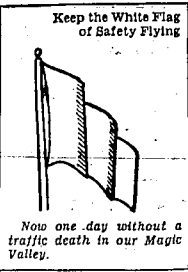

### Cow Palace's Area Is Good For Meetings

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 18.—The cavernous cow palace—site of everything from bronc bustin' to a concert, the Liberators will give Republicans jobs of new room service they meet here on Aug. 20, 1956.

The 1954 GOP national convention will be trying to cut out a accidental candidate from a herd of favorite sons in a building that can swallow New York's Madison Square garden or engulf a 10-story hotel easily.

**Called Cow Palace**  
Originally named the San Francisco Livestock Pavilion, the 54-acre cluster of buildings has always been known as the cow palace. Opened in 1941, the main arena struck many as a "mighty fine building for a bunch of cows."

The biggest crowd yet held in the 14-year-old WPA project, was 20,000 persons who crowded to hear President Eisenhower's campaign address here in 1954.

The main building is 400 feet long, 300 feet wide with half-circles rounding off either end. Its height is 106 feet. There are no pillars to block the view. Instead, the huge curving roof is built in three sections, mounted on roller-bearing auto expansion without damaging the ceiling.

**Wings Available**  
In the center of the building is a 30,000 square-foot concrete floor surrounded by an oval of 11,000 permanent seats. Flanking the main area are two wings with 48,000 square feet of space apiece.

Although plans are still indefinite the wings will probably house the press, radio and television and caucus rooms.

If needed, there are three separate buildings with three bars each which could be provided for service. 16 Blowers Ready  
To cool or warm the vast arena area there are 16 blowers, and to meet parking needs the surfaced and lighted parking area can handle 4,000 automobiles.

Besides housing the grand national livestock show annually, the cow palace has been the scene of ice shows, basketball and night auto races, Ringling Bros. and Barnum and Bailey circus, basketball, wrestling and boxing.

One big advantage of the cow palace as a convention site is that it is easily reached from downtown San Francisco. Automobiles can drive from the cow palace in 15 minutes during peak traffic periods.

**Revenue Fund Is Anticipated**  
SHOSHONE, Feb. 18.—Anticipated revenue for Lincoln county from sources other than taxation will amount to \$14,016. Sources are sheriff, county clerk, assessor, treasurer, probate judge and justice courts.

The recorder is expected to bring in the greatest amount of money with \$10,065 from the recording fees. The recorder fees, state liquor appointment, beer and liquor licenses and land and inheritance taxes.

The sheriff's department is expected to bring in an estimated revenue of \$1,500. This will be on fees for driver's licenses. Justice court will bring in the next largest amount, \$1,000, in traffic and game fines.

The probate judge is expected to collect \$800 in fees, traffic and game fines and the treasurer and tax collector will collect an estimated \$250 for delinquent taxes, interest and inheritance taxes. The county assessor will collect an estimated \$200 for trailer house licenses.
