Gooding Polio Drive Lagging

WENDELL Jan. 26 — The 1955 March of Dimes drive in Gooding county is falling far behind previous years, campaign officials reported Monday after a survey of funds on deposit in Gooding and Wendell banks for the campaign. Thus far this year only \$2,400 has been donated. The Gooding bank has \$1,300 on deposit and the Wendell bank \$1,100.

In 1954 the campaign netted \$6,313.47 or 59¢ cents per capita. The campaign in 1953 netted \$11,651.99 or \$1.05 per capita.

Most of the money received so far this year has been from organizations.

The mothers' march on polio has become "increasingly necessary this year because of the poor showing made to date," A. J. Ritter, Gooding county chairman, reports. Much effort has been put forth by various committees and some individuals have made very substantial contributions but the total raised is far short of the amount contributed in the two preceding years, he said.

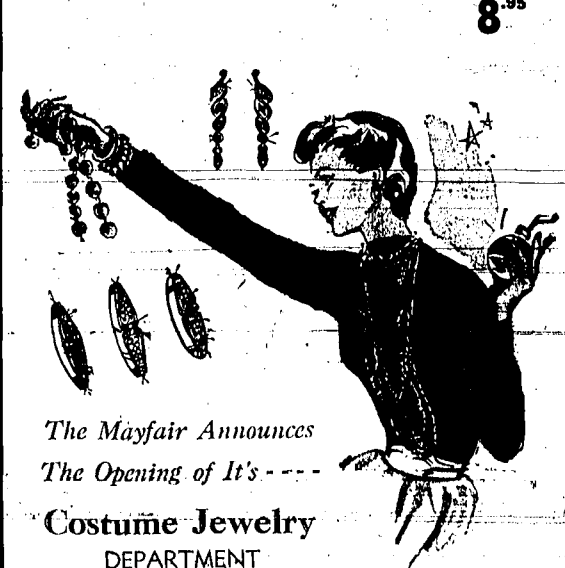

Uranium Hunter Goes Modern in Luxurious Craft

Aviation Growth Told by Director

BOISE, Jan. 26 (AP)—State Aeronautics Director Chas. Boulton reported yesterday that aviation in Idaho has risen from childhood into strapping youth since the days of World War II and promises continued growth in the years to come.

The craft is of the type used by the U. S. navy in hunting submarines during World War II. Inside it has thick carpenter, mahogany, woodwork and an observation lounge.

Pick said the fact the plane can land on either ground or water will enable him to hunt uranium in areas never before reached by prospectors. He plans his first trip to South America in February.

In a report to Gov. Robert E. Smylie, covering the nine postwar years, he said aviation has made "tremendous strides" all the way along the line from airline service to commercial flying to dusting Idaho's crops with insecticides, herbicides and fertilizers.

"Only in the field of student instruction and training has general aviation had a positive recession," Boulton noted.

Heikilla, chairman of the house committee, said the proposal would establish a mining securities board with the primary function of "protecting the investor from illigimate operators."

new floors or coverings. Floors in the older classrooms are worn down about one-fourth of an inch.

In 1928, a middle wing of two classrooms, three classrooms and a playroom were added. For the past 10 years, the playroom has been used mostly for one or two classrooms. These classrooms were improved last summer by addition of a radiator to each room, permanent partition separating rooms and light control switches in each room. Cloakrooms and teachers' cupboard for supplies are needed.

Washington school reached its present size after a bond issue of \$1,000,000 in 1949. Part of the \$1,000,000 was spent for building four classrooms, a heating plant, remodeling the auditorium and buy additional playground space.

"We are proud of the units and the type of instruction inside their walls," says Allen.

The new units provide plenty of space—the first requisite of a modern classroom. Space for various learning activities, space for movable furniture, storage space for teaching aids and supplies.

Other desirable features are clerestory lighting with directional glass blocks, low windows with a protective overhang and indirect lighting.

The new classrooms, in contrast to the old, are self-contained units. A drinking fountain, sink and restrooms are provided in each room. Acoustics are improved by parallel construction of ceilings and floors, irregular walls and by acoustical ceiling tile and floor inlay. All walls are painted different colors.

Halls are wide, well lighted and have low ceilings and numerous exits.

Location of Washington school, originally thought to be "out in the country," has proved fortunate. Most of the children are within walking distance of the school and no buses are necessary.

Washington playgrounds are more adequate than other city elementary schools.

Original restrooms of the old part of the building were recently modernized by installing new plumbing fixtures, new tile floors and walls and metal closet partitions.

In summing up the school's overcrowded conditions, Allen notes the 12 classrooms of the original portion of the school are overcrowded with 30 students each.

Two businessmen dug into their pockets yesterday to defray expenses of trips to Red China by some families of Americans imprisoned there. One, a World War II bomber, offered to pay the way for relatives of two men and received eager acceptance.

A Massachusetts automobile dealer said he would give \$5,000 to a survivor of the "Red" to make the trip.

She hasn't decided.

Other Efforts Underway
An effort was underway also to raise more funds by popular subscription so other families could go, too, in response to the recent communist invitation.

George W. Scrimshaw, New York, the former pilot and now president of the Karate Club in Twin Falls, said his firm would pay the way for relatives of jailed Capt. Eimer F. Jewell, Missoula, Mont., and Pvt. Steve Kiba Jr., Akron, Ohio.

Scrimshaw said also he would make the firm's private plane available to any other families that require transportation to the west coast or other point of overseas embarkation.

Wife Accepts
Jewell's wife, Maxjorie, 26, said of Scrimshaw's offer: "Of course, I accept.

"I want to see my husband. After all, two years . . . and I'm sure trip would help get him freed."

She said she knew the Chinese offer "is valuable" but she would move for them. But this very fact promises that visitors will get good treatment in a children's playground.

The Scrimshaw offer to pay all expenses of the trip applies also to Jewell's mother, Mrs. Henry Gitter, Vista, Calif. She, too, has accepted.

Kiba's family in Akron said his brother, John, 41, an electronics engineer, and sister, Irene, 18, a high school student, would go to China to see him in response to the Scrimshaw offer.

Families Unknown
Scrimshaw said he did not know either the Jewell or Kiba families but chose them because they were the first—judging from newspaper reports—to say they wanted to make the trip.

His reason for defraying the expense, he stated, is to show the importance Americans attach to the individual and to the family as a unit.

Scrimshaw also said his firm would be glad to handle contributions to defray costs of sending other families to see their jailed airmen.
