Bond Ceiling Hike Favored

IDAHO FALLS, March 8 (AP)—The Idaho School Bond Association was on record today in favor of raising the limit for school district bonded indebtedness from 10 to 15 per cent of assessed valuation.

That an other resolutions and election of officers highlighted the conclusion of the association's third day convention in Idaho Falls today.

The trustees recommended that classroom units be completed on average daily membership instead of average daily attendance and that school district audits be published in the same form as budgets for presentation at meetings.

They reaffirmed a 1951 resolution that the state board of education be elected by popular vote, with the superintendent of public instruction to be appointed by the board.

R. W. Birch, County of Blaine, was re-elected president. Mrs. John Walcott, Boise, is the new first vice president and Mrs. William Holland, Idaho Falls, will be second vice president. Eddy, Boise, continues as secretary.

The 1955 convention will be held in Boise during the regular session of the state legislature.

Gabrielson also criticized the public lands committee. He said the committee "has distinguished itself by its consistent and constant efforts to help the 'game boys'."

The d'Ewart bill, said Gabrielson, would have given livestock operators a first and second mortgage on all national forests.

Gabrielson said the brightest spot in the picture has been congress itself. He said congress, in defeating the d'Ewart bill, has refused to go along with these attempted raids. He cited a number of bills which congress refused to pass.

Lake Studies Of Plant Life Note Pattern

Farm Price Hike Noted for Idaho

BOISE, March 8 (U-P)—The U. S. agriculture department's index of farm prices for Idaho rose 1 point from mid-January to mid-February, but remained 19 points below February, 1933.

The index stood at 243, reflecting a rise in prices for the second straight month.

Wheat and oats increased 1 cent per bushel, barley 3 cents a bushel, apples 35 cents a bushel, hay 30 cents a ton, alfalfa seed \$4.40 per hundred pounds and hogs 40 cents per hundred pounds.

Cattle dropped 20 cents and lambs 30 cents per hundred pounds. Buttermilk 1 cent a pound and milk 10 cents per hundred pounds.

Chickens dropped 14 cents a pound, eggs 4 cents a dozen and dry beans 30 cents, and dry peas 80 cents per hundred pounds.

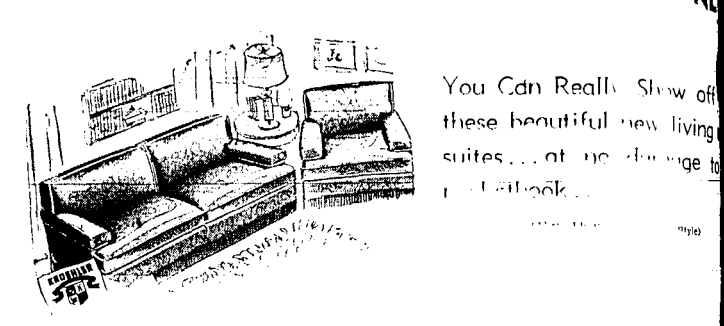
There is no reason for any man ever to lose a fight. Take two muskets and you can beat anyone. First, let your opponent sit and knock your head off the first minute or two.
