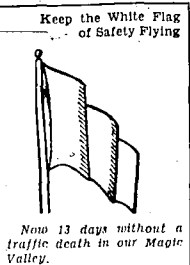

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., March 21.—Russia finally has found backers for two million dollars in aid she has offered for the last two years through the U. N. technical assistance program.
Six countries were reported today to have accepted Soviet help this year in improving their economies. They will be sent Russian technical personnel or equipment, or will send their own experts to Russia for training.

The 7.5 per cent increase measure had gone to the house floor under an amendment which barred all amendments but required a two-thirds vote of approval for passage.
House members who want a vote on an amendment boosting the pay raise to as high as 10 per cent urged colleagues to disapprove it.

He declined any general appraisal of market conditions on the grounds that "I am not a stock market analyst. I am in the business of making and selling steel."

Noted Hagerman Valley Hatchery Also Has Birds; Public Urged to See Geese

In connection with the 18th annual observance of National Wildlife Week which began Sunday, H. E. Cherry, superintendent of the Hagerman Wildlife refuge, invites Eagle Valley residents to visit the facility and see for themselves what the state fish and game department is doing to maintain Idaho's reputation as one of the nation's leading fish and game states.

But other and less-publicized aspects of the refuge also rate attention. Cherry, who was with the fish and wildlife service for 17 years before joining the state fish and game department five years ago, says 10 Canadian geese currently are making the refuge their "home base."

"The story of the geese, which began in 1951," Cherry says, "when we imported 10 of the birds from the city park at Idaho Falls for the purpose of attempting to establish a nesting colony here. The birds were hatched and thus brought to life."

Fate of Region May Hinge on Refugee Votes

AIGON, Indochina, March 21 (AP)—The victory or defeat of the free world in this corner of southeast Asia may hinge on a ragged, frightened army of refugees whose only weapon is a ballot.

About 800,000 anti-communist refugees have streamed southward from communist-held North Vietnam in the past six months. Hundreds of thousands more live restlessly under red rule hoping to get to freedom.

"How many of them make it will directly affect the vote when elections are held in 1956 to determine the political fate of Vietnam."

The communists have resorted to brutal, desperate tactics to stem the flow of refugees through a hole in the bamboo curtain held open by terms of the Geneva agreement. Any person in North Vietnam has the right, on paper at least, to go south.

Had Bad Start

But "operation evacuation" got off to a bad start. When red troops marched into Hanoi last October only 100,000 refugees had been moved south. Many of them found conditions so deplorable they willingly returned to communist territory.

The South Vietnam government of Premier Ngo Dinh Diem acted swiftly to make arrangements for resettlement in the south more alluring. While 800,000 refugees have been received up to now, another 200,000 are awaiting transfer from Hsiangping in red territory. This will raise to one million the number of transplanted refugees, a significant portion of the 12 million population of North Vietnam.

The methods communist leaders use to frustrate the migration vary according to regional conditions and the ingenuity of local officials.

Imprisonment Used

Imprisonment on trumped-up charges often puts a fast end to a man's plan to move south. Red propagandists pound heavily on the idea the Vietnamese should not desert the land occupied for generations by their ancestors.

Posters describing misery and starvation in the south are plastered in every village, purportedly signed by disappointed refugees who have returned.

Trains Leave

Nevertheless, a train leaves the red capital of Hanoi each day carrying hundreds of hopeful migrants. They arrive six hours later at a checkpoint northwest of Hsiangping. Those with proper visas are then taken to camp "Villa Pagode," the first free world outpost to shelter them.

Many of them wait days before they are passed into South Vietnam hands. They go without food, sleeping on the ground.

"Villa Pagode" is merely some tents on a bit of land surrounded by water but to many of the refugees, it is paradise.

Philosophy Is Introduced in Stock Probes

WASHINGTON, March 21 (AP)—Sen. Homer E. Capehart said he will urge "with all his might" today that a witness who criticized the stock market be called to testify again—this time on his political philosophy.

The Indiana Republican charged that the witness, John K. Galbraith, professor of economics at Harvard University, had written favorably of communism. He also said "I believe Galbraith has certain philosophies toward the free enterprise system which disqualify him to be a witness on the stock market."

Galbraith, who had testified as a witness in the senate banking committee's "friendly" investigation of the stock market, accused Capehart of quoting him out of context when he read from a 1949 pamphlet of the National Planning association. The pamphlet, Galbraith added, had the "general" support of Dr. Milton Eisenhower, brother of the president, and of Allen W. Dulles, brother of the secretary of state and head of the central intelligence agency.

Capehart said he will ask that Galbraith be recalled when the committee meets in open session.

Delay Granted

TOKYO, March 21 (AP)—A U. S. army court-martial today granted a delay of at least a week in the murder trial of army employee Gerald R. Hammer, Sparks, Nev., at the request of the defense.

The 26-year-old civilian confessed to the Jan. 8 slaying of his Japanese wife and a barmaid friend, the army said. The military court is trying him only for his wife's murder.

SEAFORD, England, March 21 (AP)—Tenagers circulated a novel chain letter today and the promised rewards were sweet.
