Four Queries On Land, Sky Given Replies

By J. HUGH FRUIT, Astronomer, Extension Office, Oregon Higher Education System. The discussion of some questions recently received by me from three anonymous telephone callers will appear in this column.

1. In the planet Jupiter over the visible to the naked eye. Most certainly it always is when over 1 1/2 hours above the horizon, when the sky is clear at 10 p. m. dark. The next clear evening look early toward the east. The most brilliant star-like object in view is Jupiter. You can't see it at first.

2. How much does the earth's surface curve from a straight line in 1/2 mile? The answer is eight inches per mile. 32 inches in two miles, 72 in three miles, 120 in four miles. You will find that in four times eight; 72 is three times, and 128 is 16 times. These are thus varying as the square of the distance.

3. What is the speed of sound in air at sea level? This varies somewhat with the temperature. At the freezing point of water it is 1087 feet per second. This means sound will go a mile in approximately five seconds, or 3 miles in a minute. One can catch the distance to a lightning flash by timing the interval between the flash and the roll of the thunder. The light comes almost instantaneously, 180,000 miles per second. Sound travels over 700 miles an hour, or 120 miles per second. We need at least three seconds.

4. How far out must one go from the earth's surface where gravity does not act? Theoretically, the force of gravity varies as the distance from the center of the earth. At a distance of 4,000 miles from the center, the force is one-fourth that at the surface. At 8,000 miles above, 1/16 portion, etc.

**Law Enforcement Officials Put Blame On Speed for 50 Per Cent of Mishaps**

Speed is a factor in almost 50 per cent of the deaths which result from accidents, state, county and city law enforcement officials emphasize.

Speed is not always, in itself, the primary cause, but when coupled with other offenses it becomes the added ingredient which turns a minor mishap into a death or serious injury.

Accident records show that most drivers are not aware of the difference between a safe speed and a dangerous one. Heavy traffic, rain, wet or slippery pavements, blind intersections, dangerous curves, poor visibility, defective equipment all are factors which determine the speed at which a vehicle may be safely driven.

Even under the most favorable conditions, too great a "stopping distance" might prove disastrous. Therefore, familiarity with "stopping distances" is imperative, in order for

a driver to bring a car to a complete stop with any degree of safety. To stop a moving automobile, three separate acts are required: The eyes must see the danger, the brain must command the foot to apply the brakes and the foot must move to put the brake into operation.

Non-Trauma has shown that the reaction time of the average driver ranges from three-fourths of a second to as much as one and one-half seconds.

Obviously, the faster a vehicle is moving, the less time there is to avoid an accident. At 50 miles per hour a car is traveling at the rate of 73.3 feet per second. If the driver sees danger and reacts to the emergency, he will travel 73 feet before he can possibly apply his brakes, even if he is credited with the fastest reaction time.

If his brakes are good, another 110 feet will be required as braking

distance, making a total "stopping distance" of 174 feet, or about one-half the length of a city block.

Speed limits are dictated on a practical basis. An analysis of the "why" back of a 15 miles per hour regulation at a blind intersection, for instance, can be readily understood.

A driver nearing a blind intersection at 30 miles per hour, travels 33 feet after seeing danger before he can make an effort to avert an accident. This distance is enough to carry him more than half-way across the intersection. If another driver is approaching this intersection from a cross street at the same time, at the same rate of speed, an accident is certain to follow.

Police Chief Howard Gillette notes that good drivers make it a habit to approach an intersection with the foot on the brake pedal instead of prepared for any emergency.

and give it to small towns in many of which it would be "largely wasted."

Unsuccessful moves were made to send the bill down to seven per cent and put off a vote on it until the senate had voted on the Interstate Commerce bill.

The Saturday closing bill was assailed as a "shameful violation of the bankers' trust," and as "a foot in the door" for year-around closing, and as "a lot of foolishness."

But Sen. K. O. Barlow, R., Casala, said it would be "particularly beneficial to those who work in banks," and Sen. Ed Middleton, D., Boundy, said it would check an emigration of bank workers from north Idaho into Washington, which has a five-day bank week.

**3 Months Closing**  
The senate earlier defeated a bill which would have closed banks every Saturday. The Saturday closing for June, July and August was approved 22-17.

The public assistance appropriation, second largest in the state budget, passed 37-3 with debate. The largest—\$18,000,000 for the minimum education program—will be up for a vote Monday.

The senate first passed and then, less than 15 minutes later, killed a bill to increase the allocation to so-called "poor counties" under the minimum education program from \$5,000 to \$10,000. The vote in each case was 21-17.

**Sponsored by Camas Colon**  
The measure was sponsored by Sen. K. M. Hanson, D., Camas, who, along with Clark, Boise and Power has so much assessed valuation that it does not need to levy the amount required to come under the minimum program.

Hanson argued that the schools in his county had a "certain fixed cost" despite their small enrollment, and that Camas paid in \$18,000 to the minimum program through taxes and received back only \$5,000.

Sen. William Jackson, R., Gooding, said the bill was "fairly good" because other counties must levy 13 mills under the minimum program, while Camas county's would be reduced to eight as the token payments were increased.

The senate passed 38-2 a measure appropriating \$15,000 to the state share to the Western Interstate commission for night education enough to help educate two Idaho boys in dentistry and require a preliminary science by paying the difference between resident and non-resident tuition at schools outside the state.

**Severe Connection**  
The house passed a bill to sever the connection of the state welfare commission with the American Legion, change the commission's affairs and remove the welfare claims functions from it. The bill had passed previously but was called back and amended to include Korean veterans.

The senate highways committee introduced a bill requiring sheriffs to pick up suspended drivers in counties, similar to a house bill which the senate killed earlier.

The senate amended a house-passed bill putting civil defenses under the adjutant general's office to provide for interstate contracts and meet objections which the federal civil defense administration had said might cost the state federal aid.
