Safety Council Hears Report on U.S. Meet

The Twin Falls Safety Council meeting Thursday night was highlighted by a report from Virginia Hawk, Rupert, on last month's highway safety conference in Washington, D. C., at which she was Idaho's sole official woman representative. More than 2,500 delegates from the 48 states attended the meeting, she said. In addition to Miss Hawk, a member of Rupert's Business and Professional Women's club, Idaho Gov. Len Jordan appointed men from the fields of agriculture, labor, aviation, government, industry, public information and transportation to represent the state at the national meeting.

President Eisenhower, the conference's principal speaker, said the purpose of the meeting was to develop the nation's wide support, at the community level, for proven methods of improving street and highway safety. Miss Hawk reported the President was highly concerned over the nation's highway safety problem. "The thing that impressed me most," she quoted the President, "is the fact that in the last 30 years there have been killed more people than all of America's wars." Eisenhower pointed out it required 50 years for the U. S. to reach its 1930 traffic fatality in 1933, but present indications show only half that time will be needed to reach the two million mark.

Secretary of Commerce Sinclair Weeks said the nation was staggered by the economic loss alone caused by traffic accidents. In 1933, he said, there were 60,000,000 vehicles on the highway with 9,000,000 accidents.

One of the most thought-provoking addresses at the conference, Miss Hawk said, was that of Donald Buck, safety engineer for the U. S. Army. Bucking up President Eisenhower, Buck said "accidents are the most common cause of death in this country." He said that the only way to reduce the number of accidents was to have a "total control" over the highway situation. Dairymen Urged to Build Own Markets

Dairymen can create their own market through improved advertising and merchandising, Merrill N. Warnick, Pleasant Grove, Utah, American Dairy association president, declared at the district meetings of the Jerome Cooperative Creamery in Twin Falls and Heyburn Thursday and Friday. Warnick said the dairy industry cannot depend upon the government, but must build its own market. "The American Dairy association," he said, "is an organization of American dairy farmers, whose purpose is to advertise and merchandise dairy products more effectively, build good public relations in behalf of the industry and conduct research programs." If the dairyman is to get his share of the consumer dollar, he must, Warnick said, "somehow, some how, make the consumer aware of his products, Warnick stated.

He concluded with the admonition that the American Dairy association needs the support of every individual dairyman if it is to succeed in its program. Roy D. McCarthy Screams 'Blackmail'; Army Reports Pressures

WASHINGTON, March 12 (AP) — Senator McCarthy, R. Wis., cried "blackmail" today at an army report he and his chief counsel, Roy Cohn, applied pressure for special treatment. Four members of McCarthy's own permanent subcommittee investigations asked for an early meeting of the group to consider the report. And the Senate Republican leadership indicated a disposition — at least for the moment — to leave the matter in the subcommittee's hands.

The sequence of developments, following disclosure of the army report by Senate sources Thursday night, was this: 1. Senator Potter, R. Mich., a member of McCarthy's subcommittee, announced he had asked McCarthy to call a closed session of the group to go into "all the facts." 2. "Shocking Charges" — Potter said Cohn should be removed if he called the "shocking charges" against the 27-year-old committee counsel were true. The army report said Cohn had voiced threats that Army Secretary Robert T. Stevens would be "through" and the army "wrecked" if Pvt. G. David Schine were sent overseas. Schine, a soldier, was a committee consultant until he was drafted last fall.

And of all the men in the army, he said, his office found only 14 out of 100 have driver's licenses. The family car is the classroom of tomorrow's drivers he noted.

Buck also pointed out a soldier is three times safer in the army than on leave, one in 30 in the field being a serviceman.

The army safety engineer also hit hard at alcohol as a driving hazard, stating that one "outlet" of being slipped down a "cane" bottle by 12 per cent.
