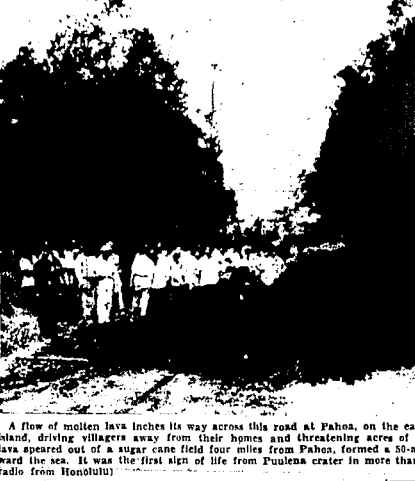

Italian Atomic Expert Helps Red Schemes

If scientist Bruno Pontecorvo is telling the truth, he may be masterminding some of those big schemes for utilizing nuclear energy which have been in vogue since the atomic bomb.

Pontecorvo, disclosing that he had gone behind the iron curtain in 1950, implied, if he did not actually say, that he was working exclusively on research involving the use of nuclear energy for peaceful purposes.

Italian-born Pontecorvo fled to France from the fascists. When Germany invaded France in 1940, Pontecorvo sought refuge in Great Britain. He became a naturalized British subject, learned Britain's atomic secrets and then betrayed them to Russia.

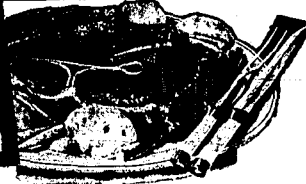

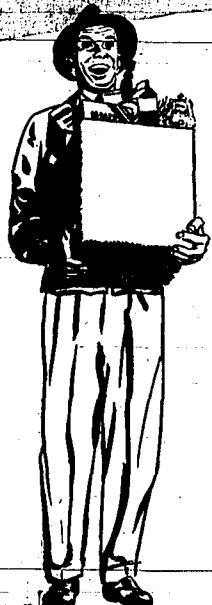

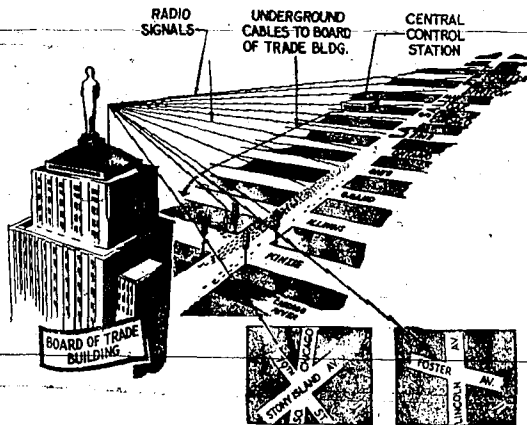

Radio-Controlled Traffic



Chicago took the first step toward having the world's first radio-controlled traffic lights when it awarded the General Electric company a contract to design, develop and manufacture the system. Diagram above shows how it will work. The radio antenna and transmitter will be located above the Board of Trade building, highest point in Chicago. The central control station will be a short distance away in City hall. A master mechanism in the central control station will send out a tone signal. The signal will be carried over the underground cable to the transmitter, which broadcasts it to the traffic lights. Each has a corresponding tone switch or decoder. Each decoder will select the signal designed for its street intersection and will ignore tones intended for other intersections. At first, traffic lights at 13 intersections in a heavy traffic area just north of Chicago's Loop will be radio-controlled, after which the system may be expanded. (NEA telephoto)

New U. S. City Springs up on Prairie Lands

CHICAGO, March 3 (AP)—A new city has sprung up on the prairie northwest of Chicago.
The city of Rolling Meadows came into being last Saturday when residents voted to incorporate a four-square mile area at a special election.
But the city's birth was not without labor pains. The area includes the Arlington park race track, which wants to be alone.
Eight Promised
Race track attorneys fought the proposed incorporation in the courts and indicate they will resume the battle when Rolling Meadows elects city officials to whom legal papers can be served.
The track has its own fire and police departments and its own water system. Spokesmen say see no advantage in paying taxes and income fees to Rolling Meadows.
As a city, Rolling Meadows, is a unique slice of America's younger middle class. Most of the residents are refugees from crowded Chicago, young couples with one or two kids. Their average income is estimated somewhere between \$4,800 and \$5,200.

Expert Works To Aid Doctor In Noted Case

BERKELEY, Calif., March 3 (AP)—A professor of criminology is working in a quiet, sunlit laboratory at the University of California on bits of evidence that may have a bearing on the Sheppard murder case.

The progress I've made on the evidence collected in that case can be summed up in one word—delay. Kirk said in an interview. He acknowledged that he was working on "something" but the pressure of his classes and other research has limited the time he can spend on it.

"I'll have a preliminary report soon," he said, "but how soon I can't say."

Kirk is a biochemist who specializes in a science called "criminalistics." He devotes himself to collecting facts about common clues often found at the scene of the crime, sometimes involving studies of ink, metals, blood or poison.

No Details Given He would not disclose what particular "clues" in the Sheppard case he was working on. Sheppard was acquitted last December of a second degree murder in the fourth of July slaying of his pregnant wife Marilyn at their suburban home. Sheppard has maintained his innocence, claiming the crime was committed by a burly stranger who invaded their house.

The murder weapon was never produced at Sheppard's trial, although considerable testimony revolved around the nature of blood stains found on a pillow in the bed where Mrs. Sheppard was bludgeoned to death. The state suggested they were made being imprinted by a surgical instrument.

Faster Economic Growth Seen Under Right-to-Work Rulings

PORTLAND, March 3—The 17 "right-to-work" states in the nation have shown greater economic growth in recent years than the nation as a whole, according to a study by the Northwest office of the National Association of Manufacturers.

The state right-to-work laws allowed under the Taft-Hartley act permit a worker to decide for himself whether to join a union and do not allow him to be forced to join one if he doesn't desire it.

Critics against right-to-work laws is primarily based on the contention that workers in those states having the law are underpaid and oppressed," the NAM said. "However, government statisticians tell a different story," the NAM said. "These 17 states are growing economically at a faster rate than the average for the country. This is true in four prime economic factors: Non-agricultural employment, number of business establishments, income from wages and salaries, and number of man-days idle due to work stoppages."

The NAM has compared these four economic factors in 11 of the right-to-work states with the national averages. "These 11 states, because of nine of them enacted the law in 1947 and one each passed the measure in 1948 and 1949.

"Thus," said the NAM, "a comparison between 1947 and 1953 can be made on 85 per cent of the right-to-work states. The NAM found that between 1947 and 1953 in these 11 states, non-agricultural employment rose 21 per cent compared to 14 per cent for the nation. Number of business establishments in these states increased 24 per cent, while the national average increase was 15 per cent.

In the same six years, wages and salaries climbed 69 per cent in the 11 states, the national average was 59 per cent. There were 33 per cent fewer man-days idle in the 11 states and only an improvement of 18 per cent in the nation.

"This greater economic progress looks like in the 11 states in the six years although their population increase was just the same as that of the whole country—12 per cent."

The NAM, which endorses right-to-work legislation, contends that "it is a basic right of the individual to work without being forced to join any organization. This right of choice applies to joining a union just as it does to joining a certain club, association or church," the NAM said.

Yugoslav Plan On Industries Is Succeeding

BELOGRADE, March 3 (AP)—Yugoslavia's painful investment in military factories has begun to pay off, not only in equipment for the regular armed forces but in foreign orders and civilian production.

The factories got several American "orders" for the national defense for artillery shells and other ammunition and equipment last year, and now are looking for more. As much as one-quarter of the national income was put into defense production.

Money Used For several years a big chunk of the defense funds has gone into the new factories, which also claimed most of the country's top engineers and construction experts. Housing priority, too, went to factory workers.

Whole new towns were built around several of the plants. Their location usually is considered "secret" although generally known to the public.

Just now many factories there are "secret" but the national defense secretary mentioned 37 two years ago and 59 last year when presenting his budget to parliament. But he neglected to give a figure this year, saying only that as of today nearly all the factories planned in 1948 are completed and in operation.

Wide Range Covered

The military plants cover a wide range of production. They turn out some goods also valuable on the civilian market, such as cloth, canvas and clothing.

The airplane motor factory at Krusevac, for example, has just taken on the job of assembling motors for the first home-produced passenger cars in Yugoslavia. Currently the motors consist of mostly imported parts, but it is planned to manufacture the entire motor within a year or two.

Military experts say Yugoslavia now is capable of supplying itself almost completely with all the lighter types of weapons, and U. S. military aid has therefore been concentrated on heavy arms, jet planes and specialized equipment.

Two Young Boys Die in Home Fire

PAYETTE, March 3 (AP)—A 4-year-old boy and his infant brother burned to death last night in a fire at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Ted Dawbe.

Coroner Clifford Shaffer identified the victims as Donald and Edgar Dawbe, children of the Dawbes. Donald was 11 months old.

Shaffer said that the cause of the fire was down but that an investigation was planned.
