### Holy Bible Is Edited to One Third Length

NEW YORK, Feb. 22 (AP)—A modest woman armed with scissors, paste pot and a lot of patience has completed the formidable task of editing the Bible into a version less than a third its usual length.

"I am not a theologian and not even a Sunday school teacher," Margaret Nicholson, editor of "The Compact Bible," said.

She pencilled, snipped and pasted sections—often from a different version of the King James version to put together her volume, which totals approximately 300,000 words. The King James version has 774,746 words.

Job Took Two Years

Miss Nicholson, the daughter of a missionary and for many years a top editor with a publishing company, began the job two years ago. "The Compact Bible" will be published tomorrow.

The first two months of her task also spent at her home near New York City, she said. "Seven miles from my nearest neighbor," concentrating on the Bible. She'd read through it twice before, but she'd never done any serious Bible study.

"I began with half a dozen inexpensive copies of the Bible," Miss Nicholson explained. "The first copy I read through, crossing out verses and words when my interest seemed to go."

She decided early in the task that she wasn't going to try to create a historical Bible or a scholar's Bible—but a volume which might tempt more people to begin with Genesis and end with Revelation, not missing any of the essential story of the Bible, but stripping tedious passages.

She clipped

"The second copy of my Bibles I started clipping out verses I wanted to keep in a scholar's Bible. I cut them out on sheets of paper first with Scotch tape, so I could remove them and paste the Bible in. Each book of the Bible is included, and each verse that is used is complete. Unobtrusive numbers at the side of the pages give the numbers of chapters and verses, so readers will know when sections are missing. The chapters are numbered, but very little," the editor said. "Passes I just had to be automatic with. I tried to pick the most familiar passages and also those which are most beautiful and not so familiar.

Hardest Was Revelations

"Revelations is the hardest chapter to cut. I just read it and reread it until I understood it, and then I cut out what seemed to me the unessential parts."

She decided to stick with her own opinion and not consult various churchmen. Miss Nicholson said she nervously hopes that most readers will agree with her choices.

"I cut without quibbling the things that were interesting as reading," she said. "I tried to save the story value, the beautiful passages, the literature of style and the great inspirational passages."

### Washington's Human Side Is Stressed by Modern Scholars

NEW YORK, Feb. 22 (AP)—George Washington, born 223 years ago today, remains the least understood of famous American Presidents.

Each known as "the father of his country" even in his own lifetime. But few know the side of the 164,000,000 American people who now dwell in the United States, and the American Republic he did so much to found, feel any temptation to call him "daddy." None feel any temptation to call him "papa," Washington.

He is revered not more as a human temple than loved as a fellow human being.

Why? The Humanist, Aermun Ward, gave one reason long ago when he said:

"The prevalent weakness of most public men is to sleep over . . . of Washington never sleep over."

The 19th century agnostic Robert Ingersoll, wrote of him:

"Washington is now only a steeple engraving. About the real man who lived and loved and hated and schemed, we know but little."

But modern research has uncovered the man beneath the steeple and the formidable legend. It has shown him to be a man with many faults, but with the greatness to rise above them.

What kind of a man was George Washington? Was he a stuffed shirt—or fun to know?

Well, teenagers might be aghast to know that he couldn't spell too well. At 16 he wrote "thruand there which meant "thruadred."

But he was a great boy for self-improvement. He wrote down his own principles of conduct, and tried to live up to them.

In youth and middle age he loved parties. He liked to flirt. He also liked to drink, gamble on the races and at cards, and play billiards.

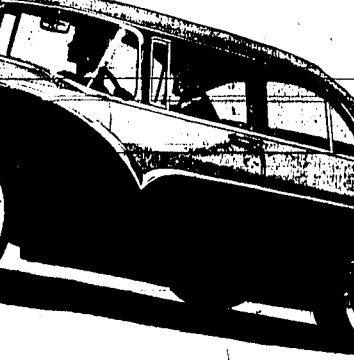
