Three Teen-Agers Are Saved From Hole Under Road

NEW YORK, March 22 (AP)—Two and one-half days of terror ended for three teen-agers today when police darning on ropes 150 feet above the ground rescued them from a cave under one of New York's heaviest-traveled streets.

The two girls and one boy "exploded" the cave Saturday afternoon. They were trapped until 2:30 a.m. today without food or water in their dank prison.

They had spent more than 50 hours paying, selling themselves, blouse to rats scurried on the heavy Hudson parkway and trying to dig their way out with their fingernails.

"They owed their lives to the persistence of a detective who located the cave on a slim clue from one of the children's playmates.

While the teen-agers explored one of the caves with a flashlight, dust and rock shifted, blocking all but a small opening too small to crawl through.

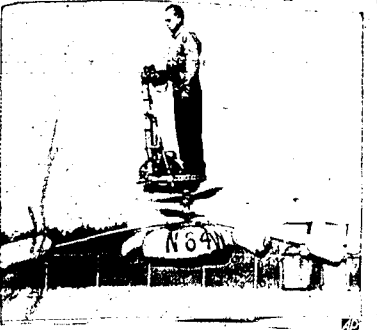

American Negro Leader Dies; Had Led Long Fight for Race
 WASHINGTON, March 22 (AP)—In this country a few Negro intellectuals have looked to communists for help in the fight for Negroes.
 Like Socrates, he had been a demagogue on the conscience of the nation. Hearty attacks slowed him in recent years. He was a man of energy was endless. He was a man of a lifetime crusade: The advance of his race.
 He dressed well, he was witty, quick, emotional and this writer thought, so optimistic that he sometimes blinded himself to realities. But he lived to see much of his optimism justified.
 As executive secretary of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, he became one of the most effective forces in American history for the progress of Negroes.
 If ever a man died in the hour of triumph, it was White. He died last night at 81 of a heart attack, 10 months after the supreme court decision outlawed segregation in the nation's public schools, north and south.
 While, as a Negro boy in Atlanta, was horrified by race riots he saw, of the filibuster newsmen in the

McKay Pays Businessmen Big Tributes

SAN FRANCISCO, March 22 (AP)—Secretary of the Interior Douglas McKay last night paid tribute to businessmen and industrial leaders for their "brave" duties to the nation and repudiated the philosophy of government monopoly in a talk before the Western council, Chamber of Commerce.

In the present era of speedy technological advances, American business leadership is "demonstrating daily its capacity for making the wisest and fullest use of our tremendous resources," the secretary declared.

McKay, without mentioning directly critics of the Republican administration who have described the removal of private water and power contracts as a "give-away" policy, stated pointedly that a billion acres of public domain "were given away" during the first 150 years of the nation's growth.

Tells of Plans
"The most successful of the 'give away' programs was developed during the presidency of Abraham Lincoln," he explained, "by the passage of the homestead act of 1862. The west was settled under this law."

McKay said most of the land, minerals, oil, gas and timber of the nation is now "in the hands of forward-looking private citizens," because of the founding fathers' belief in private ownership and encouragement of it.

Sees Conflict
The conflict now, in continuing lines between the philosophy which supports ownership and development of natural resources "in the traditional American way" and one which "presses constantly for expansion of an all-powerful federal bureaucracy which would take over many natural resources" managed under strict government control.

"The U. S. government still controls about one out of every four acres in the country—and that is too much," said he.

Vacant expanses of public domain "will not be allowed to stand in the way of" expanding cities and towns in the west, he said.

Hang on!

SAN DIEGO, Calif., March 22 (AP)—A kangaroo was loose yesterday. The zoo advised citizens to grab him by the tail.

"Kangaroos sit on their tails when they kick," said Ken Howard, the zoo's keeper. "If you hold it by the tail it will hold it with both hands."

The 14-month-old kangaroo, named Parkey, was on loan by the zoo to a television station. It disappeared from a zoo Sunday night.

French Cure Is Proffered, Not Yet OK'd

PARIS, March 22 (AP)—If France is the "sick man of Europe," as Pierre Mendes-France once described it, what are the chances for a cure?

A doctor has come up with a cure, but France has yet to decide whether to take it.

The doctor is Paul Reynaud, French premier during the dark days of 1940. His cure is a constitutional change that might lead to a more stable government in the country which has had a new premier on the average of every six months since World war II.

Reynaud, brought about by repeated government crises, is the "most painful symptom of France's ills," France has been unable to make up her mind for four years about German rearmament. Healed the French a victory in Indochina.

No Top Figure
Reynaud says that because of hesitation there was no French minister of equal rank to sit down with Secretary of State John Foster Dulles and British Foreign Secretary Sir Anthony Eden at the recent SEATO conference in Bangkok.

And Prime Minister Sir Winston Churchill has warned that if France does not occupy her "seat" in international affairs some other nation will—perhaps Germany.

The medicine which Reynaud proposes to brighten the complexion of France is a constitutional change calling for the dissolution of parliament any time a government is overthrown.

Reason Given
Why would this help? A deputy will think twice about voting down a cabinet if it means losing his own job as well, Reynaud points out.

As it is now, members of parliament who are not ministers in the government, have nothing to lose when they vote out a government. There is always a chance they may become ministers in the next government.

Under Reynaud's reform the deputies would lose their own seats at the same time they overrule the government. The people would settle the dispute at a new election.

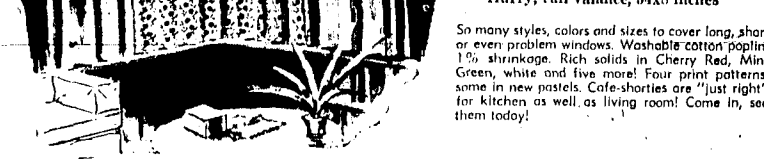

"One year ago tonight, I was bound down by the chains of sin and drink. I had no home, no friends, no hope. Then, while walking the streets, I heard the music of the Salvation Army band..."

Things Start
The audience shouted "yes, sister," and things were off to a fine start. A sort of morality play followed featuring the devil, a businessman, an atheist, a drunkard and a stout-hearted Salvation Army girl.

The devil quickly triumphed over the businessman, atheist and drunkard. But his wiles came to naught when he tangled with the lassie.

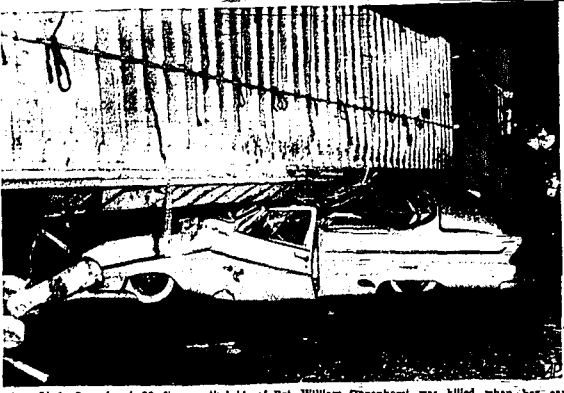
Salvation Army Maj. Ray Gabrielson cautioned the audience that the high-jinks weren't as funny as they seemed.

Hope Is High On Paris OK On Arms Pact

PARIS, March 22 (AP)—High government officials were reported increasing confidence today the senate would ratify the Paris arms agreements without a hitch when it be-shook the senate—and the nation's debate on the treaties tomorrow.

Diplomatic observers said recent international developments had led into the realization that France must act quickly if it is to maintain its position as a world leader.

The first shock was publication of the Yalta documents making it plain the wartime "big three" looked on France as a second-rate nation. The resentment has turned into a resolve to do something about it, these observers said.

The second shock was publication of Prime Minister Winston Churchill's warning that non-ratification means France's chair will be empty in the North Atlantic alliance. General belief was this would impress on the senators even more the pressing need to act quickly.

The government of Premier Edgar Faure, threatened last week by the one-man fact rebellion of Pierre Poincaré and harassed by Moscow, appeared to be gaining strength. Moscow's latest propaganda outbursts were shrugged off as Fascist propaganda when it was almost boot out of a press conference he called last night.

Search Dropped For Down Plane

SALT LAKE CITY, March 22 (AP)—The air force last night dropped its search for a plane missing since March 9. And the civil air patrol announced it too would suspend search operations, at least until the weather improves and mountain snows begin to melt.

Object of the 12-day search has been a twin-engine Beechcraft which dropped out of sight on a flight in Salt Lake City. It was carrying four men and a boy from Chicago to Arcata, Calif., and is believed down in the mountains northeast of here.
