WHO'S CONFUSED?

Senator Jenner, of Idaho, recently came out with one of the "left-wing" speeches on the Senate floor. In one breath he said a "left-wing collectivist elite" still holds power within the government, and in another he said he could not ask for a "better defense" than President Eisenhower's defense.

The old senate the left-wing clique is composed of holdovers from previous administrations. He said these people have developed an "inner steering group" which is free of control by congress, the President and the courts. He said:

"The American people are being misled by military and political skill in manipulating laws, directives, committees, conference reports, and briefing sessions."

Now Jenner's internal security committee put out a voluminous report on communist infiltration which used language like that. In this new speech the senator is not talking of the past, but the present.

He is saying that this group of "left-wing elite" exists today in government, and is so powerful that nobody can do anything about it.

Certainly few men would be so rash as to argue there are no communists, no subversives, no moderate left-wingers anywhere in government today. To assume that would be to suggest, on the one hand, that our country is not only successful and on the other that there is not much range of political opinion in America.

Yet it is something else to state flatly that these people "dominate" American policy. That is something which cannot simply be assumed but must be proved. Jenner has offered no shadow of proof. Furthermore, he has no names. Who are these dangerous, powerful holdovers?

If Jenner can name them, and if they have the power he contends, how then can he have confidence in Mr. Eisenhower and his team?

For the import of his charges is that the "left-wing elite" has stolen power from everybody, including the President. A chief executive and an administration which allowed this to happen could hardly be deserving of the respect, either from congress or the American people.

Actually, the senator's praise of the Eisenhower team is a left-handed compliment, since he can hardly believe it is anybody's business but his to prove Jenner has offered no shadow of proof. Furthermore, he has no names. Who are these dangerous, powerful holdovers?

But unless Jenner turns up some evidence to support his charges, neither Mr. Eisenhower nor anyone else is likely to pay any attention to them. Strong words merely sound silly when nothing is offered to back them up.

U.S. AND FORMOSA

Three events of recent days have put Formosa back in the news.

Premier Chou En-lai of Red China said his government soon would seize the island. President Eisenhower flatly warned that invading China would find the U. S. Seventh fleet bearing the brunt.

And the British declared they would not suffer Formosa to be included in any south-east Asia defense alliance.

None of these happenings can be classified as startling, but they do raise the question of basic facts about Formosa and our relation to it.

First, with its Nationalist Chinese government, the island is a sharp thorn in Red China's side. So long as it exists in hostile hands, the communists can never quite relax the defense of their mainland coast. Nor can they wipe out the political menace of a rival regime.

Second, the island is a strategic base. Should the Chinese ever be able to take it, it would be a great asset to the communists. It is a question of time when the U. S. fleet blocks their way.

The British made their particular pronouncement because they have recognized that Red China and the communists are in the position of defending a rival government. It is viewed as diplomatically inconsistent.

Many Wetbacks' Bodies Are Found in Muddy Rio Grande

EDMUNDS, Tex., Aug. 24.—Since the first of the year 1934 bodies have been washed ashore near here along the muddy Rio Grande. They were bodies of men who had been buried in unmarked graves.

They are the bodies of "wetbacks" who didn't make it across the river of death.

"It's a scandal," said Frank Perez, Harlingen, who is well known in south Texas for his charity work among itinerant Mexican workers. "We of the border country are so accustomed to hearing of the drownings we have become hardened."

Thousands of Mexicans swim or ford the Rio Grande monthly, often seeking farm jobs illegally in the United States. Most of them are rounded up by U. S. authorities and shipped back home.

But a percentage—the exact figure isn't known—die along the way. Their unmarked bodies are filling up "potter's fields" cemeteries in dozens of communities in the valley where the Rio Grande draws a meandering border between the United States and Mexico.

"There's never any way to let their families know," Perez said. "No one ever knows who they are or where they came from."

Sheriff W. E. Vickers of Hidalgo county, where 30 "wetback" deaths were recorded in the first six months of this year, said many of the bodies washed up were unclothed. Others were clad only in shoes. Usually there were no papers in the pockets that would help identify the victim.

The torrential flood that swept down the Rio Grande last June left a death toll of eight. This is only a fraction of the number of lives lost every year in the "wetback" migration.

Perez said many "wetbacks" drown by slipping into deep water when they are trying to wade across the river. But others are victims of "bandits."

There are illegal Mexican boatmen who take them across the river.

Ike Won Three of His Big Foreign Aid Fights With Congress and Lost Fourth

WASHINGTON, Aug. 24.—President Eisenhower won three of his big foreign aid battles with Congress. He lost a fourth, which may hamper severely his policies for tightening U. S. relations with allied countries. Here is the record:

1. Foreign trade. Eisenhower's major setback. Congress balked at the President's program for lowering tariffs to encourage allied and friendly nations to trade with the United States. Eisenhower succeeded in getting mainly a simple extension for one year of his bill to negotiate tariff-cutting trade treaties with friendly nations.

2. Diplomats attached great significance to the record in this issue because American foreign aid programs, aside from military, are rapidly coming to an end and other countries are wary of what might happen if the aid programs were terminated.

3. Foreign aid. Congress voted a total of \$2,761,000,000 for the current 12-month period—it was around 100 million dollars less than the nearly \$3 billion requested by the President.

Administration officials indicated the cuts were not crippling, however, and would not be interpreted by foreign governments as evidence that the United States was withdrawing into a shell. Other governments constantly look to congressional action for evidence as to whether the legislators are on the whole supporting the President's program of partnership with friendly countries.

4. Atomic. The President registered his greatest victory on this issue. He gained authority, although not all he asked, to transfer to America's allies in Europe secret information about the effects of atomic weapons and such information as
