Senate Demos Pledge Support For Specific McCarthy Charge

WASHINGTON, July 20—Infuriated senators today pledged support for a specific charge against Joseph P. McCarthy, that he had conspired to subvert the United States government.

McCarthy, who planned to introduce his charges against McCarthy in a Senate speech today, has agreed to wait until July 30 to introduce his promised resolution naming the Senate to condemn McCarthy's conduct.

The Democrats reported to have told McCarthy that if he wanted the Senate to approve his resolution, he would have to make some specific charge against McCarthy instead of a general statement.

An informed source said the Vermont Republican decided to postpone his showdown after several leading Democrats urged him to wait until Sen. John F. McClellan D. Ark. returned to Washington to join the fight.

However, Senate Republican leader William F. Knowland charged the delay tactic and urged the Democrats for Democratic action.

McCarthy's plan calls for establishment of a U. S. development agency that would own and control all atomic energy resources and materials from the raw material stage to the final phase of production and distribution. This would insure the use of atomic energy for peaceful purposes only.

NEW YORK, July 20—A live-foot snake that knew a good thing when it saw it put up a stiff struggle before being captured by a man in a conditioning unit in a Manhattan apartment.

The snake crawled inside the conditioning unit when Officer Thomas Morton sought to capture it with a pole.

Dworshak Is Hit On Jobless Issue

ARCO, July 20—Former Sen. Otis H. Taylor said in Arco yesterday that Henry W. Dworshak was hiding in Washington, D. C. while 250 employees of the naval ordnance plant in Rockville lost their jobs.

Taylor, candidate for the Democratic nomination for U. S. senator, said that while the employees were leaving their jobs, Dworshak stood by and let the Eisenhower administration create a new federal judge for Idaho with its corresponding half dozen political pork barrel jobs.

He said that although Dworshak had had publicly recognized his support for the Eisenhower administration, he did not have the courage of his convictions when the time came to block the appointment.

French Think American Plan For Atom Control Is Obsolete

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., July 20—France, split away from her western allies today on the value of the American plan for control of atomic energy resources and materials.

The French viewed the U. S. endorsed Baruch blueprint as obsolete as the 12-nation U. N. disarmament commission called a meeting to receive the report of two month fruitless discussions on disarmament in London by a five-nation subcommittee.

A full-dress debate was expected, with delegates attempting to get some degree of agreement on which to report to the general assembly when it meets Sept. 21.

French Delegate Jules Moch, recognized authority on disarmament questions, indicated the unlikelihood of such an agreement yesterday on his arrival in New York from Paris.

"I think all old plans are a little obsolete when you wait until a stock of A-bombs has been built up and easily camouflaged," Moch said. "It is difficult to control the atom. The future may be easier, but the longer we wait, the less confidence we have in the old plan and the true of all the old plans, not only the Baruch plan."

The general assembly has endorsed the Baruch plan three times, but Russia has opposed it on the grounds that it infringes on national sovereignty.






