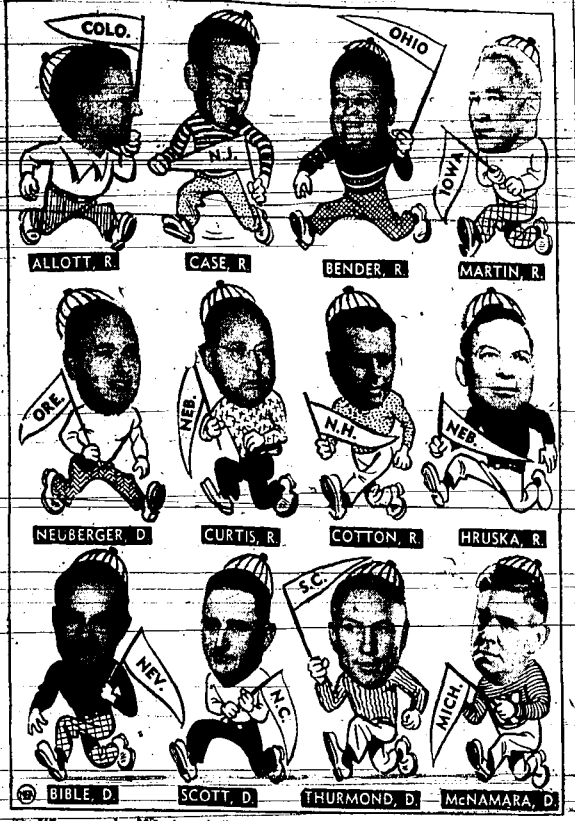

Problems for Growers Are Parley Topic

BURLEY, Jan. 11—The political problems of legislative action to increase the beet sugar production quota were explained by J. E. Bowen today to fellow members at the annual meeting of the Cassia County Beetgrowers association here.

Bowen said sugar consumption estimates for the coming year are made each November by the U. S. Department of Agriculture. They are aimed at stabilizing the market and insuring a fair price for both producers and consumers. Beet and cane sugar areas in the United States and possessions will produce about 85 per cent of the estimated 2,200,000 tons of sugar to be consumed in this country in 1955. Nearly all of the remainder will come from the nation's largest foreign supplier.

Any variables in 1955 consumption will affect foreign suppliers only since quotas for domestic producers are rigidly fixed. Sugar beet growers would like to see the law amended so that any increase in consumption would permit their production quota to expand, he said.

Bowen said sugar beet growers exceeded their quota last year by approximately 150,000 tons of produced sugar. Bowen said it is necessary to resort to regulation of sugar beet acreage for 1955. Idaho's acreage will be cut from approximately 93,000 acres in 1954 to 70,000 acres in 1955, a 14 per cent reduction.

The difficult problem of allocating Idaho's acreage will fall to the state agricultural and stabilization production office, Bowen said. Adversely affected growers in the production area are expected to aid the state in administering the program. Farmers intending to raise their quota must file a request for acreage and their past beet production history will be considered in fixing individual quotas.

One per cent of the state's quota is being reserved for new producers. Bowen said present controls on sugar production stem from the federal sugar act of 1934, which is scheduled to expire Dec. 31, 1956. He added that efforts by interested legislators in the state legislature to raise domestic sugar beet quotas are sure to be continued in the 84th congress.

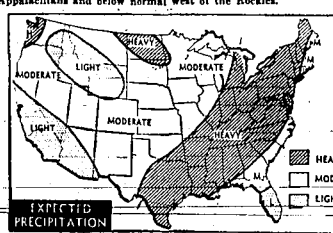
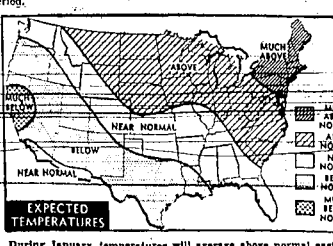

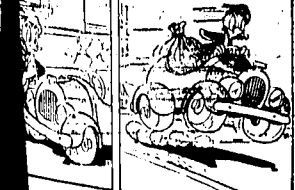
