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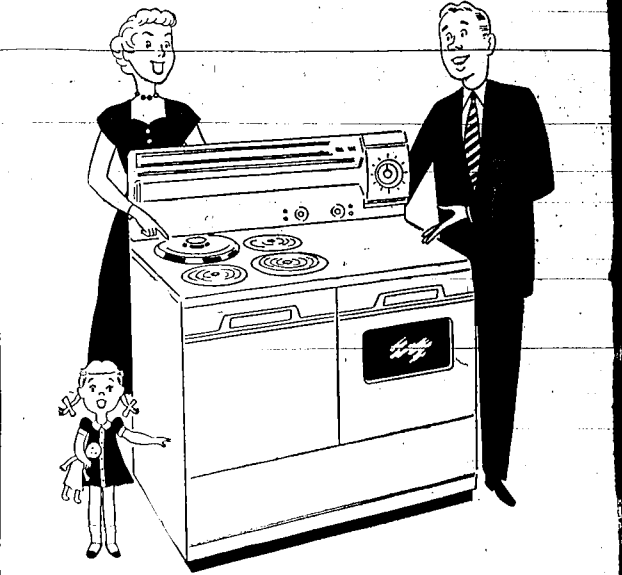

**Enforcement, Planning Get Safety Marks**

Streets by day and night. But by night, enforcement of the theory that most accidents are caused by misadjustments in traffic movement. The city got a first prize in 1957 when its "Traffic Plan" set up one of the nation's first traffic projection bureaus and placed him in charge. "I'm setting up the system of a 'traffic' accident in some of those areas. Later, he was instrumental in setting up Northwestern university's traffic post, which helps the traffic police throughout the country.

Evolution was one of the first cities to high school and high school students who are placed on probation must attend safety schools once a week for four weeks. The city's first high school classroom and actual driving instruction.

The city also was one of the first to emphasize pedestrian safety using loudspeakers on police cars to instruct drivers and pedestrians on proper conduct in traffic.

Evolution is also experimenting with variations of the "Barnes dance" method of controlling traffic intersections. In this method, traffic lights are so regulated that traffic at all four corners is halted while pedestrians are permitted to cross in all directions, even via the jaywalk route.

The city is experimenting with a variation sometimes called the "healing walk" in which cars must pause before turning at intersections to give pedestrians time to cross.

**Liquor Theft Sets Record**

BOISE, March 9 (UP) - A store that is believed to be the largest liquor haul in Idaho history, Chief Investigator R. W. Millap of the state liquor law enforcement division reported today.

An auditor's survey showed the store lost 87 cases of whiskey, weighing 3,600 pounds, in addition to 32 cases of beer for a total loss of \$4,147.80, Millap said.

No trace of the thieves has been found, he added.

Millap said the men apparently drove up in a three-quarter-ton truck, broke open a rear window, and spent up to an hour ransacking the basement store room. Three-fourths of the store's supply was gone when officials arrived next morning, he said.

The store was trundled out the front door, Millap said, but luckily the store had removed a large amount of cash for deposit in a bank the day before.

The burglary far outdistanced the previous record—the theft of 4,500 cases of beer from a HomeLife state liquor store three years ago.

**Funds Urged To Complete 2 State Dams**

WASHINGTON, March 9 (AP) - Army engineers have testified that Albeni Falls reservoir could be completed within a year under appropriations of \$4,360,000 and \$1,760,000, respectively. The projects are in Idaho.

Testimony given by the engineers to a house appropriations subcommittee was made public on Monday. The hearing was on appropriation requests for civil works during the year beginning July 1.

Col. William Hippie told the committee \$4,360,000 "will definitely" complete the \$1-million Albeni Falls dam reservoir, which will reduce flood damages around Lake Pend Oreille and produce 42,000 kilowatts of power.

Col. A. D. Starbird testified \$1,760,000 would bring the \$8-million Lucky Peak flood control project on the Boise river to within 64 per cent of completion in a year.

Regarding the remaining six per cent, Starbird said, "The work involved is of a somewhat indefinite scope at the present time. It will be primarily slide protection work on areas where road slides have already and will probably continue to occur at some time in the future."

Edward P. Cliff, assistant chief of the service, gave the estimate to a house appropriations subcommittee Feb. 17. His testimony was made public today.

Cliff testified in support of an administration request that congress provide \$285,000 more for combating forest pests in the fiscal year starting next July 1 than it allotted for the current fiscal year.

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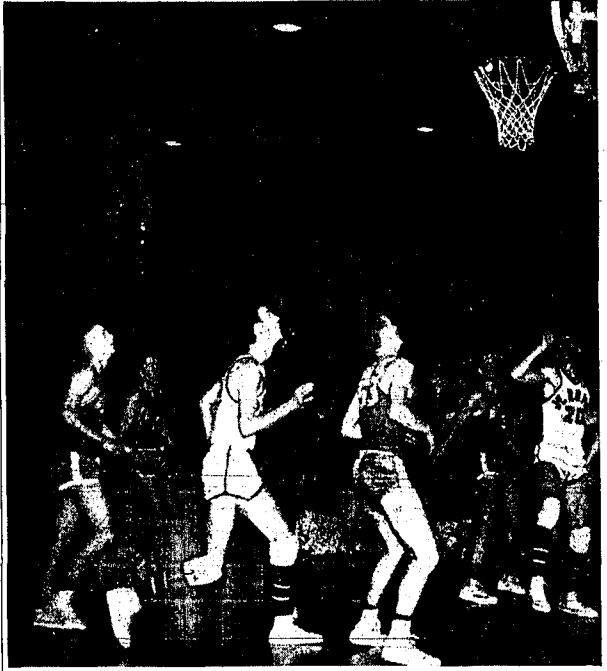
