**Allies Are Keeping Iranian Oil Out of Reds' Hands but New Dangers Arise**

NEW YORK, Aug. 10—The victory of the United States and its allies are keeping Iranian oil out of the hands of the Russians.

The price: The headache of trying to ease a new flow of oil into a world already glutted with oil.

World demand has increased by one-fourth in the three years. But capacity to produce oil has increased even more. Production has had to be cut back. There is no real need for Iran's oil now—in the non-communist world. But Russia could use it.

Russia and its satellites have increased their oil output by 25 per cent since pre-World War II days. But in the same 15 years the United States alone has doubled its oil output, and is estimated to have seven times the productive capacity of the Soviets.

In wartime that would be all important—Russia's oil lack is considered one of the best insurance against its starting World War III at this time.

The American, English, French and Dutch oil companies that have banded together to peddle Iran's oil and oil products hope that the steadily rising world oil demand will ease their task.

### Ike Hopes for Solution Over Enemy Assets

WASHINGTON, Aug. 10 (AP)—President Eisenhower has informed West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer that the assets of enemy companies in congress to return about \$500,000,000 worth of German assets seized during World War II. But Mr. Eisenhower said he still hopes a solution can be found.

A bill to return the property to its original German owners was reported recently by the assets of enemy companies. Similar bills are before the house.

The White House stressed the fact that the solution of this complex problem lies with the congress. Several bills dealing with the subject are now pending before members of my cabinet and other government officials have expressed their views. None of the measures thus far proposed has the approval of my administration, but you may be assured that I am giving the subject the most careful consideration and it is my hope that a fair, equitable and satisfactory solution can be arrived at.

### Ike Takes Cruise For 3 Youngsters

WASHINGTON, Aug. 10 (AP)—A smiling President Eisenhower last night led ashore his three sleep-eyed but happy grandchildren—one of them clad in a night gown and robe—after a 4½-hour cruise on the Potomac river.

The trip fulfilled a promise the President made to the children when they arrived for a White House visit a few weeks ago.

When the navy cabin cruiser pulled into the naval gun factory here at 10 p.m. (EDT), 6-year-old David and the President were seated side by side far up in the bow of the vessel.

David walked over the gangplank with his grandfather and his 3-year-old sister, Barbara Anne, walked to a waiting car wearing a nightgown and a baby's blanket, was carried ashore by a maid.

### Proposals to Assist Japan OK'd by Ike

WASHINGTON, Aug. 10 (AP)—President Eisenhower is reported to have approved a decision to negotiate a long-cutting agreement with the Japanese government in a move to prop up Japan's ailing economy. At the same time, it is reported to have okayed a plan to sell surplus American farm products to Japan at a bargain price.

Informed officials who disclosed this said the two steps represented a long-range plan by the government to prevent a Japanese economic collapse which might play into communist hands.

Eisenhower and his cabinet discussed Japan's worsening financial position at a White House meeting last week, it was said, and the move to negotiate a formal trade agreement with Japan was sanctioned then.

Surprisingly little opposition to the idea was encountered. Informants also were told that it was realized high tariff advocates and protectionists would be sure to voice their threat to American industry and employment.

The President and his top advisers are reported to believe, they said, that the American market must be opened more to Japanese goods to check a trade slump which has reduced Japan's available income to less than 400 million dollars. Further losses face Japan in the immediate future, it was noted, partly because the defense department has cut back expenditures in Japan now that the Korean war has ended and the production of arms sold to Indochina slowed down.

### New York Not Safe for Night Walker Because of Its Crime

NEW YORK, Aug. 10 (Central)—New York is a lovely place to stroll on a summer night. Only you don't dare go there. You might get your head cracked open.

Times square may be the glittering "crossroads of the world" but it is infested with peddlers and pickpockets, juvenile bullies and lusty plain bums.

Proud New Yorkers, who tittle-tattle they live in the most glamorous spot in the world, have been given some more than the head of their police department—Their fair city is close to becoming a lawless jungle.

It is a city where one murder is committed every 24 hours, where more than 50 women have been raped in streets, parks, alleys and public places since the first of the year.

Murder, rape and other felonies are running 11 per cent higher this year than last. Police investigate an average of three rape cases a day, 27 cases of assault and 40 cases of robbery.

There already are 18,815 men and women on the police force, equivalent to the whole population of Ypsilanti, Mich. It costs \$140,000,000 a year to man the 123 precincts which represent law and order to 6,000,000 people.

But still, no city park is considered safe after dark. The sidewalks are haunted by muggers, holdup men and purse snatchers.

Annual Times square women stunts to subway entrances through a scrimmage line of loitering punks.

In an effort to clean up the Times square section, police in a recent seven-day period arrested more than 250 persons in an area 18 blocks long and two blocks wide.

They were charged with vagrancy, loitering, disorderly conduct, using loud and boisterous language, annoying passers-by and blocking the sidewalk. Some of them also turned out to be drug addicts, prostitutes and draft dodgers.

Police have assigned extra detectives and foot patrolmen to Central park in an effort to cut down "mugging." This is a favorite technique of the petty thief, and involves a stranglehold from behind, a rifting

of the pockets and a general beating-up.

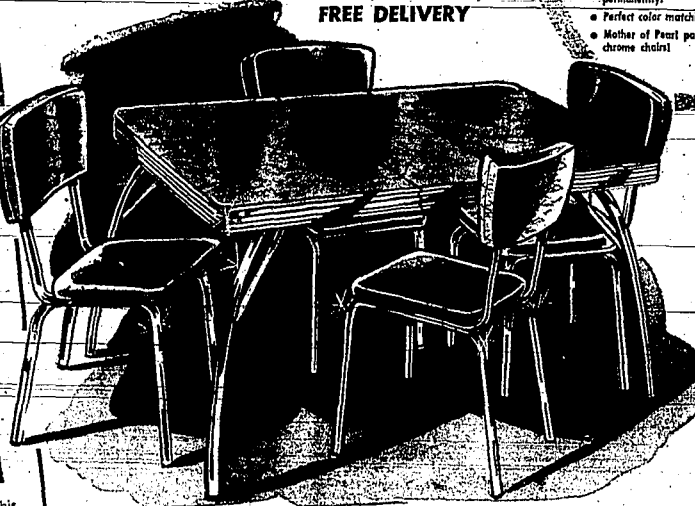

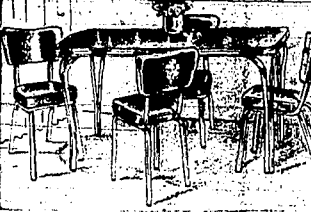

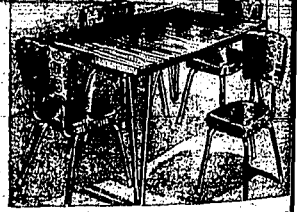
