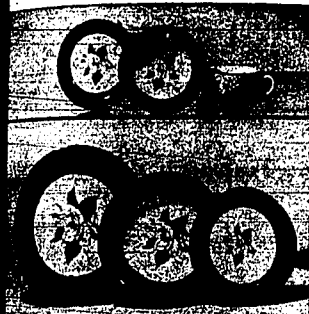

# Stores Slash Tags on Toys In New York

NEW YORK, Dec. 1 (AP)—Major department stores are meeting discount houses head-on in a Christmas battle royal, it was learned yesterday by cutting toy prices to meet competition.

Department stores, determined to meet "bootleggers" in the toy field have taken to advertising standard fair-traded merchandise at prices below list. Featured prominently in the ads are the sale price and the manufacturer's list price.

Some of New York's major stores—Macy's, Gimbels, Abraham and Straus, Gert's—are aggressively pushing the new cut-price policy.

Not in the practice confined to New York, Melvin Freud, president of the Toy Guidance Council, said the practice is widespread throughout the country wherever discount houses flourish.

Many bootlegged toys are thought to be sold at prices 50 to 75 percent below list.

Department store executives say they are forced to cut top prices to meet competition because the Christmas toy season is so short. By far the bulk of the toy business is done in the period between Thanksgiving and Christmas.

A spokesman for the department stores said there are hundreds of discount houses in the metropolitan area, and many of the major toy lines showed up in these discount house stacks.

If the manufacturer cannot protect his line from price bootleggers, the spokesman said, it is not up to the department stores to take losses.

Toy departments are more important to some department stores than others. Macy's boasts it has the largest toy department in the world. In line with its policy of meeting competition on any merchandise, Macy's said it has determined not to be outplayed in the toy field.

# Clay Trims Ike's Large Road Plan

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 1 (AP)—Gen. Lucius D. Clay yesterday trimmed President Eisenhower's \$10 billion dollar "pay-as-you-go" roadbuilding program to what was "debatable but not preposterous."

Instead, Clay proposed a \$5 billion project over the same period of 10 years to be financed over a period of 30 years through revenue bonds.

Clay, chairman of the President's advisory committee on a national highway program, originally recommended the \$10 billion dollar program which the President backed.

He said the program had not talked with the President about the new program. He anticipated the latest proposal "bearing further consideration" will be ready for congressional consideration in January.

Clay outlined the details of the plan in a speech before the American Municipal Association conference.

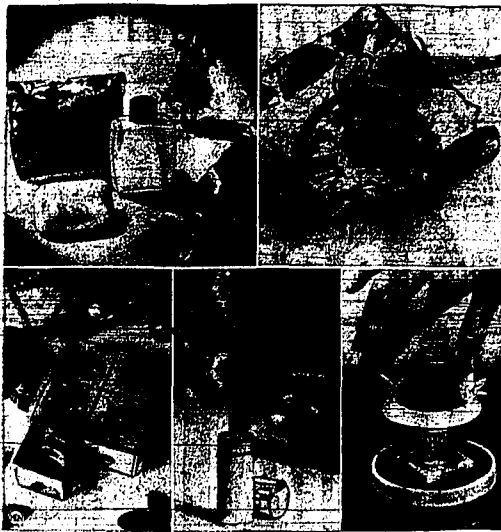

# Man in Boise Files Divorce

GOODING, Dec. 1 — Irene Pauline Wilson was named defendant in a divorce action filed in district court Saturday by Warren Hutto Wilson.

He also asks that the costs of the divorce be paid by the defendant, and a reasonable sum for the support of the children. Judge Hutto, senior, is his attorney.

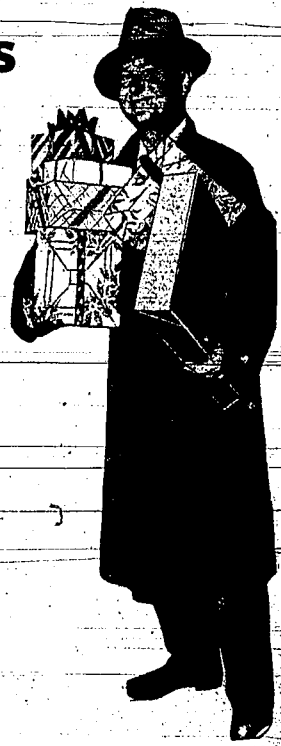

# Canada Pilot Freedom May Help 4 Yanks

TOKYO, Dec. 9.—United States air force officials speculated yesterday that the Chinese communist decision to release a Canadian pilot shot down in the Korean war might mean four American airmen also will be freed.

The release originally refused to return squadron leader Andy McKenna, Montreal, in the Korean war, "the switch" because they said his plane landed in China and he was not considered a prisoner of war.

At least four American air force officers have been held on the same grounds.

"Why should they release a Canadian and hang on to the Americans?" one U. S. air force officer asked.

However, hope for the release of the four Americans was increased by the releasing of 13 other Americans held in the same way. The Chinese had been told that seven of them were members of a U. S. air force B-29 crew.

It hardly seems conceivable that the release would require 11 air force members and then turn around and release four more. But we can hope," another officer said.

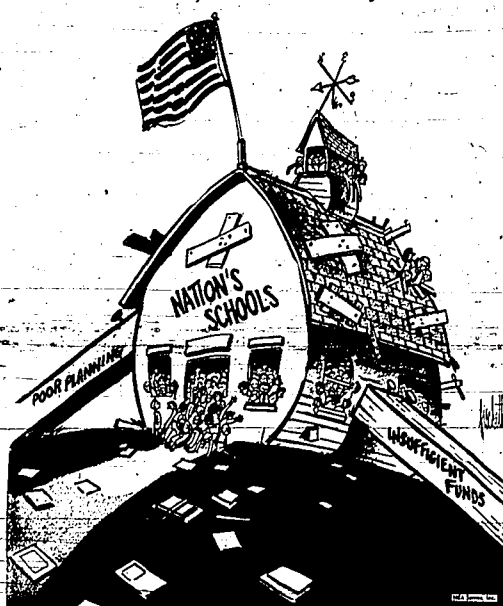

# Japan Offers Leniency Now To GI Crimes

TOKYO, Dec. 1 (AP)—American servicemen accused of crimes in Japan have a better chance to escape punishment in Japanese courts than they would in the United States, statistics showed today.

Some American officials feared that Japan would indulge in wholesale amnesties and leniency when Japan gained jurisdiction in October, 1953, over servicemen for crimes committed off a military post.

But Japanese authorities make every effort to be fair to servicemen accused of crimes in Japan. Judges, prosecutors and justice ministry officials are extremely careful.

If there is the slightest doubt of a man's guilt the policy is to drop the case.

Every man brought to court has been convicted, but sentences have been comparatively light. The rape-murder of a 20-year-old woman brought five years; robbery-murder 15 years; rape, four years; hit and run driving while drunk, one-year; negligent driving resulting in death, five months, suspended.

The 15-year sentence for robbery-murder was the heaviest imposed.

In the first year of jurisdiction, 445 alleged offenses by Americans were reported to the Japanese justice ministry, most of them traffic accidents. Out of the 445 cases there were 96 indictments, while 21 cases were disposed of by summary courts with light fines.

# Free Status Set In South Africa

PRETORIA, Dec. 1 (AP)—J. G. Strijdom, South Africa's new prime minister, declared last night that under his leadership the dominion will secede from the British commonwealth and become an independent republic.

"Nothing can stand in the way of our achieving a republic," Strijdom told some 2,000 cheering supporters in a hall where the only flag on view was that of the long-defunct Transvaal republic.

"I wish to assure the English, the (Dutch-descended) Afrikaners and the non-European that no one will be victimized when that ideal is realized."

HAVANA, Dec. 1 (AP)—Quick action by guards at the late of 19th century broke up one of history's first attempts at an airborne prison break, police said today.

Cesar A. Fuentes drew a light plane over from Florida yesterday in an attempt to rescue his brother-in-law, Rafael Rodriguez Diaz, who is serving a 30-year term for bank robbery.

Fuentes landed alongside a field where Rodriguez was playing basketball with the prison team. The convict, sprinted for the plane, but guards won the race. Today, both brothers-in-law are inmates of the prison.

# New Industrial Revolution, Sparked By Electronics, Said to Be on Way

By RAM DAWSON  
NEW YORK, Dec. 1 (AP)—Gen. Douglas MacArthur sees a new industrial revolution under way—thanks to electronics.

But some labor leaders aren't so sure they're thankful.

The chairman of the board of Remington Rand, Inc., in announcing recently that his firm will have a new "electronic brain" ready for delivery next year, said:

"The remarkable developments in electronics over the past few years have effected a revolution in business methods and procedures comparable to the industrial revolution two centuries ago."

"The business world is moving into a new phase of data handling and management control through the use of high-speed, time-saving devices."

"There will be further developments and refinements, but the basic groundwork has been laid for achieving goals in business and industrial administration and control undreamed of a decade ago."

Up at Columbia University, meanwhile, International Business Machines is ready to take the wraps off a new machine it calls the most powerful and fastest electronic computing machine yet devised.

IBM has been perfecting the new computer at Columbia's Watson laboratory for the naval bureau of ordnance. It is called the naval research calculator and so far is designed only for naval use. Details of the new machine's accomplishments will be announced within a few days.

Remington-Rand's forthcoming Univac file-computer will be a sort of kid brother to the Univac that became a household word after the recent election. It will complete a range of their electronic brains for the million-dollar Univac system.

There are to be Univac-100 and Univac-1100 priced around \$75,000.

The new intermediate Univac will have a storage memory that will hold up to 1,000,000 alphanumeric characters. The computer says the machine will be able to use those characters in sequence without reference to any physical number of letters.

Sixty Univac systems have been installed or are being installed for use of corporations, operating in the fields of land chemicals, electrical machinery, auto makers, life insurance companies and railroads.

Six of the Univac scientific brains designed to solve technical problems in geophysics and the like, also are in use.

Seventy more of the two big types are to be delivered when available.

These are the electronic devices which MacArthur sees as revolutionizing business management practices. It is part of a major trend toward automation in factories and offices that is being watched closely now by both management and labor.

Walter Reuther, president of the United Automobile Workers of America (UAW), has served notice that automation is going to be a discussion point in future union contracts. In a statement, prepared for the union, he said:

"Workers must be provided with employment and income security so that the nation can meet these revolutionary possibilities with a minimum of disruption and hardship."

"Because of the extreme change in factory methods caused by automation, existing classifications and wage structures are becoming obsolete."

CHICAGO, Dec. 1.—For a merrier Christmas, drive with reason during the holiday season.

This appeal was made to motorists today by the National Safety Council as it opened its annual Christmas-safety campaign.

The Christmas-New Year holiday season is the most hazardous period of the year, according to the council. Twice as many persons are killed in traffic accidents at this time as on the same days of the preceding two weeks.
