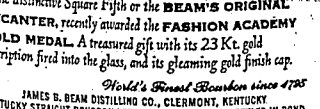

Fall Work Is Nearing End On Air Field

CAREY, Dec. 4.—Fall work required in readying the new Carey airport for a grass seedbed is nearing completion, reports Chas. Moulton, state civil aeronautics director. Work was started early in November and level the 300-foot wide airport.

The greatest amount of work was concentrated on the outer runway which is 200 feet wide and 2,600 feet long. This required a bed of gravel spread over it to a depth of three inches. The gravel was mixed with the underlying dirt to a depth of six inches. Moulton said this mixture makes a more firm and compact base for the grass seed and will withstand the impact of heavy planes.

A sprinkling system has been installed and seed planting and the building of a pump house remain to be done next spring.

Heavy machinery necessary for the project was furnished by the county with Carey men donating their time to run them. Considerable expense was averted when a streak of gravel was discovered in the middle of the airport. Previous plans called for hauling the necessary gravel from the dry river bed south of town. The pit from which the gravel was taken was later filled with dirt removed during the leveling process.

Kenneth Eldredge, county commissioner, made arrangements for the necessary machinery. Dean Cummins, Emmett, was superintendent of the work project.

The airport will not be ready for use by planes until 1943. Then the runway will have settled and hardened and a firm grass seed will be rooted.

Until the new airport can be used, planes landing in Carey will continue to use the old landing field west of the community. The OAA plans to have the new airport available as a refueling stop since it is located at the midway point between Boise and the upper Snake river towns. Moulton reports.
