PARIS, Aug. 30 (AP)—The French national assembly voted today to kill the European defense community (EDC) treaty which would have included 500,000 Germans in an European army, unofficial returns of the balloting showed. Death of EDC, on which both the United States and Britain believed the future of western Europe could depend, came on a technical motion which called for a discussion of the controversial pact.
