General Motors Sets Stock Sales

NEW YORK, Jan. 4 (AP)—General Motors corporation, which has spent more than two billion dollars in the past six years for expansion, plans to raise 25 million dollars through the sale of common stock for further growth.

The world's largest auto maker said part of the additional capital funds will be used to restore working capital depleted by the huge postwar spending program.

General Motors president and Alfred P. Sloan, Jr., chairman, said in a joint statement after the close of the market yesterday that the new funds are needed to enable production facilities to keep pace with the continued demand for the company's products.

GM's stock was the most active of the market yesterday. A total of 654,000 shares changed hands. It closed at \$105.10, a gain of \$1.22 a share.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 4 (AP)—The anti-Semitism of the Communists behind their iron curtain and their efforts to wipe out Jewish culture is painted in grisly colors in a report by a special house committee which has studied the communists' performance in many directions for more than a year.

In its conclusions, the report from the nine-man group headed by Representative Keenan says: "The communist attitude toward the Jews was not substantially revised after Stalin's death. Only its forms were modified: Anti-Semitic drives are now less publicized and better concealed from the free world."

The committee reports in 1951 there were 231 Jewish schools with 48,872 students in the Ukraine, and 267 Jewish schools with 31,740 students in Byelo-Russia. Not one remains anywhere in the Soviet Union today.

Rules Change

Affects Area's Wheat Crops

An amendment passed by the 34th congress to the agricultural adjustment act of 1938 affecting wheat acreage allotments voluntarily released to the Twin Falls county commission is announced here Tuesday by Lloyd B. Jones, ABC chairman.

The amendment, public law 600, approved last Aug. 24, provides that:

"Any part of the 1955 farm wheat acreage allotment on which wheat will not be planted and which is voluntarily surrendered to the county shall be deducted from the allotment to such farm and may be reapportioned by the county committee to other farms in the county receiving allotments in amounts determined by the county committee to be fair and equitable on the basis of past acreage of wheat, tillable acre, crop rotation practices, type of soil and topography."

"Any allotment transferred under this provision shall be regarded as having been planted on the farm which transferred rather than on the farm to which transferred, except that this shall not operate to make the farm from which the allotment was transferred eligible for an allotment as having wheat planted there during the three-year base period."

The purpose of the amendment, Jones said, is "to provide for the release and reapportionment of unused 1955 farm wheat acreage allotments which are voluntarily released to the county committee."

Forms for reallocation of allotments are available in the county ABC office.
