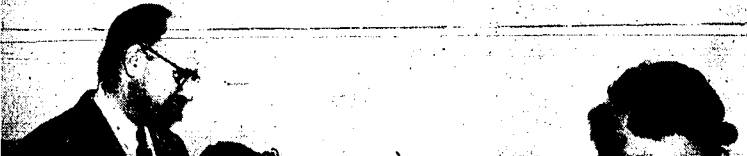

# TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—President Eisenhower has been assailed by political and scientific spokesmen for having plunged the atomic energy problem into politics, or vice versa. His critics include such contrasting figures as Albert Einstein, who first proposed the atomic experiment to EDR, and Albert Gross, the new health senator from Tennessee.

As a basis for the accusation is White House support of the DIXON-YALOW-ATC contract, which has involved the atomic energy problem in partisan controversy on Capitol Hill. The opposition also charges that the contract is an AEC personnel and in approving contracts for experimentation in peacetime application of nuclear power.

It is not clear whether the contract is rather than public relations.

In short, the atom, including the bomb itself, has at last exploded into politics and economic activity into the hands of editors and newspapermen. Experts in this evolution should evoke any surprise or criticism. They point out that Eisenhower cannot be held responsible for this nonmilitary explosion.

**ATOM AND POLITICS**—It was an inevitable relationship, just as the invention of electricity, the automobile, radio and television produced new and difficult politico-economic problems.

There can be no more kept out of our politics than the tariff or pork-barrel, rivers and harbor projects. That is not unless these reactive projects, taken medicinally, can do what no other human discovery has ever done—create a entirely new breed of nonpartisan politicians.

The people surprised and shocked by this development, according to the more realistic viewpoint, resemble the people who lived in a remote and dreamlike world that never read a newspaper until long after World War I had engulfed the entire earth.

**DOMINATES DISCUSSIONS**—These politico-economic critics need only to attend congressional sessions in the State Department of the Pentagon to appreciate that the broken atom, whether used for destructive or constructive purposes, has opened a new era of grave foreign and domestic issues.

It is only our possession of superior atomic power, for instance, that is credited by Prime Minister Churchill as the "biggest factor in the world since global war." It is that same advantage which has forced us into the responsibility of heading the western coalition, NATO, the proposed Western European Union, and SEATO.

Currently, were it not for the fact that the seventh fleet off Formosa is equipped with atomic bombs, Mao Tse-tung might have been picked ourselves to defend. For good or for bad, our atomic power influences both military and foreign policy more violently and radically than any other force in world history.

**REDUCING BUDGET FORCES**—The atomic presence in the world has opened a new era of grave foreign and domestic issues. It is only our possession of superior atomic power, for instance, that is credited by Prime Minister Churchill as the "biggest factor in the world since global war." It is that same advantage which has forced us into the responsibility of heading the western coalition, NATO, the proposed Western European Union, and SEATO.

Currently, were it not for the fact that the seventh fleet off Formosa is equipped with atomic bombs, Mao Tse-tung might have been picked ourselves to defend. For good or for bad, our atomic power influences both military and foreign policy more violently and radically than any other force in world history.

**YARDSTICK COMPETITION**—Finally, when industrial use of atomic energy becomes feasible five or so years hence, there will be slaged a rewording of the yardstick by which we measure progress. We will have water power, the new dealers already insist on government ownership of generating plants, or at least the so-called "yardstick competition" will demand that, like other forms of energy, the atomic force be incorporated within the going, private enterprise system.

**MEMPHIS COMMERCIAL APPEAL**—The confounding of the atom with the atom bomb in a state trial, that the divisions that appeared after Stalin's death, as witness the liquidation of Lavrent' Beria, secret police head, have not been composed.

**LOS ANGELES TIMES**—"The consensus seems to be that the current master of Russia is N. S. Khrushchev, secretary of the Communist party. He is the key post. But Khrushchev has been reported as a heavy drinker, inclined to be loose-tongued when in his cups and not trusted in conference by his colleagues. Now it is to the people's best interest that H. B. 111 to give the governor full control over the commission and thus throw the department back into politics be killed without fail.

**LEGISLATIVE RESPONSIBILITY**—Idaho, according to figures compiled by the National Safety Council, made the most miserable showing percentage-wise of any state in the union in highway fatalities during 1954.

The state's highway fatality rate jumped 22 per cent over the deaths recorded in 1953.

That's something for the present session of the state legislature to be thinking about, particularly in face of the fact that estimated national fatalities show an overall decrease of five per cent, according to the council.

Thirty-six of the 48 states showed decreases and those states reporting increases, aside from Idaho and Colorado, were relatively minor. Colorado, with a 17 per cent increase, was closest to smothering Idaho in a most disgraceful showing.

It is true the legislature is concerning itself with "drunkometer" tests to curb drunken driving, a change in juvenile laws to cope with irresponsible youngsters who are a menace on the highways, and other measures aimed at that direction.

But drastic steps will have to be taken, including an appreciably larger state police force, stricter laws with more mandatory provisions, and greater emphasis on enforcement, if we are going to clear ourselves of the stigma which has resulted from our indifference up to now—to say nothing about saving many of these scores of lives which are being lost needlessly.

# HOW THINGS APPEAR FROM PEGLER'S ANGLE

My old sparring partner, Arthur Pepler, says that the man who married the boss daughter and became the publisher of the New York Times, has got the darndest with his maxillary. That is an anatomical meaning the jawbone. I would not use it ordinarily except in this civil law case. I am a misogrammarian, which is another word for grammar. It means a word meaning a dummy who does not know anything and does not like intellectual people.

Several times Mr. Sulzberger, N. Y. Times has taken picks on me as "anti-intellectual," a rough-hewn, ignorant, and illiterate. I report to be because apparently his intellectual development stopped a little short of the right word in the process made and provided.

In the latest of these exploits they played up a little dance on doubtless family in New York at which a character named Dr. Theodore Brannell, New York, was a "serious force, likely to become more serious" and held up Webster Pepler as the most eminent operator in this civil law.

The Times said also, by the way, that Eleanor Roosevelt was among the "most intelligent audience" and thought to myself that was a good thing they did not require at least a kindergarten diploma because otherwise they might not always happy dreams might have got the rats at the gate.

Since the article gave the impression that you had not checked up on this character, I asked Doctor Butler at once for further information on the savant who perceived in me a formidable personage than Prof. Harry W. Doctor Butler remarks: "I find this an interesting quote from St. Paul, for it contains the last full sentence with the first half of another in Philippians without Mr. Brannell indicating it, and the considerable importance of St. Paul's thought. But the concluding peroration on page 222 is somewhat overdone as a pedestrian in life, work out your own salvation, cries St. Paul, for it is God that worketh in you."

"As communism thus appropriates simultaneously both the positive and negative features of the two concepts—and this is the fourth alternative—the dualism brought by the evidence of part two and part three, accordingly dissolves. Such dualism dissolves, moreover, by what may be for the scientific attitude, a psychological and logical necessity. And the devotee of communism, to whom such an attitude can be ascribed, becomes at once creator and worshipper of a magnificent human order."

Doctor Butler says there is nothing in the book hostile to communism but mainly with merit, that if there is anything noncommittal, it is obscured by our author's language. And he wonders why Brannell wrote the book at all inasmuch as in 1933 it was addressed to no particular audience, according to his own account. It is a burning subject of the time. Lincoln Used Laughter as Food and Drink to Sustain Him on Dark Days

For Abraham Lincoln, laughter was the "joyous, beautiful evergreen of life." He needed it as he needed food and water during the dark days of the war, laughter was his life-preserver.  
Lincoln's penchant for listening to and telling jokes is well known. But he seldom told a joke for the joke's sake. They were like parabolas. His stories made a point clear, clinched an argument, and they usually began with "That reminds me..."  
When Horace Greeley ripped into Lincoln in a violent editorial, the President was asked how he felt about it. Lincoln was reminded of the big fellow whose wife beat him over the head without restraint. As others tried to interfere, the man told them: "Let her alone. It don't hurt me and it does her a power of good."  
At another occasion, a group of senators came to urge Lincoln to reorganize his cabinet. He was reminded of the story of an old farmer back in Illinois who was pestered by skunks. As he went out into the night with his shotgun, not one skunk but seven appeared. The farmer took aim and killed one, but that one raised such a fearful smell that the other seven "went to the other ax hole."  
After listening to the story, none...

Figures Told Of Evangelist British Work

LONDON, Feb. 11 (AP)—How many of the converts who declared their faith at evangelist Billy Graham's big London crusade last year have stayed converted?  
This question was causing lively discussion in London today as Graham prepared for a "return engagement" of the evangelistic meetings a year ago which drew 1,827,789 spectators and made \$3,641 cents.  
"Independent surveys" have been publicized saying only 15 per cent of Graham's converts were active churchgoers a year after making their "decision for Christ."  
Lorne Sanny, Graham's assistant director of follow-up, was amazed. "I'd like to know where they got those figures," he said. "We have a big statistics department, and it's all we can do to keep track of converts a year after making their decision."  
Disclosing the Graham organization's own statistics for the first time, Sanny said it appeared two-thirds of the converts stayed converted for at least three months. He said that of the 34,841 converts who signed up during the three months of Graham's crusade last spring, 23,000 signed the Graham team "signed receipts" for 23,000. This number of converts had followed through by contacting a local church.

The Dorman's husband, San Francisco division manager of the huge West coast contracting firm of Bechtel corporation, bought the fabulous "house that fear built" yesterday at a sheriff's auction for a mere \$49,000.

"I fell in love with this house because it has such a basic simplicity," Mrs. Dorman said.

The house contains such items as electric eyes, heated toilet seats, a \$22,000 imported bathtub of pink marble, radiant-heated terraces and a unique electronic system that permitted the terrified builder to overhear conversations in any room in the house from any other room.

The six-year-old home in this exclusive residential community was built by builder Sam Turner, who was sent to the McNeil Island, Wash., federal penitentiary when the government got a peek at the purchase price.

"At the time I bought the 10-room residence he owned Nevada's Cattle Lodge, a profitable gambling venture."

**Ends with Mansion**

He intended a small \$35,000 cottage on the San Francisco peninsula. But he became worried about firemen and other enemies and wound up with a \$377,000 fortress.

He had a cellar and a room so sensitive it would snap on a battery of flood lights when a shadow fell on it, a lock-type door, an armor-plated cellar and a room with electric eyes inside the sensitive fence.

He paid \$220,000 of the bill in cash—and started the bureau of internal revenue wondering about how the Reynolds budgeted their small reported income.

### Kimberly-Hansen Observer Corps Unit Preparing to Build Observation Tower

HANSEN, Feb. 11 — Members of the Kimberly-Hansen ground observer corps participated Thursday in ground-breaking ceremonies for the new observation tower to be erected at a site on route 30 one mile west of Hansen.

According to post supervisor Norville Reynolds, Hansen, construction will be started on the new tower with the erection of poles designated by the Idaho Power company.

Completion of the tower is dependent upon donations of materials from ranchers and businessmen in Hansen and Kimberly.

"The importance of the ground observer corps to every man, woman and child in the Magic Valley cannot be overestimated," Reynolds said. "Were enemy bombers to attack this country they would in all probability follow a route over the recently bombarded mountains. On reaching the interior of the country they would be free to turn westward toward California or eastward to attack industrial areas in the mid-west."

Reynolds explained that the Hansen-Kimberly post is one of 30 similar installations planned for Twin Falls, Jerome, Cassia and Minidoka counties. Observation posts now are being operated in 17 communities in this area.

In order to erect a suitable observation tower for the Hansen-Kimberly area, Reynolds has issued a plea to all residents of the area to contribute building materials. He expressed hope that other Magic Valley business concerns would follow the generosity and civic-mindedness of the Idaho Power company.

Reynolds also said more volunteers are needed to man the post if it is to attain maximum efficiency as an integral part of the nation's warning system. ### Red Chinese Solidly Back Russ Regime

TOKYO, Feb. 11 (AP)—Red China yesterday lined up solidly with the Russian hierarchy, announced it was stepping up military preparations and lashed out at U. S. aggression.

Premier Chou En-lai sent a message to Nikolai A. Bulganin, the new Soviet premier, extending on behalf of Red China's people and government "sincere and warm greetings."

**Sends Message**

"I am, confident," Chou said, "that you, under the leadership of the united and monolithic central committee of the Communist party of the Soviet Union will surely make great achievements in the cause of the great Soviet people's communist constitution and defense of world peace."

In an earlier broadcast, Peking radio announced new regulations to "further the building up of the Chinese People's Liberation Army as a modern regular army" modeled on the Russian system.

Compulsory military training was mandated in regulations adopted by the Standing Committee of the National People's congress and signed by Mao Tse-tung ruler of Red China.

**United States**

The Official People's Daily charged the United States is now carrying out non-stop war provocations against China and is preparing to extend its aggressive activities.

It referred to U. S. planes and ships in the Formosan area covering the Tachen withdrawal.

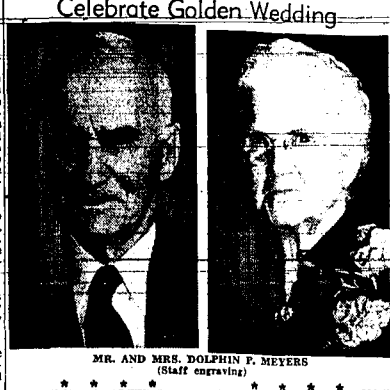
