2 Letters Are Written From Prison Camp

WASHINGTON, Oct. 1. (AP)—Mrs. Esther Clatterman Waller, sister of Noel and Herta, and wife of an American, has written letters to her two children in the Soviet prison camp at Vorkuta in Russian Siberia near the Arctic circle, it was learned yesterday.

The letters were received by her husband and two children here in the Washington area. She also has sent word through two former women prisoners released from the same camp that she is being held on charges. Officials and relatives, who prefer to remain anonymous, called these charges "ridiculous."

Acting on Mrs. Waller's first letter in March, the state department sent a note to Russia asking for further information regarding her welfare. This note never was published before it was delivered to the Soviet foreign office in mid-August by the American embassy in Moscow.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 1. (AP)—Former Air Force Secretary Thomas C. Spier says that Russia will have enough atomic bombs and air power by 1949 to destroy our cities and industries in a "military attack."

Congress OK To Be Asked On Indochina

WASHINGTON, Oct. 1. (AP)—State department officials said yesterday they will ask congressional approval of a plan to pay for French expeditionary forces in Indochina at the earliest possible moment.

Officials said they probably will submit the request to Congress immediately after the November elections rather than wait until Congress reconvenes in January. They said the leaders can grant the kind of approval requested to go ahead with the plan.

The United States and France announced in a joint statement yesterday that France is ready to keep its expeditionary forces in Indochina and the United States will consider footing the bill. The agreement was reached after three days of urgent talks on the question of U.S. assistance to French forces in Indochina.

Congress has approved funds to support these forces but they were appropriated to help France fight the war. Since the fighting has ended, the state department feels it is morally obligated to discuss use of these funds with Congress before spending the support money in peacetime.

Appeal Made for Keeping Russians In United Nations

POCAHONTAS, Oct. 1. (AP)—The nation's former first lady appealed to Americans last night to help keep this country in the United Nations without trying to oust the Russians.

Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt, 71-year-old wife of the late President Franklin D. Roosevelt, told a group of party. Both parties ask in favor of it.

She said support of the United Nations is essential because "in the history of the world, no other organization has done so much for peace."

It is better to keep the Soviet Union in the U. N. as added, because "the way the world knows what the Russians are saying."
