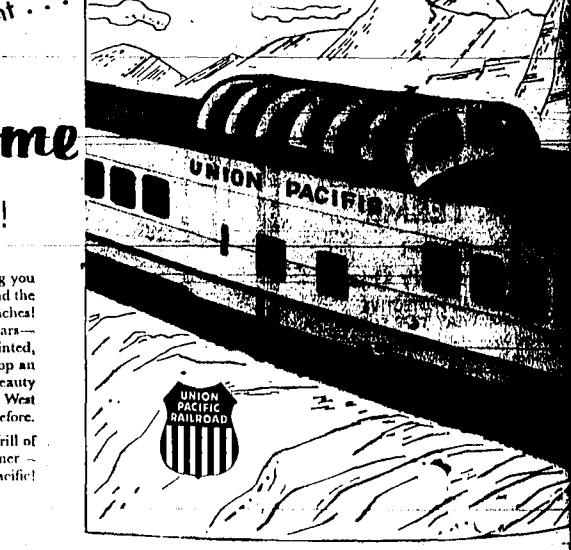

LOS ANGELES, Feb. 12 (AP)—An unemployed auto mechanic was headed for prison yesterday for stealing between \$200 and \$400,000 from coin-operated washing machines with an ingenious device he invented.

Charles Hester, 36, was sentenced to from one to 15 years in prison yesterday by Superior Judge David Coleman, who called the case "one of the most amazing I have ever heard of."

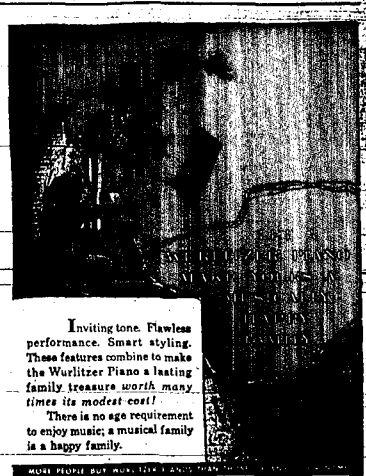

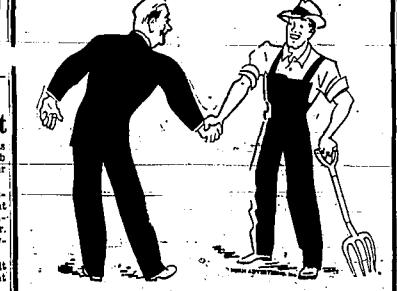

New Use Found for Old Appliance

Life in MAGIC VALLEY

Instant coffee, once a stepchild of coffee producers, is gaining in popularity, and users may be interested in an electrical contrivance long since discarded as being of no further use in this modern age.

J. H. Seaver, TWIN FALLS, early employe of what was to become the Idaho Power company, has a water heater that was designed to give a man instant (well, almost) hot water for a quick shave. The contraption consists of a small hot plate on three legs, a specially designed pan that will hold about a pint of water and a small piece of asbestos to keep the heat from the plate from scorching furniture.

Handles on the pan are movable so they can be closed and out of the way if a man wanted to pick the heater in his suitcase for traveling. The hot plate was in use long before modern "plug-in" appliances, and the plug must be screwed into a light socket.

Seaver believes the hot plate is one of the first, if not the first, electric appliances in Twin Falls. With the advent of hot water heaters in homes, the use for which the hot plate was designed disappeared and the plate was relegated to the top shelf in the cupboard at Seaver's home.

Seaver came to Twin Falls in 1908 and went to work for the power company 16 days after it was organized in 1907. One of his first duties was to light and put out the arc light at the corner of Shoshone and Main. When he left the company he was assistant superintendent at the power plant.

The county seat for Gooding county, and the site for the county courthouse long have been controversial topics for residents of the county. One city block in GOODING is designated as the site for the future courthouse and a city block in WENDLELL, has, on occasion, been posted

the permanent location of the county seat. Both Gooding and Wendell appeared on the official ballot.

After the petition was granted by the commissioners, Gooding residents were not idle waiting for election day to arrive. On Sept. 17 a warranty deed was recorded between the City of Gooding and the Gooding Townsite company.

The company deeded the "south 78 feet, 3 inches; thence west 81 feet; thence north 14 feet, 3 inches; thence east to the place of beginning embracing 28 rooms of the building known as the Lincoln Inn to the City of Gooding."

The verbal promise was that 26 of the 28 rooms mentioned in the warranty deed were to be leased to the City of Gooding as a site for the courthouse.

Old-time Gooding residents recall that many HAGERMAN residents were taken to Gooding on election day for their first automobile ride. The purpose of the ride was to laud the merits of Gooding as a county seat, and "would you like to vote today while you are in Gooding?"

On Nov. 1 the county commissioners, including F. W. Hagan, chairman, John Edholm and Frank Bowser, clerk, made the official canvass of the vote and Gooding was deemed the official site for the county seat, winning the election with 1,419 votes to 1,117 received by Wendell.

On June 1, 1915, a notice was received from the Arcade Building company, instructing the commissioners to vacate the rooms occupied by the sheriff, probate judge and the county surveyor. The commissioners then decided to remodel the north wing of the Lincoln Inn to provide space for all county offices. The clerk was instructed to notify the Gooding Townsite company to vacate the wing before July 1.

On July 2, 1915, a lease between the city of Gooding, new owner of the north wing of the Lincoln Inn, and Gooding county was recorded leasing 26 of the 28 rooms to the county for 99 years at \$1 per quarter. The extra two rooms were reserved for city offices.

An addition to the northern part of the inn was started during the summer of 1917 for a jail and city library.

When the city of Gooding purchased the old bank building for its offices and library, the rooms vacated by the city in the inn were leased to the county at the rate of \$50 a quarter. The sum still being paid for the rooms, while all other rooms are being rented, according to the original lease, for \$1 a quarter.

The budget is set at \$288,975.50, an increase of \$10,810.50 over last year. The raise, as proposed, was accounted for in purchase of surety bonds for officers, additions to the county weed control program and minor changes in budgets of county officers.

Resort at Thousand Springs Breaks Ground for Swim Pool

HAGERMAN, Feb. 12—Construction of a swimming pool was started at Thousand Springs resort Saturday morning as the first phase of a project aimed at increasing all facilities at the resort.

Doyle Slinger, operator of the resort, said the pool will be 80 by 700 feet in size. It will be filled with warm water from an artesian well. Slinger said Mac Gray would drill the well. He explains that previous tests indicate artesian water will be warm enough for swimming. Water from a well now in use at the resort is pumped only six inches to the surface, he pointed out.

The concrete pool will be completed in time for the swimming season.

"Building Cathedrals"

By RICHARD DEVLILLERS (Pastor, First Christian Church)

For what are you living? What is the purpose of your life? No man rises higher than his ideal. Purpose sets the compass for your voyage of life. It is the polestar. Without it life is a merry-go-round, or uselessly active.

One of the outstanding characteristics of Americans is that we are always busy, being "number one" in going places, seeing sights, hearing sounds, eating foods and drinking beverages.

Sometimes you see a stranger in a large city notices a building in the process of construction. Scores of men were at work erecting this big downtown edifice. He wondered what type it was to be, and approaching a group of men engaged in preparing foundation blocks he said to one, "Friend, what are you doing here?"

Without looking up, the man answered gruffly, "Chiseling granite, can't you see?"

Not satisfied, he asked a second man, and this man replied, "I'm earning \$7.50 a day. That's what I'm doing."

Still not knowing what type of building he asked a third man. This man looked up and let his gaze sweep the heavens as though he saw something there, and replied with a radiant countenance, "Sir, I'm building a cathedral."

There were three men doing the same thing, but with three different objectives.

Each of us is in one of three classes. In which are you? Classify yourself.

The first is composed of those who are merely chiseling granite—eating three or four square meals a day; sleeping eight or ten hours a night, but with no goal, no objective, no purpose—just existing.

The second class is composed of those who are earning \$7.50 a day—more or less. The objective of such persons is purely monetary and material. Their entire life is a slavish quest after a larger salary, a bigger home, finer clothes or more pleasure. All is centered around self.

The rich fool of whom Jesus spoke is the classic example of this type philosophy. His barns were too full. Among talking birds, males usually are better talkers than females.

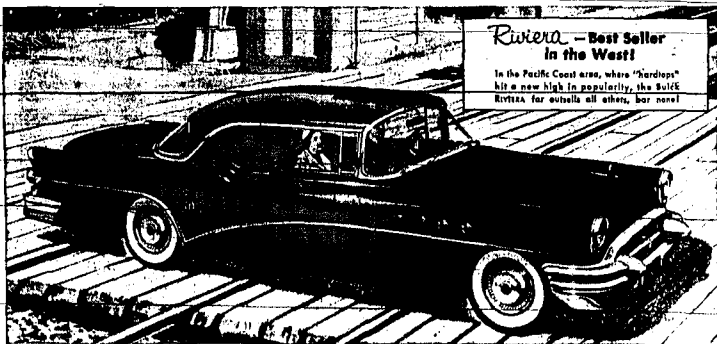
