

### Japan Opens Operation of New Defense

TOKYO, July 2.—Japan formally has inaugurated its first post-war defense force, paving the way for the gradual withdrawal of American troops.

An air arm was added to the Japanese land and sea forces already in existence and the new military force was for the first time given the role of defending Japan against aggression from the outside.

For this purpose, the force will be strengthened from 120,000 men by the end of next March.

Mitsuda Field

A series of ceremonies and reviews yesterday marked the change at the headquarters of the defense force which replaced its "national safety agency" plan with a new organic defense agency.

American aid will provide nearly all the arms for the new force.

The 6th house of representatives has voted to approve the transfer of more than \$400,000,000 worth of military equipment to Japan.

5-Ripps available

The Japanese government announced sailors will be sent to the United States this fall to receive delivery of two 1,000-ton destroyers, the Elision and the Mecon.

The change in the structure of the Japanese force will enable the United States to withdraw its security forces gradually from Japan.

The first step was expected to be pulling out the U. S. 1st cavalry division from Japanese-occupied island of Hokkaido sometime this year.

### Reds May Use A-Atom Power Lead As Key Weapon for Cold War

WASHINGTON, July 2.—Russia might be able to use a lead in atomic industrial power development as a key weapon in the cold war between communism and the free world.

American atomic officials contemplated this proposal in a report which called for the construction of a nuclear power plant with a 5,000-kilowatt power output.

While there was no official confirmation of Wednesday's announcement by Moscow radio, there also was no disposition to deny that the Russians had succeeded in getting an atomic power plant into operation.

### Sandpoint to Get Huge New Plant

SANDPOINT, July 2.—Construction on a \$750,000 plant, to manufacture building boards from sawmill waste has begun.

The Pack River Lumber company is building the big plant just west of the present Dover bridge mill on the banks of the Pend Oreille river. The new unit should be in operation next summer.

About 80 men will be hired at start of the new operation with more employment expected when the plant is in regular production.

Approximately 50 tons of building board will be turned out a day. Saws and edgers, which normally go to the sawmill burner, as well as dead timber and tree tops will be used as raw material for the building product.
