Port Says He Ask for Yank Aid for Formosa

WASH., Jan. 21 (AP)—The White House declined today on the authoritative report that President Truman will ask congress for specific permission to use forces to protect Formosa and its outposts.

After the president would send such a message to congress secretary James C. Hagerty on Monday, Truman said. "Nor would Hagerty give anything to say." Nor would Hagerty give anything to say whether this matter was before the national security council.

The council met yesterday and again today with the president. Hagerty would say only that the 20-minute session preceding the regular Friday morning cabinet meeting was held to complete some discussions that were started yesterday.

Meanwhile, key congressional Democrats said that it's up to Mr. Eisenhower to decide on the use of U.S. sea and air power to defend Formosa.

These Democratic leaders, Eisenhower, as commander-in-chief, has all the authority he needs to make the decision, they said.

They recalled that former President Truman took all responsibility for going into Korea in 1950 and did not call congressional leaders in except to report his action.

This was the Democratic leaders' reaction to disclosure yesterday that the administration is considering asking congress for specific approval to use American troops to defend Formosa and to "cover" any accusation of Chinese Nationalist troops from the beleaguered Tachen islands.

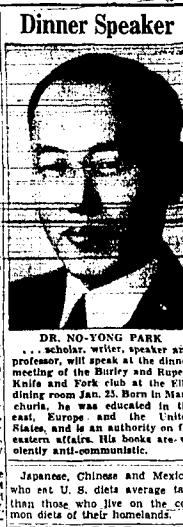

Atomic Metal Prices Make Gold Cheap

WASHINGTON, Jan. 21 (AP)—The U. S. government has set up price schedules for a traffic in metals so precious as to make gold cheap.

The metals are uranium, vanadium, cobalt and molybdenum. The official fissile materials program is a consequence of military security. But it is known that the government's gold purchase price of \$420 a pound is low by comparison.

There is reason to believe the price of platinum, depending on the metal's grade and use, ranges from around \$3,700 to \$37,500 a pound. And there have been suggestions that the pound price of fissile uranium-235 is about \$200,000.

The schedule was established under sections of the new atomic energy act providing for private exploitation of nuclear forces for generation of electricity and for the production of material.

Polio Vaccine Will Get U. S. Agency Tests

WASHINGTON, Jan. 21 (AP)—The health police contract with the government tests before it can be offered to the general public, a U. S. public health service official said today.
