**Security Risk Plan Is Blow To Scientists**  
 WASHINGTON, Oct. 19—Dr. D. D. Hoopes, president of the Carnegie Institution, has told Congress the government's security program has wrecked the morale of scientists and slowed development of new weapons.  
 Hoopes, who is head of the office of scientific research and development, made the statement in testimony before a House government security subcommittee last week.  
 Hoopes said the security system "has made it impossible to accomplish anything in this atmosphere."  
 He said he recently met a member of a scientific committee which is the national security council and was told, "well, we are practically stopped working; it is quite impossible to accomplish anything in this atmosphere."  
 "That is the sort of reaction I would get out of three out of four scientists today," he said. "They go on working but they feel that they are not welcome and they are regarded with suspicion."  
 Hoopes said the present security program has "almost destroyed" the morale of scientists.

**Russia Seeks to Condemn U. S. As Red China's Top Aggressor**  
 UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., Oct. 19—Russia sought today to condemn the United States as an aggressor against red China.  
 The Soviet charge was scheduled to receive its first formal consideration when the United Nations general assembly's 19-country hearing committee meets this afternoon to decide whether to put it on the agenda for debate.  
 Ambassador Henry Cabot Lodge, Jr., chief U. S. delegate, was expected to argue that the charge is unfounded.  
 But if the United States follows past policy, it will vote to include it on the general assembly's agenda in order to expose the Soviet charge in public debate.  
 Lodge has contended himself previously by denouncing as "a plain lie" the Soviet accusation that the United States has used the island of Quemoy as a base for aggression.  
 The Soviet charge, based on a communist propaganda blast called to the United Nations last week, reads:  
 1. That the United States "forcibly seized" Formosa and still holds it under military control.  
 2. That acts of aggression against the Chinese coast and islands off it in apparent reference to attacks on Nationalist-held Quemoy island and resultant Nationalist bombardments of the mainland are committed with increasing frequency by armed forces controlled by the U. S. seventh fleet.  
 3. That U. S. naval vessels and aircraft are "participating directly in acts of aggression" against red China.  
 4. That Nationalist Chinese are being "provoked" against merchant vessels of many nations.  
 5. That the United States is conducting the "Korean war" as "a

 Nehru said "my desire to retire from public office came from a feeling of staleness which is almost intolerable if one has to function like a machine."  
 "I do not like this staleness and effort comes in the way of really effective work and creative thought which are so necessary for one who has to function in a highly responsible position," Nehru said.

Of 25 hunters checked over the weekend, Blake said the average was over two ducks per man. On the average it took the hunters about an hour to bag each duck, he added.

There was a fair abundance of ducks along the northside canal and Wilson reservoir, Blake reported. Over 90 per cent of the ducks killed were mallards.

On the Little Wood river and Silver creek the number of ducks reported was better than average.

There has been some misanderstanding as to what to do with duck stamps. Blake said hunters are to write their name on the duck stamp, but the stamp does not have to be stuck to the hunters. Hunters losing their duck stamp must purchase another, he added.
