Republican Leaders Foresee Defeats for Income Tax Slashes

WASHINGTON, March 15 (AP)—The senate today rejected the Democratic compromise plan to reduce income taxes next year for low bracket taxpayers. The vote was 50 to 44 against the tax cut.

WASHINGTON, March 15 (AP)—Republican congressional leaders told President Eisenhower today they are confident a Democratic-sponsored proposal to cut income taxes will be defeated in the senate and eventually in the house.

At a White House news conference after a conference with the President, Senator Joseph P. McCarthy, R. Calif., said he would support the proposal. The conference was held shortly before the senate convened to start voting on the tax measure.

Representative Martin R. Nixon, D. Tex., said he believes "we've got the vote" to reverse an earlier house ballot to reduce everybody's taxes by 20, starting Jan. 1.

The compromise proposal in the senate would give a \$20 cut to families with incomes under \$5,000 a year, plus \$10 cut for each dependent other than a spouse.

The house added the income tax reduction provisions to an administration bill to continue corporate and estate taxes at their present level beyond April 1, when they are now scheduled to decline.

Dirt, Hoppers Threaten Big Areas of U. S.

WASHINGTON, March 15 (AP)—Dirt bowls and grasshoppers are a growing menace to farms and ranchlands in the drought-stricken Southwest, congress learned today. In testimony made public by a house appropriations subcommittee last night, agriculture officials asked for emergency funds \$730,000 to fight general dust bowl conditions into a seventh state, Wyoming.

Frost Expected

"They warned that "severe wind blow and frost are expected" in the southwest.

"The subcommittee was told there has been a "severe build-up" of grasshoppers on six million acres of rangeland in 15 western states. Agriculture officials said about 2,000,000 acres will require treatment to avert serious damage or extensive migration."

Areas Named

"They said the infested area includes 750,000 acres in Texas, 900,000 in Colorado, 565,000 in New Mexico,

500,000 in the Oklahoma panhandle and 93,000 in southwestern Kansas. Last year the dust bowl program under which farmers get subsidies for conservation measures, cost \$7,855,000 and was limited to an area which embraced sections of Colorado, Kansas, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas and Nebraska.

No matter what he may think of her in private, the great man must publicly proclaim that everything he achieved he owes to his dear sparring partner at home. No famous figure I know of has ever had the courage to admit, "I got so far in life despite the hand dealt by Mr. and Mrs. X." The dumbest wives who ever gnawed at a man's paycheck.
He wouldn't dare. On the other hand, successful women in America don't match the gallantry of successful men. Rare indeed is the career girl who admits, "I probably got a Bowery deadbeat. If I hadn't been lucky enough to marry the right guy."

Deadly Falcon Given Place in U.S. Weapons

WASHINGTON, March 15 (AP)—The air force unveiled a super-guided missile today that can "think" for itself and soon will be available to destroy enemy bombers at great distances from American targets.

The slender, six-foot, blunt-nosed rocket will be carried beneath the wing of such high-speed interceptor planes as the new F-102 and possibly the present F-96. Both are long-range, all-weather jet fighters.

The Falcon, under development by Hughes Aircraft Company since 1947, soon will become a part of the regular armament of some interceptor units, the air force said.

Movies Are Shown
Movies shown reporters revealed how the guided rocket, pointed on its way by the launching airplane, pursues its target despite effort by the bomber to evade it.

Announcement of the new missile and details on its electronic "brain" were expected to coincide with a speech in Dayton, Ohio, by Assistant Air Secretary Trevor Gardner.

What the American people will perhaps take greatest comfort in knowing is that the launching aircraft is designed for use in air-off interceptors at bases in far-off Arctic regions and other locations many miles from our centers of population.

The air force did not explain how the missile guides itself after leaving the parent plane. It said simply that the Falcon "seeks out its target and can hold its course despite evasive maneuvers of an enemy bomber."

The missile apparently embodies a complicated electronic homing system which enables it to lock on its target and can sense changes in direction in order to correct its own course.

Large Storm System Batters Savagely Vast Area of Nation

By United Press
A vast storm which battered the dusty plains states with a tornado, hail, and falling rain stretched across the nation's mid-section today.

In the southland, meanwhile, forestry experts feared a cold front moving from the north would dampen raging fires which have burned out about 75,000 acres of timberland in Alabama, Georgia, and Florida.

The storm system bolted out of the southwest late yesterday, and the tornado crunched through northwest Missouri for three miles. The twister hit 49 miles east of St. Louis, where it killed one person.

At Atchison, Kans., meanwhile, 100 inches of rain laced with hail stones fell in just 20 minutes. Hail stones as big as 25 cent pieces pounded Cleveland, Okla., and high winds, rain and hail were reported throughout the state's northern portion.

Further west, in eastern Colorado, the storm took the form of 60 to 80 mile-per-hour winds which knocked up dust clouds reminiscent of the disastrous dust storms which raked the "dust bowl" area last week.

Early today, the storm system spread from the western great lakes to the southeastern great plains. In Dixie, light rain and drizzle sprinkled parts of Virginia and North Carolina and fog spread over parts of northwest South Carolina, Central Georgia, southeast Alabama, and northwest Florida.

A threat of a different sort was causing jitter in the northwest Colorado town of Rangely. Five miles above the community a fast thaw had piled up thick ice jams in the White river. Water poured over farmlands and residents feared that a sudden break in the jam would throw masses of ice against a bridge just west of town, probably backing up waters in flood proportions at Rangely.

Dredge Law Clarification Is Docketed

BOISE, March 15 (AP)—Idaho dredge operators asked yesterday that terms of the new dredge control law be spelled out more definitely by regulations, and were promised answers next month.

Land Commissioner Arthur Wilson said the hearing was held to get the operators' questions about the new law and that another would be held sometime after April 1.

No Penalties Issued
The act was passed by an overwhelming vote as an initiated measure at the last election, and proclaimed law by former Gov. Len Jordan shortly thereafter. However, it has not been enforced and no permits for operating under it have been issued.

The law provides that land must be regraded to "reasonably" the same lines which existed before dredging, and that water must be clarified "reasonably."

Sweden Ousts 4 Red Envoys In Spy Sweep

STOCKHOLM, Sweden, March 15 (AP)—Sweden accused four members of the Czechoslovak and Romanian legations yesterday of espionage and banished them from this traditionally neutral nation.

A reliable source said "everybody concerned" at the legation with Sweden's spy probe, in which 11 suspects have been jailed, was told to get out of Sweden immediately. One or two named were already out. Police declared they had uncovered spy rings linked directly with Prague and Bucharest.

The procedure to get rid of the legation members was to declare them persona non grata diplomatically unacceptable.

"We kicked them out," the informant said. A foreign ministry communiqué identified the four as: Maj. Frantisek Nencic, Czech military attaché.

Capl. Zdenek Jansa, Czech assistant military attaché. A Czech legation chauffeur named Paul Balducaanu, secretary of the Romanian legation.

The government also blasted both Soviet satellite governments with strong protests for spying in Sweden. The jailed suspects, in addition to five Swedes, include three Czechs, a Romanian, a German, and an unidentified foreigner. This is Sweden's third spy roundup in four years.

Top Solon Refuses Copies of Yalta Talk Under Secret Ban

WASHINGTON, March 15 (AP)—Senator George D. Oa, yesterday refused to accept a state department record of the Yalta Three conference on a confidential basis.

The senate foreign relations committee, which George heads, was scheduled to get three copies of the record but George said in his rejection: "The information in these papers would leak out and I don't want to accept them and find myself in the position of having to make them public."

"If one-half of the things that have been rumored about them is true, it would be a disaster for the world, especially on the European agreements which are in the process of being ratified."

George said he doesn't know what is in the record and doesn't know "unless the public can know."

As had been forecast, Secretary of State Dulles yesterday ordered the record of the Yalta conference shown only to key members of congress. He ruled out making them public at this time.

Farm Bureau Meeting Held At Twin Falls

Members of the Idaho Farm Bureau heard four speakers as the first inter-county meetings opened at the Idaho Power company auditorium Monday night.

State Federation directors Carlisle Butler, Allen Johnson, Gooding, and Melvin Oppinger, Buhl, addressed the group. Mrs. James Bronson, Burley, Farm Bureau district women's chairman, also spoke.

The Monday meeting was attended by bureau members from Jerome and Twin Falls.

In his talk Butler said that the 80 per cent of party support is not in accord with Farm Bureau policy. The Farm Bureau, he said, generally favors the flexible price support proposed by Agriculture Secretary Benson.

Butler also emphasized the Bureau's opposition to the two-cent federal gasoline tax which farmers must pay even for off-highway use. Johnson described how a Farm Bureau policy is formulated. He recommended working through the Bureau's National Affairs committee and, when a policy is formulated, writing letters to congressmen in Washington.

Mrs. Bronson outlined the responsibilities that Farm Bureau women can share with their husbands, such as making phone calls and writing letters to obtain support of Farm Bureau policies.

The second meeting will be held at the Sororas rooms, Gooding, at 8 p. m. Wednesday, and the final meeting will be at the Burley County Farm Bureau office, Burley, at 8 p. m. Thursday.

Builder Says Skyline Color Is on Its Way

NEW YORK, March 15 (AP)—You've never seen a polka dot building? You hope you'll never see one?

Well, Jesse Salton can tell you this right now—some day you may be in one.

Salton is president of the Beaportor Metal, Inc., and he reports that the trend of architectural design is toward color and color combinations.

"We've already been asked if we could do a building in polka dots," he said. "We answered yes and also offered a variety of plaids, herringbones, or stripes."

Salton said brightly colored buildings should not be surprising in this day of two-tone refrigerators and three-tone automobiles. Demand for color in construction, he said, is coming from schools, hospitals, chain stores, and even the United States navy.

Navy Uses Color

His company is a leading manufacturer of architectural porcelain enamel. The navy is using it on aluminum in the interior of the Saratoga, newest of the super-carriers. It chose white, gray, green and yellow.

Getting back to buildings, Salton has received an order from a school at Miles, Ill., for porcelain in steel in yellow, orchid, green, gray and lavender.

"A school at Ketchikan, Alaska, asked for yellow and light coral trim, deep blue fin-like entrances and red insulated panels that will griddle the structure," he said.

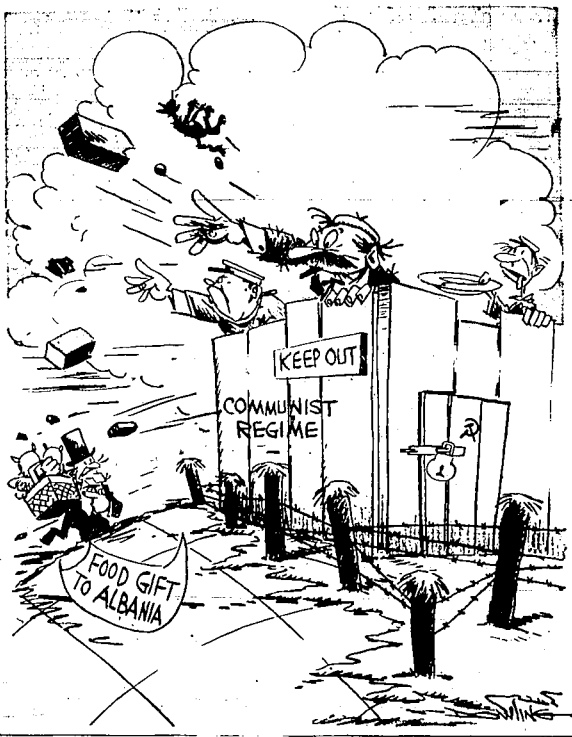
Salt Lake Has Order

Salton said a hospital at Pottstown, Pa., will have orange porcelain panels as will the new office buildings of Philadelphia Electric company. The new First Security bank building at Salt Lake City, a 12-story structure, will be 75,000 square feet of porcelain enamel in rust-off-white and dark gray.

Two initial projects gave impetus to the demand for color in buildings. They are the 16-story Hotel Statler in Hartford, Conn., clad in blue-green panels, and a nine-story blue-gray Standard Federal Savings and Loan association building in Los Angeles.

"I'm not advocating skylines that resemble horseplayers' jackets," Salton said. "But I think a little color would do a lot of good. There are too many structures towering over drab, narrow city streets."

Burma Fights Odd Struggle With China Nationalists Men

By United Press

Burma was fighting one of the strangest wars in history today—a long drawn out struggle to expel the thousands of remnants of Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek's nationalist troops who were driven out of China by the communists.

Rangoon dispatches said the Burmese army captured several near the border of Thailand in a battle that has raged for two days.

An estimated 4,500 nationalists remain in the mountains, heavily wooded area and Burma has been fighting them for more than a year in an unsuccessful effort to round them up for execution in Formosa or to drive them into neighboring Thailand.

Several thousand of the troops have been flown to Formosa, including 600 with their families last year. But the remainder have chosen to stay in Burma and the Formosa government, officially washed its hands of them last October.

The Burmese army said about two-thirds of the Chinese were armed but that they could not stand against Burmese air and artillery. One group of 300 was reported being driven toward the Thai border where Thai police and soldiers hoped to cut them off.

Fighting between the nationalists and Burmese started soon after the Chinese arrived. Premier U Nu appealed to Chiang to get his men out of Burma. An airlift was started by the Thai border.

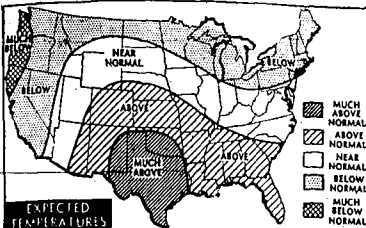

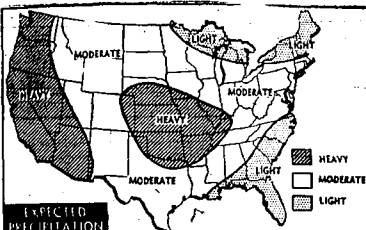

Hotel Fire Kills Six Men and Seriously Injures Five More

LARAMIE, Wyo., March 15 (AP)—Fire swept a 55-year-old hotel here today killing at least six persons and seriously injuring five others, including one so critically that doctors feared he might die.

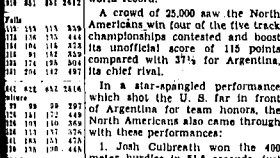

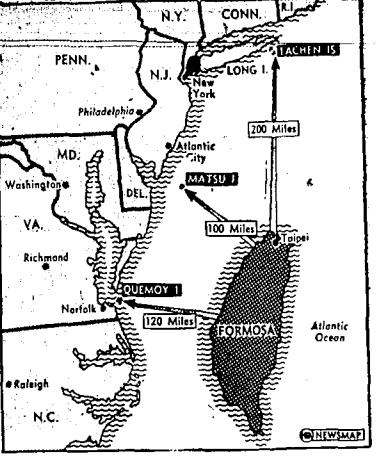

Black Market in Babies Gets Eyed by Government Agency

WASHINGTON, March 15.—The children's bureau is trying to find out how many babies are being adopted through black marketing.

Her survey is aimed at finding out how many 20,000 adoptions a year are arranged outside of established public, private, or church social agencies.

All told, around 90,000 children of all ages are adopted each year, about half of them by relatives and step-parents.

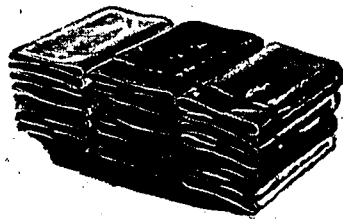

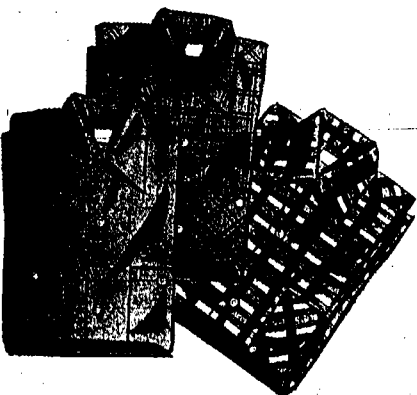
