Benson Sees Big Gains for U.S. Farmers

CLARKMONT, Calif., Nov. 1 (AP)—Secretary of Agriculture Ezra Taft Benson said Saturday "I strongly believe we are on the threshold of agriculture's most thrilling period—a profitable period for farmers to realize the opportunities of today and tomorrow."

In a speech delivered before farm and cooperative organizations at Sonoma college he said some economists suggest that the average farmer can increase his net income 25 per cent. Others, he said, say 50 per cent or more.

"But there's an if—if he uses all the new tools and techniques... if he uses the better breeds, better seeds and better feeds now available," Benson added.
