

Seek Ways to Bar Power Plans

TWIN FALLS, June 22 (AP)—Democratic members from the Tennessee legislature admitted today they are working as to how to block the power contract between the Tennessee power commission and a private utility company.

Progress Reported by State
Engineer for District Roads

SEBASTIAN, June 22—Highway
work and construction about 1,200 feet in length
in the district, J. H. Cairns,
district highway engineer, reported
Tuesday.
Work temporarily was halted on
some jobs because of the weather
but now it being resumed. A stretch
of 10 1/2 miles of road between Elio-
shone and Gooding is being repaired.
oil surfaced and widened from 18 to
22 feet. The road will be open at all
times with short detours mapped for
some of the working hours.
A four-mile near line stretch of
road west of Gannett from highway
35 is getting an oil mat. Grading was
completed last fall.
The work at Gannett is a federal
aid secondary system with the coun-
ty and federal government cooperat-
ing in the project and the state
highway department doing the work.
Five and seven-tenths miles on
the interstate highway between Jer-
ome and Wendell probably will be
surfaced by July, Cairns said. Seal
coating was done on five and three-
tenths miles of highway 88 from the
Nevada line to Meteor. The grading
and oil mat was placed a year ago.
Other projects north of the Ne-
vada line include a seven
and one-tenths miles section now re-
ceiving the crushed rock surfacing
with the oil mat to be put on later.
That job should be completed in
July, Cairns said.
Work on curbs, sidewalks and road
surface is being done on highway
39 in the western part of Twin Falls.
Two bridges have been replaced with
fill and cutouts and final work
should be done by August, Cairns
estimated.
Grading has been completed and
the surface is being placed on a
seven and three-tenths mile section
east from Twin Falls to Hansen
bridge. The work also should be
completed in August.
In Minidoka county, a contract
has been let for building a new
bridge, the Montgomery bridge, east
of Rupert on highway 30. The bridge
will be 100 feet long and 30 feet
wide. It will be made of concrete.
