Ang Island, Can Menace Air Strip

Formosa, Feb. 28 (AP)—The Chinese Communists on Quemoy island with Soviet-built artillery of the French defenses at Dien Bien Phu, said today the artillery can reach every corner of the island's outpost with devastating fire for the first time. They also threatened a critical attack on Quemoy's only airstrip that had been "immune" to red guns in the past.

Quemoy is Gen. Chiang Kai-shek's largest offshore island base. It is about four miles from the big port of Amoy which it blocks and at one place is only 2,000 yards across open water from a red-island island.

Quemoy, with a peace-time population of 80,000, is roughly seven miles across and has been the scene of a bitter struggle since the communists could shell only about half of it with their small artillery.

Now they have been equipped with Russian 122 millimeter guns firing from new positions, the military sources said.

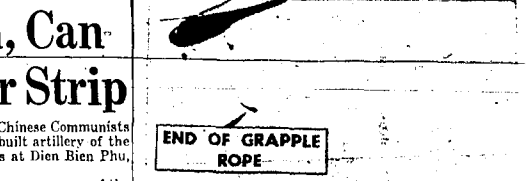

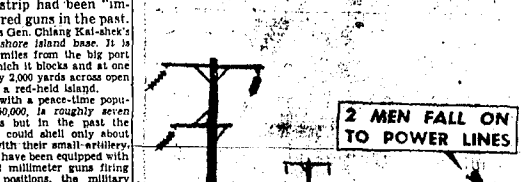

OPTIMISTIC OUTLOOK. Quietly, while we Americans have been attending mostly to the specter of depression, it seemed to haunt many of us in 1934 has slipped away into the mists.

As a matter of fact, new figures from the U. S. commerce department show that in the last three months of 1934 economic activity in this country had climbed back to a level exceeded only narrowly in two quarters of 1933.

What the department, and the economists, call the gross national product, the measure of all goods and services produced in the nation, was turned out in the final 1934 quarter at an annual rate of \$22 billion dollars. This was about five billion dollars better than the average for the full year, which is a gauge of the improvement in those last months.

Defense Pact Creates New Asiatic Issue

The Turkish-United States defense pact has created a new situation in the middle east.

Turkey has regained the middle eastern leadership which it lost as the result of World War I.

Egypt Defeated

Egypt, which had made a strong bid to take the leadership, has suffered a humiliating defeat in its attempt to block the Turkish-United States pact.

The eight-nation Arab league, in which Egypt was the leader, had been formed to help Turkey against the westward by Iraq's action in aligning itself with Turkey and thus with the western powers.

Address from Cairo now reports that Egyptian Premier Gamal Abdel Nasser will join Indian Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru as a "neutral" at the meeting.

Night Flight U. S.

It was reported also that Egypt might recognize Communist China. This, in a sense, would be a slap at the United States, which favors the "free" world.

Turkey had laid the basis for its cooperation with the western allies when it joined the North Atlantic Treaty organization in 1951.

Last April, Turkey signed a mutual defense treaty with Pakistan. This treaty was an important one in that it was the first such pact in the chain from Arctic Norway to the Himalayan mountains, Iran was the one missing link.

Signs Alliance

Then, on Aug. 9, Turkey signed a 20-year alliance with Greece and Yugoslavia. Greece is a fellow member of the NATO organization.

The alliance is not, however, a treaty. It is a communique, signed and sealed by the two governments.

New Turkey turned its attention to the Middle East nations of the middle east—one of them signed with the western grand alliance.

Jet Pilots Break Sonic Limits; Don't Even Realize Velocities

FARMINGDALE, N. Y., Feb. 28 (AP)—Would you be afraid to ride in a jet airplane as it broke through the sound barrier? The public generally pictures this as a frightening physical ordeal in which the plane is literally torn apart.

But Hal Boyle, a pilot with the Air Force, says this is not the case.

Occur P. (Bud) Hess, a veteran test pilot who has broken the sound barrier 17 and now is 41 and a grandfather, says this is only one of many misconceptions about the work of a test pilot.

Boyle says the Air Force is not interested in the "noise" of a jet airplane. He says the noise is a "by-product" of the jet engine. He says the noise is not a "problem" of the jet airplane.

"In most airplanes today if you didn't have a speed indicator you wouldn't know you were going through the sound barrier," he said. "You usually don't even know when it happens."

Boyle, director of flight operations at Republic Aviation Corporation, supervised a crew of 10 pilots who test the new F-84 Thunderbolt fighter bombers. The planes can exceed 600 miles an hour and carry a 5000 lb. load.

Bud estimates there are perhaps no more than 600 jet test pilots in the air force.

"It's a pretty new field," he said. "Hardly anyone in it deliberately set out to be a jet pilot. Most of them are former armed forces flyers with combat records. There is no other place for them to get the experience."

Nice work if you can get it. The pay is good—in the \$10,000 a year class. The hours are about the same as those of a pilot in the air force. But no dardrevels need apply. No manufacturer wants to put a hot pilot in the cockpit of a F-84.

The test pilot is an intensely serious young man, who must serve both as a scientist and a pilot. He checks out the plane through its full performance check before it is turned over to the air force.

"When I flew my first plane, an OX5 Standard, a plane similar to

the old F4U," recalled Bud, "all I had to do was about as the ignition switch and three instruments. They showed the air pressure, the water temperature and the engine speed. No compass. No radio.

"We had a dip stick to tell us how much gas we had left, and we filled her up with five-gallon cans from the nearest auto filling station. She burned four gallons an hour, and flew at 60 miles an hour.

"A jet fighter-bomber today burns more than 1,000 gallons of fuel an hour at sea level, and the cockpit has more than 200 switches and instruments."

After exhaustive ground checks, the completed plane is taken aloft and put through 40 different flight tests, ranging from steep climbs to supersonic power dives and "slow" take-offs. These tests are done whether pilot takes the plane up and does it all over again. Before accepting a test, the pilot must put the plane through the tests a third time with one of its own pilots.

What is the life expectancy and the future of a test pilot?

"There is a limit to how long a man wants to do it on a regular basis," Boyle said. "They don't want to fly 20 hours a week. After 40 or 45, most men don't want to fly in a high altitude jet airplane. How dangerous is it? Jet test pilots have to pay an extra premium for life insurance. Management and Labor Often Fight Together for Same Aims

NEW YORK, Feb. 28 (AP)—Maybe you think that labor and management always fight each other—but that's not always true.

But more often probably than you think they are working together to fight together for their common welfare.

Three examples are in the days' record of each side giving a little ground in seeking more prosperity for both. They involve, variously, the agreement to cut costs so a plant won't close down, a willingness to forego more fringe benefits and put the money into plugging the labor-management cooperation.

The first involves the Olo Ekvall company's plant in Yonkers, N. Y. The company said its operating costs and a dispute over local taxes would force it to close and move to the Midwest.

The International Union of Electrical Workers (IUE) has agreed to a plan which involves no cut in wages, no pay or fringe benefits but calls for labor-management cooperation in cutting costs by conserving tools, supplies and equipment and closing down "non-productive practices."

The second example is in the military industry. It may be news to you that the union and the big makers think that your wife doesn't buy enough food wisely. So the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Millwrights has dropped its demand for higher pensions.

The higher pensions would have cost New York's hat industry about one million dollars over the next three years. That amount will be deducted from the hat industry's pension plan.

Johnnie Ray, Nat Cole, Frank Sinatra and Frankie Laine already have collected top-heavy paychecks in the land of kangaroos. This week band leader Jones and his troupe of 20 organized noise-makers, known as musicians, take off.

"We're the largest unit to go to Australia since John Philip Sousa went there more than 50 years ago," Jones said.

Tons Go Ahead

Already on a slow boat to Australia are 28 tons of fantastic instruments necessary to Spike's comic slaughter of popular tunes. The Australians will have their first eyeful of his exploding cello and bagpipes, a guitar that shoots ping pong balls, a harp that makes like a bow and shoots arrows, a live pig that pops out of a target when hit by a baseball.

In 10 years of touring the United States and Europe, Jones said he has never looked Jones, "this is the hardest tour to arrange. The details are endless."

One problem was exporting goods to Australia. Customs would not make an exception because spike only has his guns to punctuate his lively tunes.

Take Own Amme

"We'll borrow guns there," he said. "But we're taking our own blank ammunition, wrapped in special insulated boxes. The customs allowed us to take our miniature cannons, however."

Jones will bring home \$183,000 for his three weeks in down-under country. But \$28,000 of that, he pointed out, goes for transportation alone of his troupe.

"We have to take the gadgets and props because we can't play our numbers the way we record them," he said. "They have to be more visual. People who make hit records but can't deliver in personal appearances don't last."

Japan Included

The tour, which will include Japan and possibly Burma ("I think my manager wants to get rid of me"), will be the band leader's first out of his continent. He never has played in London because of a musicians' union ruling there.

"I offered to send them affidavits we aren't musicians but it did no good," he desponded.

"Then he added, 'you know, I told that guy to Stan Kenton (the band leader) and he stood there, nodding, umm-hmm. He look it straight!'"

"Boy in Blue" Wins Battle in Hospital Fight

DULUTH, Minn., Feb. 28 (AP)—Albert Woolson, 108-year-old "last of the boys in blue," today was winning another battle against a dangerous attack of lung congestion.

Woolson, the last survivor of the vast Union armies which fought in the Civil war, rallied steadily against the attack which sent him to St. Luke's hospital Friday.

He even felt well enough to puff contentedly on his daily cigar yesterday. The old soldier also downed a hearty breakfast and was allowed to sit up in a wheel chair.

He then turned in for a night of quiet, comfortable slumber—a hospital spokesman said today.

Still in Hospital

Despite Woolson's good condition, however, hospital officials said they did not know when he will be allowed to go home.

For a time, his condition had required an oxygen tent. But hospital officials felt confident enough of Woolson's hardiness to remove the tent Saturday.

Lives With Daughter

He lives with his daughter, Mrs. John Kotous, and passes the time puffing cigars, smoking his pipe, watching television and reading the newspaper.

His birthday Feb. 11 is the occasion for an annual civic celebration, but it was a bit more subdued than usual this year.

The old campaigner appeared briefly at a downtown celebration and then received about 40 class friends at his home. However, he did not feel up to his usual birthday custom of addressing the snow off his front walk.

Received Telegram

Nevertheless, it was a special birthday for Woolson. He received a telegram from President Eisenhower honoring him and the 800,000 others who fought for the union 90 years ago.

Woolson answered Abraham Lincoln's call to arms when he was only 16 years old. He enlisted as a drummer boy and spent most of the great conflict on garrison duty in Tennessee with the first Minnesota regiment of heavy artillery.

On March 12, 1853, he became the last of the boys-in-blue when his old friend, 111-year-old James A. Hard, died in Rochester, N. Y.
