C., Oct. 15 (AP)—Hurricane Hazel, still packing winds of 100 miles an hour, smashed its way northward through eastern North Carolina Friday after wreaking havoc along 120 miles of the Carolinas' coastline. There were no immediate reports of serious casualties among the well-warned residents of the coast. Most of them sought safer quarters. A few minor injuries were reported from falling debris. Countries Rush Aid

To Devastated Haiti

PORT AU PRINCE, Haiti, Oct. 15 (AP)—The United States, Britain and several Caribbean countries pushed big scale relief operations in southwestern Haiti today in the wake of Hurricane Hazel's terror.

Adm. Edmund B. Taylor, in charge of the U. S. emergency aid program, described the situation as desperate in some parts of the island's ravaged southwestern peninsula. The most immediate need was for food, pure drinking water, and medical supplies for inoc-
