President's Report Is Called Another Nudge for Business

—NEW YORK, Aug. 16 (AP)—Another nudge is being given to business. This time it's presidential.

The President, in his mid-year report on the state of the economy, set out to allay any remaining fears that the slump hasn't yet run its course, and to build up confidence of businessmen and consumers that the months ahead will be brighter.

This confidence—according to the theory of the psychological nudges—should lead consumers to go ahead with plans to buy things they want, once they get over worrying lest their incomes might fall. It should lead industrial and trade manage-ments to go ahead with plans to ex-pand, to place orders for future delivery.

Businessmen realize there are political implications in many eco-nomic discussions these days. They see the political hay that can be made out of saying "business is bad," and the political advantage to say-ing "business is solid."

But businessmen must plan ahead—want to do that they must discuss present conditions and future prob-lem's mid-year economics report abilities, and they'll give the Presi-dent's scrutiny.

The statistics at mid-year, many businessmen note, add up pretty much to a picture of stability. For some time now there has been little change in many of the key factors in the economy—they haven't fallen very much; neither have they gained very much.

Employment has remained high. The rise in unemployment leveled off in the early months of the year, and the total of the jobs has risen only a little since then.

Total income from wages and salaries is below the peak of just a year ago. But it hasn't changed noticeably since February.

Consumer buying is off in some lines—particularly in the "big ticket" durable goods. And new installation loans aren't being taken out as fast as last year. But retail sales in general are holding remarkably steady.

Merrill Holbrook, vocational agriculture; Herlin Holte, mathematics and foot-ball coach; and Loy Linder, biology and basketball coach.

Upon their return to classes, stu-dents of both the grade school and high school will find the building redecorated and renovated. They also will begin using the new air-conditioning building for the first time since its completion.

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Foreclosures Ordered Against 39 Housing-Project Mortgages

WASHINGTON, Aug. 16 (AP)—The government has ordered foreclosure proceedings against 39 federally-insured housing projects since Jan. 1, 1962.

Many of them were built under the government's scandal-ridden apartment construction program called "windfall" profits.

Sen. Harry P. Byrd, D. Va., who first brought the tactics to the public's attention, criticized the justice department for not having obtained any indictments or convictions. There is considerable controversy as to whether the "windfall" profits were legal or not.

A number of FHA officials have claimed or been fired or suspended since the scandals first came to light.

The biggest mortgage being fore-closed is one for \$2,000,000 on the Gregory estates (sections 1-4) in Prince Georges county, Md. Second

largest is one for \$2,000,000 on Du-mont, Inc., Shreveport, La. There were 12 others for more than \$1,000,000.

Louisiana had the largest number of foreclosures with nine. The other states, and the number of fore-closures: Florida, 2; South Carolina, 2; New Jersey, 2; and one each for Ariz-ona, California, Illinois, Kansas, New York, Maryland, Oklahoma and Vermont. Puerto Rico has eight and Alaska two.

City Jolted

TAIPEI, Formosa, Aug. 16 (AP)—A strong earthquake shook Taipei early today and sent office workers scurrying into downtown streets. There were no casualties and little damage.

The first earth shock lasted for 20 seconds and was followed by another of shorter duration.

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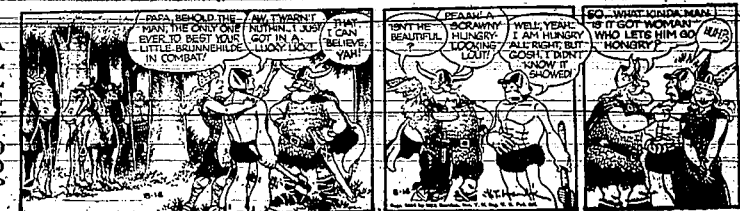
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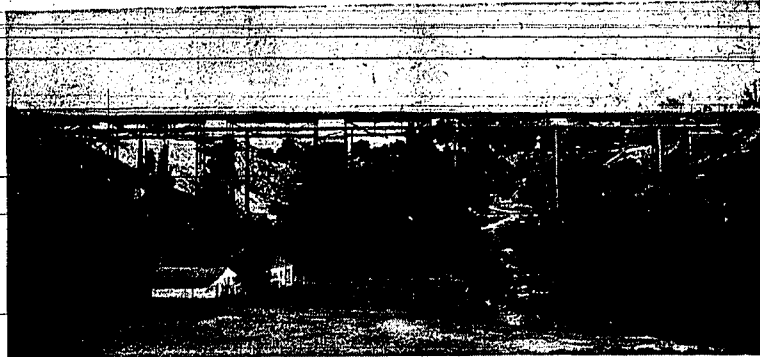
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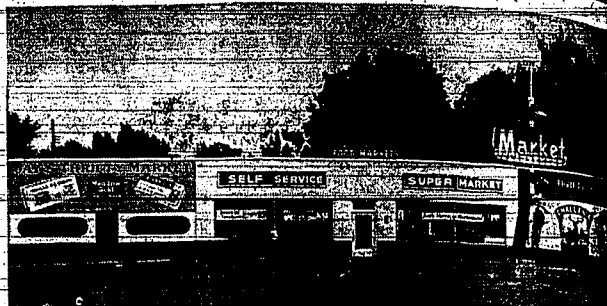


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
