### Pork Cuts Set As Good Buys In Food Marts

**By The Associated Press**  
The emphasis will be on pork cuts by the nation's food stores this week-end. Prices are lower because of heavy marketing of hogs. Many stores will be offering specials on pork loins, pork chops, fresh hams and smoked picnic. In some cases, loin prices will be trimmed 5 cents a pound below a week ago.  
"Housewives looking for good food buys will want to plan on frequent servings of various pork cuts in January meals," comments the U. S. department of agriculture. "Pork roasts and chops, ham, bacon, sausage and spareribs point the way to menu variety at reasonable prices."

### Goat Got

A goat which had a flair for wandering was dead today because he wandered too far and too fast... or perhaps he was envious.

Crater reported to sheriff's deputies that the goat approached his Pontiac at a "fast rate of speed from the left."  
"It was a big goat," he said.

### Budget Totals In Cassia Dip For Expenses

**BURLEY, Jan. 12**—Cassia county's tentative budget for the new year, approved by the county commissioners Tuesday, experienced a cut of about \$24,000 in various county departments but increases elsewhere offset about half the decrease.  
"Tentative figures for salaries and wages total \$80,940, while expenses are expected to amount to \$43,185.47. Grand total is \$124,257, as compared to last year's figure of \$148,860."  
Major reasons for the budget decrease are the absence of an election appropriation, amounting to \$8,000 last year, and a drop of nearly \$20,000 in the county building fund which last year included the cost of the new county house elevator. The tentative building appropriation is \$6,225, as compared to last year's \$28,725.  
Most department appropriations were subjected to minor changes from last year's cost figures. Most significant changes were in the clerk-auditor-receiver's office from \$13,150 down to \$11,800, assessor department expenses from \$1,975 up to \$3,175, and prosecuting attorney's expense from \$1,850 up to \$2,675.  
Other appropriations, apart from the routine county budget, look a total jump of approximately \$12,000. Expected hospital and charity expenses were given a \$6,250 hike to a \$20,150 total; and bridge funds were set at \$14,800, a \$3,000 rise, and the weed eradication program, a \$4,200 boost to a \$10,700 total. The 1955 budget is available for public examination.

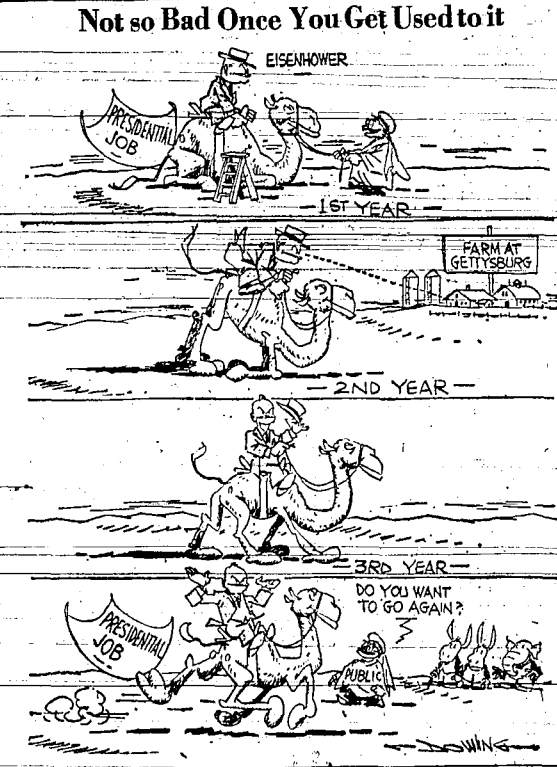

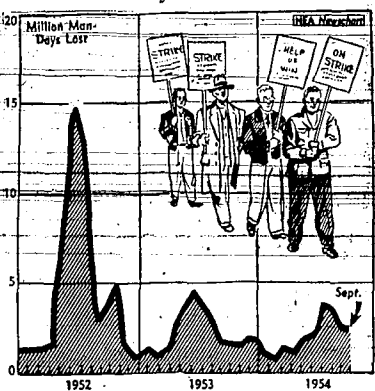

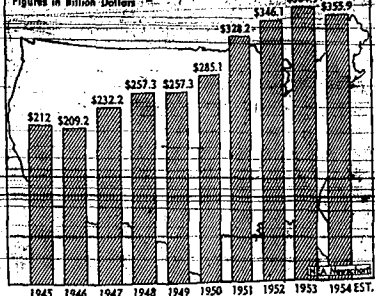

## Ban on Red Travel in Idaho Explained As "Reciprocity," Security Measures

WASHINGTON, Jan. 13 (Special)—Idahoans are going to have a hard time finding out just why part of their state was declared "off-limits" to Soviet travelers, or why, for that matter, the other parts were not.

"We just can't answer questions the state department's information branch," said a spokesman here today.

"The state department's 'blacklist' was designed to counter a similar ban on American travelers in Russia. Americans are forbidden to travel into about 30 per cent of the Soviet Union and Russians now of the United States.

"In most cases in fact," says Reap, "about the U. S. ban, 'you could say it was reciprocity.'"

"But," he continues, "there has been a lot of misunderstanding about our announcement.

"It doesn't mean that those areas of the United States which were not declared off-limits are going to be invaded by hordes of Russians. In 1941 we informed the Soviets that they would have to get permission to travel beyond a 100-mile radius from Washington and a 50-mile radius from New York and San Francisco," says Reap.

He says those permissible areas have been drastically reduced and Soviet nationals still have to apply to the state department to travel beyond them.

"But the new announcement," says Reap, "is a simple thing. It says that the 'off-limits' areas because they won't get permission.

"And the 'off-limits' areas," he adds, "it is going to be just too bad to tell Russia that we can't be unreasonable about these things too, and say time they want to become reasonable we can discuss it," he says.

Russia's last move in the restriction game was in 1952 when 22 more Soviet cities were put off bounds to foreign travelers. That brought the amount of Russian territory forbidden for foreigners to about 30 per cent of the country.

Under the new U. S. ban only six states remain on the entirely-unrestricted list. They are Florida, Vermont, North Carolina, Wyoming and Utah.

No slight is intended to those states, according to Reap. Since most of the announced off-limits areas stem from reciprocity against the Soviets and not from security reasons, there is no reflection of

the strategic or non-strategic nature of any state.

Perhaps South Dakota may claim to be the most strategic state of all. "But that's all right," says Reap. "However, because according to the state department got a little too enthusiastically there.

### Job Positions Could Depend On Face Line

NEW YORK, Jan. 13 (AP)—Look in a mirror. Are you the executive type? Do you have the right nose, jaw, forehead?

Your face may tell you only that your job is getting smaller, according to a study by a psychologist who makes a profession out of studying people's faces, whether you're suited for the next promotion at the office.

"There's a definite relation between an individual's physical appearance and his capabilities," according to Wear. "The problem is to put this relationship to work in choosing personnel, in matching the right man with the right job."

The time may come, if Wear has his way, when a worker's facial characteristics will be cataloged in a massive electronic brain along with similar data for everyone else on the company payroll. When the boss needs a new foreman, or manager he goes to the "brain."

"The requirements of the particular job are fed into the computer. In a flash, the computer matches them with the man or men who would best fit the job."

**Face is Studied**

Or put it the other way around. A man applying for a job has his face gone over by a trained "reader" and his characteristics are fed into the computer to find out what job he would best be suited for.

"Of course the final decision would be left to a human being. All the computer would do is give a list of research," Wear said.

Wear, a 30-year-old industrial designer, is judging from his face, is a pretty determined type, is president of the Morrow Corporation. This exists mostly on paper and in Wear's future-looking imagination.

"We're looking forward to the time when automatic factories will displace so many workers," he said.

"There will be an enormous job of shuffling personnel into new jobs. The whole idea of the Merion technique will come in."

**Explored Faces**

The "Merion technique" was the brainchild of Holmes Whittier Merion, a doctor who spent a lifetime exploring the hills and valleys of the human face. He joined labor unions so he could catalog different types of jobs and special skills.

When he died in 1942 at the age of 88, Merion claimed he could study a man's face and tell which of 8,000 different jobs he could fill most adequately.

Wear, who worked with Merion for 10 years, hopes to set up shop with a computer to do personnel research for industrial and business firms.

Just what do you look for in a future executive? It all depends, Wear said. A policy-making executive requires a different kind of personality than a "line" executive, whose job is to get things done.

**Nose Is Important**

The nose is important. He pointed to a photograph. "The large, drooping septum indicates an analytic intelligence. A nose coming more to a point would denote ability to solve problems."

"The important thing is that no factor is judged by itself. Every facial sign is rated only in relation to others in the same face," Wear said.

Indications of enthusiasm, trust, confidence and good-will are found in the area around the mouth and upper lip. The cheek or jaw show degrees of hardness, severity and firmness.

Baldness? No, said Wear, hair doesn't count.
