Idaho Senator Adds Warning For Ike's Talk

WASHINGTON, Jan. 27 (Special)—Sen. Henry Dworshak added his warning financial appendix to President Eisenhower's fast pace policy message to the senate Monday in a brief floor address of his own.

"Acknowledging a situation so grave that the President is sending us a special message on this new 'crisis,' Dworshak said, 'I feel we must recognize the hazardous situation we are in and the rapidly shifting sands upon which we stand.'

"Initiation is required for us to be able to meet this crisis," Dworshak said, who is a member of the senate appropriations committee, "nor is it a time for unproductive tax reductions."

"All Americans are vitally concerned with these related problems," said the senator. "They are willing to forego additional tax reductions and make necessary sacrifices to prevent further depreciation of the dollar."

"Under such circumstances," he continued, "it seems to me that this is the time to act. We must increase salaries of civilian and military personnel."

Dworshak's words undoubtedly will elicit pointed response among his personal constituents who may soon be voting on their proposed \$1,500 a year pay raise.

"For such economy measures must be made with the approval of military and federal employees who are also in line for pay raises," he said.

"I believe," he said, "that all Americans dedicated to preserving our way of life, and this preservation is contingent upon a strong and independent spirit which will result from adding billions of dollars to our federal budget and to this deficit."

Dworshak warned that "if such spending is provided there will be a corresponding increase in the deficit, with devastating effects upon our economic system and our national defense."

Dworshak appealed to the President, his fellow legislators, and all federal employees to postpone temporarily "action on pay raises and demands for increased salary and wage schedules, including congressional salaries."

A hastily enacted pay raise, he warned, will be ultimately rejected by all.

"Economic administration and the congress," Dworshak concluded, "should challenge the nation to hold the economic line, not only at this crucial point in our history."

Flying Tiger Leader Asserts China 'Showdown' Is Needed

TAIPEI, Formosa, Jan. 27.—Major-General Claire Chennault (ret.) said today the "time has come for a showdown with the Chinese Communists."

Chennault said in an exclusive interview that it will be easier for the United States and her Asian allies to defeat the Red Chinese now than one year hence.

"They (the Red Chinese) are not our friends and are a threat to our leadership in the United Nations," Chennault said. "They have demonstrated that."

"We had better have a showdown now," the former commander of the Flying Tigers added. "I don't like war but sometimes it's better to fight things out. The Red Chinese are the only aggressors in Asia. They are doing all the shooting and all the moving forward."

Chennault defended Nationalist Chinese retaliatory attacks against the Reds.

"The Chinese Nationalists are only trying to return the fire to protect themselves," he said.

Chennault said he did not believe American ground troops would be needed in a showdown with the Red Chinese.

"We can use troops of friendly Asian nations who are plenty willing to fight if we supply them and provide air and sea assistance," Chennault said. "We can run the Chinese Reds out of China if we will use our air power who want to fight."

Chennault said the Chinese Nationalists and South Koreans have a greater combined, first-class fighting force than the Red Chinese.

Destruction of Bombs Rocks Desert in Utah

DUGWAY, Utah, Jan. 27.—The detonation of 49,000 obsolete fragmentation bombs by military ordnance experts yesterday shattered the quiet of the desolate western Utah desert.

The bombs, containing the explosive power of 500,000 pounds of TNT, were stacked in 22 piles and sent off like a giant string of firecrackers.

"Newcomer" and military personnel at an observation point five miles away watched as a brilliant burst of orange flame flashed across the sky, an angry cloud of black smoke contrasting against the white of the snow-capped mountain background, rose about 500 feet in the shape of an arch.

The anti-personnel fragmentation bombs were ordered destroyed by the army and air force because they were outdated and too dangerous for civilian use or lengthy storage.

Power of Red Chinese Begins With Russ Taking Manchuria

By United Press

The Chinese Communist rise to power has been a steady process. The Communists have been moving into Manchuria for weeks before the end of World War II, and now they are in control of the area from the legal government of China.

The Communists had been accumulating power for 30 years but until the Soviet Union took over Manchuria in 1945, they were unable to collect the vast arms supplies of the Japanese army. The Communists were poorly equipped. Some even carried spears.

The invasion of Gen. George C. Marshall to Chungking and Nanking in 1945-47 to win peace for ravaged China and end the civil war was seized upon by the Communists as a golden opportunity. While their spokesman, Chou En-lai, negotiated in the nationalist capital, the Communists built up their forces in Manchuria. It was there they began their offensive that drove the Nationalist Republic to proclaim the "New China" and before the fighting had even ceased on the Chinese mainland in the five years since then the Chinese Communists have built the second largest army in the world and have demanded recognition.

The man most closely identified with the rise of Red China is Chou En-lai, now the premier and foreign minister. He has brought Red China to the threshold of being a recognized world power. Often at a juncture during the past five years during much of that period he has carried on a one-man war with the United States.

Chou does not rule Red China—the three other leaders are Mao Tse-tung, Chu Teh and Liu Shao-chi—but as premier and foreign minister he represents Red China to most of the world. To many he is Red China.

He is suave and handsome and has a ready smile. He has been accused of killing political enemies with his bare hands. He has treated the United States as Chinese bank-rupts, but he hates the United States probably more than any man alive.

Chou, the official spokesman of Chinese Communism for many years and a man who confuses American diplomats and generals into believing that red was some other color, feels that Red China is powerful enough to be accepted as one of the "big five" with Russia, the United States, Britain and France.

The feeling of power received a boost in January, 1949, when Chiang relinquished the presidency. It increased again in April 1950 when Hainan Island—the last big base near the mainland—fell to the red army. The feeling of growing power also increased when Red China signed a treaty of friendship with the Soviet Union and the "Republic" was proclaimed.

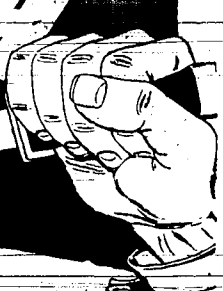

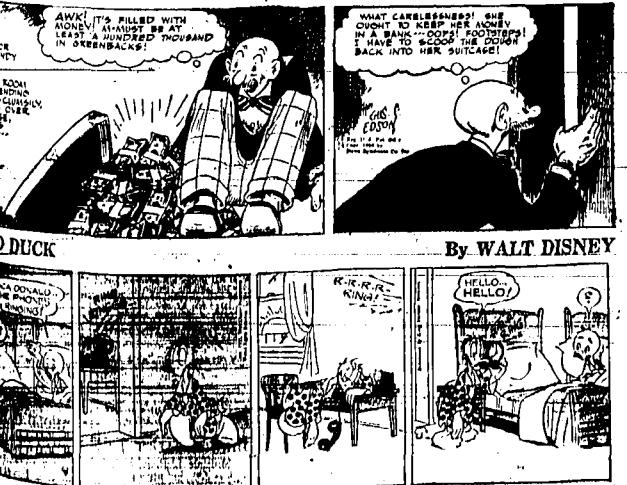

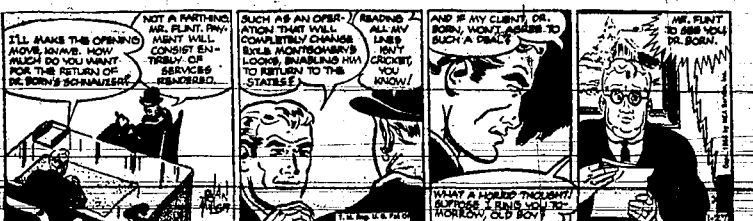
