy to play the role of a lone wolf during the opening years of this great campaign.

With pinkos, rats, communists and all other kinds of vermin firmly entrenched in high places in our national government, it is easy to understand why McCarthy had to resort to rough tactics at the outset.

Benson Slates Tour in West's Drought Zone

WASHINGTON, Nov. 11 (AP)—Agriculture Secretary Benson will visit drought stricken areas in New Mexico, Arizona, Wyoming, Utah and Idaho.

The tour will start Thursday and last five days. It will take Benson to Texas, New Mexico, Arizona, Wyoming, Utah and Idaho.

He has asked Chairman George D. Aiken, R., Vt., and Clifford R. Hope, R., Kans., of the Senate and House agriculture committees to go with him.

All but Arizona will be in the government's drought-stricken areas. Benson will make the tour in an airplane. He will take off Thursday from Columbus, O., after making a speech there before the Association of Land Grant Colleges and Universities. He will fly directly to Lubbock, Tex., and remain there Thursday night.

Friday he will go to Santa Fe, N. M., and Prescott, Ariz., Saturday to Elko, Nev., Salt Lake City, Utah, and back to Salt Lake City where he will remain over Sunday. Monday the secretary will go to St. Louis or Kansas City, Mo., and return to Washington Monday night.

Gov. Full Donnelly, Missouri, has urged Benson's offer of one million dollars in federal funds to help finance an emergency hay program in the state.

Donnelly said in a letter to President-elect Dwight D. Eisenhower that restrictions attached to the offer would be "incompatible" with a \$10 million-dollar drought program authorized by the Missouri legislature.

Health Menace Found in Ice Used in Chilling Food, Drinks

NEW YORK, Nov. 11 (AP)—The ice that chills your food and drinks can be a health hazard, ice scientists said today. Ice almost always starts out pure, made from water meeting high sanitary standards. But there can be many a slip 'twixt freezer and lip by careless handling and serving of crushed or cubed ice.

The tests often find ice carrying germs inviting food poisoning or diarrhea. Slow-melting, soft-ice types may cause appear very hard to determine.

Two studies point up the hazard, with Harvard scientists reporting a remedy to keep crushed ice sanitary—a chlorine bath.

V. D. Feltz of the Kansas agricultural experiment station, Manhattan, Kan., analyzed 116 samples of ice collected from public places and hospitals in central Kansas.

From 76 per cent of them, he could cultivate germs of the type responsible for food poisoning, diarrhea, wound infections, typhoid and dysentery.

Thirty-one samples were fairly high in germ content. Crushed ice was usually more than cubed, with only 10 of 71 samples of crushed

ice meeting good sanitary standards. Feltz found. That's significant, he said, because crushed ice is not only used in drinks but also in direct contact to chill foods, some of which are eaten raw. Germs in crushed ice included some known to play a part in spoiling of some foods.

Cubed ice made by machines was much better, with nearly half of 37 samples being germ-free. In hospitals particularly, where ice-making machines were well tended, the ice cubes were really sanitary.

Feltz, writing in public health reports, also found sand, threads, bits of finger nail polish and insects, and other debris in sediment from melted crushed or cubed ice.

Prof. Edward M. Moore, Evelyn W. Brown and Ellen M. Hall, Harvard university, also report germs often contaminating crushed ice as it was formerly dispensed in 16-food service.

Economy and Political Tide Upsets Metals

NEW YORK, Nov. 11 (AP)—Politics, economy and the cold war have caused Uncle Sam to stop buying copper and other metal men up in the air.

The politics is at the international level. An urge for economy has caused Uncle Sam to stop buying copper and other metals for his military stockpile. And the cold war is the United States' urgent desire to keep Russia from getting a share of the surplus copper—a very essential.

The world demand and supply of copper is in a fairly delicate balance at the moment, with the price holding firm at around 30 cents a pound while the United States and Chile haggle over what to do with the big stocks of copper backing up in the South American republic.

Price Drop Here

Copper men here say the price is likely to drop, no matter how the present impasse between Washington and Santiago is resolved.

If Chile goes through with current plans to offer her more than 100,000 tons of surplus copper on the world market, the price drop is expected. The price paid up because Chile asked 35 cents a pound and could find no takers in the United States for retirement into U. S. stocks of defense materials, the release of Chile copper output on the world market seems likely to break the present delicate balance and tilt the price downward.

Zinc, Lead Breaks

A rash of foreign metal has already caused price breaks in zinc and lead, metals which have caused the shutting down of a number of American mines. Copper, zinc and lead usually are tied closely together in consumption and price trends.

Copper, lead and zinc men say they are demanded for their metals continues high, even if off a little from the Korean war peak.

They say it is (1) that the U. S. government has stopped buying for its stockpile, and (2) that there is a world wide supply and an increase in import volumes here. This has raised zinc in recent weeks. But the Chinese copper situation really could upset this metal trade sources say.

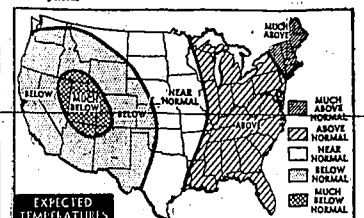

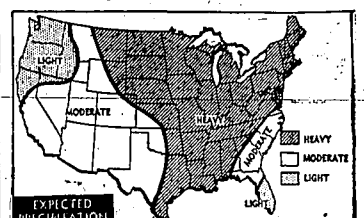

"Ike" to Discuss Continental Defense With Canadian Chief

OTTAWA, Ont., Nov. 11 (AP)—President Eisenhower's trip to the Canadian capital this week officially is a "country visit," but it will give the President a chance to talk over problems of defense and to speak directly to the Canadian people.

By protocol, the President will be returning the visit Prime Minister Louis St. Laurent paid to Washington last May. St. Laurent will share the role of host with Vincent Massey, who as governor-general is the Queen's representative in Canada but has strictly a nominal part in the government. The prime minister is Canada's nearest equivalent to the U. S. presidency. St. Laurent three months ago retained the job in a national election returning his Liberal party to power.

St. Laurent is a former corporation lawyer, who entered government service in wartime and stayed on to become the biggest vote getter in the country. He took over the prime ministerial job succeeding William L. Mackenzie King.

At 71, he is eight years older than Mr. Eisenhower.

The topic most common to both countries at this time is continental defense. As far as Canada is concerned, trade relations also are important. These likely will form the basis of talks Mr. Eisenhower will hold with St. Laurent and the cabinet. The cabinet members include two men well known in the United States—Foreign Secretary Lester B. Pearson and Clarence D. Howe, minister of trade and defense production who was born in Wallham, Mass.

President and Mrs. Eisenhower will arrive from Washington at 11:40 a. m. (EST) Friday. Their train will be met by Massey, St. Laurent and the cabinet.

Many Caught By Narcotics, Ex-GI Claims

MARYSVILLE, Calif., Nov. 11 (AP)—A former serviceman arrested in a \$70,000 narcotics case here said many GIs in the far east are "getting hooked" on the drug habit.

Get 1/2 Robert Damon Dalton told police his pain only \$100 for a \$700 supply of heroin and morphine seized in a raid here, Donald Leslie Walkinshaw also was arrested as well as both minor wives. The wives were released later but the men are held in lieu of \$15,000 bail pending a preliminary hearing Thursday.

Trade in Pounds

Dalton told Police John O. Blevens trade in narcotics in the far east "is in pounds, not ounces." He told Blevens many American soldiers were "being hooked" and the "flow of stuff" into this country through servicemen is "just as easy as the way I brought mine in."

"I brought it right through customs and everything," Dalton said. "It was no trouble. It's over there everywhere you go." He said most of the supply was coming through Inchon, Korea.

Held Since September

Dalton said he had held his narcotics since returning to this country in September.

Asked about the narcotics habit among servicemen in Korea and the far east, Dalton told Blevens: "A lot—oh, a lot of them are using it. You can see it... they were right in front of you all the time." He said narcotics was used openly in "joints" in Korea cities.

Court OK's Rule On McCarran Act

WASHINGTON, Nov. 11 (AP)—The supreme court has accepted a second opportunity to interpret the controversial McCarran-Walter immigration act of 1952.

The court's agreed to decide whether Sergio Rubinstein may be arrested and held on Ellis Island while he is fighting deportation. The action against him is based on his draft-dodging conviction in World War II.

The justice department claims the new immigration law does not permit the de-treated Russian-born immigrant to appeal his deportation directly to a federal court. The department says the "stay-order" may arrest Rubinstein any time and he then can try to get out of custody by the time-honored method of seeking a writ of habeas corpus.

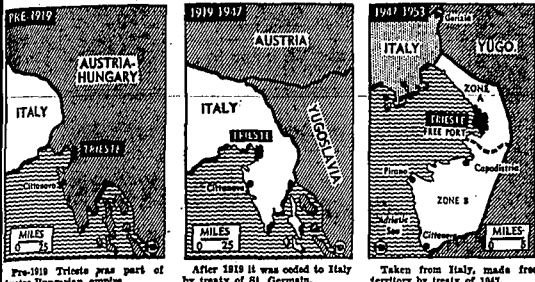

Care of Your Children By ANGELO PATRI

Children should not be hurried through any stage of their growth. For their food, they should be permitted to meet conditions as they mature and as the youngsters gain in understanding.

For instance, a child should not be pushed through school, and an adolescent boy or girl must not be forced to work, study or engage in sports for which he or she is not ready or prepared.

In child-rearing, to see their children as shining lights, have them surpass those of relatives or neighbors, parents often endanger the health of youngsters and thus ruin their chances for the future.

This forcing of children to do this or that may be tragic. Fathers and mothers should know that this driving of children is bound to meet with failure. Usually, when a child lags behind his companions in class, there is a reason, and the real way to be helpful is to find out what the physical defect is.

Healthy, competent youngsters need no driving—rather, the opposite. When a child is recuperating from an illness, such as scarlet fever or an operation, he must be given time for complete recovery. His whole being has received a shock and is, therefore, shaky. Few such patients should return to school as soon as they are able to get up and about. They need relaxation and even after that, they should not undertake a full day's schoolwork, but take it up gradually.

Though the child is no longer under a physician's care, he should be watched as he is not strong and might, therefore, fall ill again, especially if he is permitted to do more study than he should at that time.

For such a youngster, schoolwork should be resumed with a half session, the afternoon off for rest, and no homework, no pressure. His mind will do better if he receives sympathetic help.

New Tanks Implement National Guard Training Program

36 Light Tanks Are Added to Training Equipment of Guard

Idaho national guard has purchased 36 light tanks of latest army design for use in training units scattered over the state, declared James C. Leighton, regimental commander, 110th armored cavalry regiment.

The tanks are being taken directly from production lines and assigned to Idaho guardsmen, Col. Leighton said.

The tanks feature a new 76-millimeter, high-velocity cannon, with a range of more than 10,000 yards at a muzzle velocity of nearly 500 feet per second, he reported.

They carry also a 50-caliber machine gun for anti-aircraft and a self-propelled mortar.

They also are equipped with automatic transmissions, with torque converters, and 500-horsepower engines.

Rights on the cannons carry governors which compute engine revolutions automatically for the operator. This means the big guns can be kept targeted on fixed objects in a majority of instances, Colonel Leighton said.

The tanks have a top speed of about 40 miles per hour. The torque converters enable the drivers to turn tracks in opposite directions and turn the tanks around on a spot, he noted.

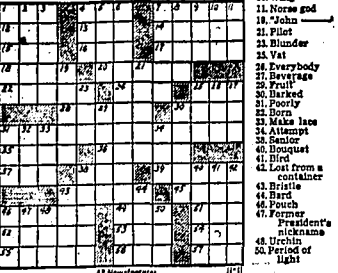

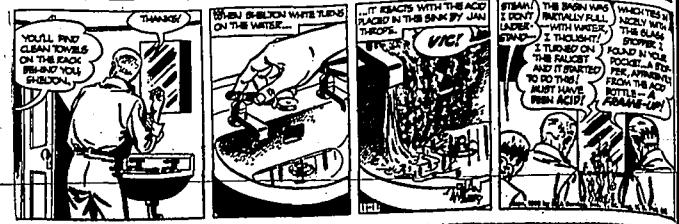

How Israeli-Arab Crisis Grew

- 1 Israel charges Arabs kill three citizens.
- 2 Jordan charges Israeli raiders kill 66 defenseless persons.
- 3 Egypt says Israeli raiders killed 22 people along the border during September.
- 4 Israel claims Jordan raiders have killed 421 citizens since 1950.

S. sent Eric Johnson to the middle east in an attempt to arrive at a solution satisfactory to both Israel and the Arabs. At the same time, the U. N. security council summoned Maj. Gen. Yarn Benakue, Denmark, chief U. N. force supervisor, to present his "blueprint for security" in the holy land.

New Vaccine Is Promising; Experts Aver

NEW YORK, Nov. 11 (U. S. P. A.)—A new polio vaccine, made with bit of sun-dried virus, shows promise in its human tests, Chicago scientists report.

The vaccine uses polio virus inactivated or "killed" by exposure to ultraviolet light or sun-lamp rays for two seconds.

It thus differs from the famous vaccine developed by Dr. Jonas S. Salk, Pittsburgh. The Salk vaccine, scheduled for mass human tests soon, inactivates the viruses with formaldehyde.

Produce Antibodies

The sun-dried vaccine produced antibodies against all three types of polio virus in most of 30 human volunteers, Drs. Albert Miller, Bid-

der O. Levinson and H. J. Shughnessy, Michael Reese research foundation, Chicago, told the American Public Health association at its annual meeting.

The 30 included a few persons who before vaccination had no detectable antibodies against any one or more of the types of virus. Usually the vaccine brought a four-fold increase in antibodies any of the volunteers had from previous unknown exposure to polio.

Key Finding

The key to a safe vaccine is to render the polio virus powerless to cause sickness but still keep some of its power to make a human produce antibodies against the virus.

The Chicago team said they believed sun-lamp irradiation of the viruses offers a promising method of doing this.

Reds Free on Big Promises, Ex-POW Says

WASHINGTON, Nov. 11 (U. S. P. A.)—To free American POWs to choose communism, the Reds have promised the women "free schooling," free meals and a chance to rule the bloc states when it is conquered.

This is the testimony of Cpl. Edward S. Dickenson, the Cracker's back Va. youth who chose freedom for the Reds, refusing repatriation with 22 other U. S. war prisoners.

Some May Return

In a copyrighted interview in U. S. News and World Report, a weekly news magazine, Dickenson said that spite of these promises he believed the 22 would come home if given the proper explanation.

Some of them "have studied quite a bit and their ideological level is very high on politics," he said.

Ideological Level Low

"But there are some in the lower class, their ideological level is not very high, they do not understand very much and mostly what they are going on is the promises that have been made to them by the communists and fear of the U. S. government."

The 22 are being held by the neutral nations' commission in Korea. U. S. officials are scheduled to explain their rights to them in interviews. In these, they will get a chance to change their minds and U. S. officials are scheduled to ask for repatriation.

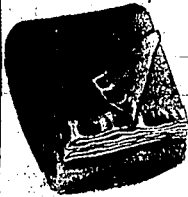

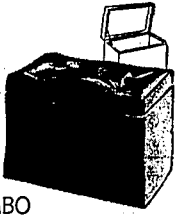
